## JAMES CLARK'S MORTIFICATION—1744.

The interest of 6000 merks Scots is applied in "maintaining, educating, and breeding two boys, children of decayed burgesses of Dundee," from the age of seven to the age of seventeen years. The Town Council were appointed perpetual administrators, but Sir John Clerk of Pennicuik, Bart., and his heirs for ever, were vested with the "patronage, choice, and election of the boys."

---

## MISS EUPHAN GRAHAME'S MORTIFICATION—1766.

The interest of 100*l.* Sterling (the capital being now improved to 150*l.*) is applied to the maintenance of a young girl from ten to fourteen years of age. At present there are two on the fund. The Kirk Session Patrons.

---

## MRS MARGARET HUGHES'S MORTIFICATION—1825.

The interest of 100*l.* Sterling is applied to the education and maintenance of one poor girl of the parish of Dundee. The recipient must not be under the age of six, and is entitled to the benefit of the fund until she is twelve years of age complete. The Kirk Session Patrons.

---

## GILBERT GUTHRIE'S MORTIFICATION—1674.

The produce of 2400*l.* Scots, in bonds,—the rents of ten acres of the lands of Westfield, adjoining the Magdalen Green,—the Gray Sisters' Acre, with a little piece of land at the west side of it, both at the Witchknow,—and the rents of two tenements in the Overgate,—were directed to be applied to the education and maintenance of as many boys as the funds would provide for, at the rate of 40*l.* Scots yearly to each, and the same sum as apprentice fee. At present the funds are about 113*l.* 1*s* 8*d* Sterling, which afford about 3*l.* annually to each of thirty boys, with about a like sum to each as apprentice fee, besides defraying the expense of the education of eight boys additional. The Magistrates and Kirk Session Patrons. *Note.*—Mr Guthrie was the first person who held the office of Kirk Treasurer; and his Will expressly prohibits Kirk Treasurers, for ever, from having anything to do with the management of his trust funds.

## DR JOHN BROWN'S MORTIFICATION—1768.

The interest of 3290*l.* 19*s* 2*d* (being the third part of 9872*l.* 17*s* 6*d*) was directed to be applied to the "maintenance and education of such a number of needful young boys and girls, as it will answer, at proper schools, for the space of five years, of the name of Brown, in the first place, and failing them, of any other name, as the Trustees shall think proper,"—each bursar to receive not exceeding 8*l.* Sterling yearly, the capital to be maintained entire,—and each boy, at the expiry of his time, to receive 8*l.* Sterling as apprentice fee. The funds provide for twenty bursars. The Magistrates and Kirk Session Trustees.

---

## CAPTAIN JOHN RAMSAY'S MORTIFICATION—1774.

The interest of 300*l.* Sterling is directed to be applied to the clothing and educating of two boys, sons of seamen or brewers (the Captain was a seaman and his father a brewer), until they attain the age of fourteen, and 3*l.* to be allowed each as apprentice fee. The interest of 200*l.* Sterling also is directed to be applied to the benefit of the poor of brewers, sailors, and lunatics of Dundee; and 400*l.* Sterling to be applied to the erection of a poor's house,—the mortified funds amounting to 900*l.* Sterling. The Magistrates and Kirk Session Patrons.

---

## REVEREND DAVID FERGUSON'S MORTIFICATION—1698.

Mr Ferguson, who was minister of Strathmartine, directed the interest of 6000 merks Scots to be applied to the clothing, boarding, and education of two poor boys, from the age of nine to fourteen years. After this they are to be put to college for four years more, or to trades, as the Patrons shall find them qualified. While at school they are to be lodged and boarded with a person of the name of Ferguson, if one can be found willing to receive them; and their coats are to be "always of a grey colour, lined, with blue sleeves." In the case of those sent to college, they are to be furnished with all necessaries, bed, board, and clothing; and in the case of those who may be put to trades, the Patrons are to give them such apprentice fees as they shall judge requisite. The original Patrons were, the Provost, Sir James Kinloch of that Ilk, Graham of Fintry, Graham of Kincaidrum, and Robert Raitt, one of the Town's ministers. The present Patrons are the Provost and the Grahams of Fintry and Balmuir.

## MRS BAILIE ROGER'S MORTIFICATION, THE WIDOWS' FUND—1665.

Mrs Euphemia Marr, widow of Bailie William Roger, left by her Will to the Kirk Session the sum of 2000 merks Scots, for the use and benefit of poor widows, and thus laid the foundation of the Widows' Fund. At present upwards of thirty poor widows receive 1s 6d weekly. The Kirk Session Patrons.

---

## GEORGE BRUCE'S MORTIFICATION—1733.

The sum of 5500 merks Scots was directed to be applied thus: One third of the interest to be applied in augmentation of his library, bequeathed to the Grammar School, of which he was rector, but the use of it restricted to the Teachers of the School, the Provost, Dean of Guild, and Ministers. Another third part of the interest to be paid to the doctors of the Grammar School (teachers under the Rector), who were appointed to act as librarians, each in turn, during a year,—the remainder to be paid to the Janitor of the school, as an encouragement to appoint one qualified to assist in teaching. In addition, the interest of 4000 merks Scots was appointed for the maintenance and education of a poor boy (the son of a burgess) at the Grammar School, for the space of six years. At the termination of each bursar's time, the bursary is to be kept vacant one year,—the emoluments being directed to be paid to the retiring bursar to enable him to prosecute his studies farther, or to put him to some lawful employment. At present the funds provide for two. The Provost, Dean of Guild, Doctors M'Lachlan and Adie, and the Doctors or teachers of the Grammar School, Patrons.

---

## JAMES CONSTABLE'S MORTIFICATION—1821.

The interest of a sum exceeding 2700*l*. Sterling is divided among as many boys for their maintenance and education as the Patrons can admit at the rate of 8*l*. per annum, paid half-yearly to each. The number, of course, is regulated by the rate of interest. The boys are admitted to the benefit of the fund for four years,—the age being from eight to fourteen years. The Provost, Dean of Guild, and Parish Minister, Patrons.

---

## CHARLES ANDERSON'S MORTIFICATION—1820.

One half of the annual interest of the free balance of his effects was directed to be applied to the relief of the most

indigent of the poor of the parish of Dundee; and the other to be given to the Managers of the Society for the Relief of the Destitute Sick in the town and suburbs. Twelve old men receive 1s 6d weekly. The Kirk Session, Patrons.

---

**JAMES PULLAR'S MORTIFICATION—1804.**

The interest of an accumulated sum of 3000*l.* Sterling is directed to be applied thus: To the Royal Infirmary, 10*l.*; to the Poor of the Nine Trades, 5*l.*; to the Kirk Session, for the Poor, 5*l.*;—to be given at the door of the Old Church by the Deacon of the Baker Trade. After paying these annuities, the half of the remainder of the interest is to be applied to the maintenance and education of ten poor boys of the name of Pullar, to be admitted not under the age of six, and to remain on the fund six years. The other half of the interest to be distributed among ten poor old men and women of the name of Pullar, not under sixty years of age. The Kirk Session, Convener and Deacons of the Nine Trades, Patrons.

---

**PROVOST GEORGE BROWN OF WESTHORNE'S  
MORTIFICATION—1695.**

An annuity of 60*l.*, the value of certain heritable subjects in the Overgate, is divided equally among ten poor children, who are required to be not less than six years of age, born of parents of good character, in communion with the Church, and resident in the parish of Dundee. The Provost, Bailies, Ministers, and Kirk Treasurer, Patrons.

---

**MISS ELISABETH HALLYBURTON'S MORTIFICATION—1826.**

The interest of a capital sum of about 1034*l.* is divided annually among three, four, or five maiden ladies, of respectable character and parentage, who must be natives of or resident in the town, or its immediate vicinity. The Town Council, Patrons.

---

**DR WILLIAM GUILD'S MORTIFICATION—1656.**

The interest of a sum equal to 240*l.* Sterling is applied to the maintenance of — bursars, at the United College, St Andrews. Part of the original endowment, consisting of house property in Aberdeen, is lost. The Town Council, Patrons.

## JOHN LAWSON'S MORTIFICATION—1728.

The interest of 2000 merks Scots is directed to be applied to the maintenance of one bursar, who must be of the name of Lawson or Gray, at the United College, St Andrews. The capital sum is in the funds of the College, but the patronage of the bursary is vested in the Town Council.

## REVEREND JAMES PATON'S MORTIFICATION, ———.

## ———— STEPHEN'S MORTIFICATION, ———.

70*l.* are annually applied to the education and maintenance of seven boys of the name of Stephen. The Provost, the Minister of St Paul's, or the Murraygate District of the Town, and the Lairds of Blackness and Dunnichen, Patrons.

## ALEXANDER WHITE'S MORTIFICATION—1799.

Twenty-two boys and girls (Seamen's children have a preference) have annually, for four years, 5*l.* each for education. The Kirk Session Patrons. Mr White was himself a ship-owner and shipmaster, and in one of his voyages brought home as much marble as would make a funeral monument to him. It is known that he was interred in the Howff, but the particular place is now unknown, as his executors never erected the monument. The sum left by his Will for this mortification was 500*l.*, which was to accumulate to a certain amount before being applied to the purpose of his Will.

---

## MRS GIBSON'S MORTIFICATION—183 .

The interest of 100*l.* Sterling is applied for preaching an annual sermon against cruelty to animals.

---

## MARSHALL'S MORTIFICATION— ———.

The interest of ———*l.* Sterling is divided annually among five old Seamen. The Boxmaster and Committee of the Seamen Fraternity, Patrons.



## MRS MARGARET PETRIE'S MORTIFICATION—1837.

A sum amounting to about 425*l.* is annually divided among aged and infirm persons of both sexes, not under the age of sixty, of good character, and natives of or long resident in the town. Persons of the name of Petrie have a preference, and receive from 4*l.* to 6*l.* per annum in quarterly payments. ## POSTAGE STAMPS.

Stamps may be procured at the General Office, Castle Street, the Stamp Office, and the several Receiving Houses. Labels 1d and 2d each, and Covers 1½d and 2½d each.

When the value of Stamps on the Letter is less than the amount of the Postage to which it is liable, the Letter will be charged double the amount of such difference on delivery.

Stamps may be used for *Printed Votes and Proceedings in Parliament*, and on Foreign, Colonial, and Ship Letters, &c., *outwards*. If any letter, however, addressed to places beyond sea, bear an insufficient number of Stamps, it will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, to be returned, in all practicable cases, to the writer. Stamps are not permitted to be used on Letters arriving in the United Kingdom from the Colonies or Foreign Countries.

These regulations are applicable to Newspapers in those cases where they are liable to Postage.

If the Stamps affixed to letters have been mutilated or defaced, the letters will be liable to the unpaid rate.

A letter with a Stamp affixed which has been cut from an envelope does not entitle it to pass free of charge.

Members of either House of Parliament are entitled to receive, free of charge, petitions addressed to either House of Parliament, provided they are sent in covers open at the sides, *and do not exceed the weight of thirty-two ounces.* Addresses to her Majesty go free of postage.

Printed Votes and proceedings in Parliament are charged at the following rate between places in the United Kingdom, and between the United Kingdom and the Colonies, when conveyed by packet.

Not exceeding 4 ounces, . . . . . 1d.

Exceeding 4 ounces and not exceeding 8 ounces, . . . . . 2d.

Exceeding 8 ounces and not exceeding 12 ounces, . . . . . 3d.

and so on in proportion. Pre-payment optional.

Letters of Soldiers and Sailors remain unaltered, their privilege being restricted to half an ounce in weight.

Letters and packets exceeding sixteen ounces in weight, with the exception of those classes mentioned below, are sent to the Dead Letter Office to be returned to the sender.

## EXCEPTIONS.

Parliamentary Petitions and Addresses to her Majesty.

Parliamentary Proceedings.

Letters and packets addressed to, or received from, places beyond sea.

Letters and packets to and from public departments, and to and from officers who formerly franked by virtue of their office.

Deeds, if transmitted in covers open at the sides. These may, however, be tied with string and sealed to prevent inspection of the contents, though they must be left open at the sides, that it may be seen that they are entitled to the privilege.

RE-DIRECTED LETTERS are charged an additional postage for each re-direction according to the pre-paid scale.



## BOTTLES

Containing liquid, and articles of a brittle nature, should not be forwarded through the Post, as they are almost invariably broken, either by the operation of Stamping or by the friction of the Coaches. It is besides improper so to transmit such articles, as, by accidents to them, the seals of Letters in the bags may be damaged, the Letters mutilated, or their addresses effaced. For similar reasons, articles having SHARP EDGES should not be transmitted through the Post.

## REGISTRATION.

*Letters, whether containing Coin or not, can be registered on payment of a fee of ONE SHILLING in addition to the Rates of Postage, Inland, Colonial, or Foreign. A printed acknowledgment will be given to any person registering a letter. Registered Letters will be taken until within half an hour of the closing of the Box for the particular Mail by which they are to be despatched. Letters for Registration, bearing a sufficient number of Stamps, will be considered Paid Letters, but the fee of one shilling must always be paid in money.*

In the case of Foreign, Colonial, or Ship Letters, it must be clearly understood, that Registration can only extend to the Port of shipment. Letters, however, addressed to France, and Letters passing through France, are exceptions to this rule, the French Post Office undertaking to provide for their security till they shall have been delivered, *if addressed to France*, and so long as they remain in the French territory, *if passing through France*.

The arrangements for carrying out the system of Registration have been made with the view of insuring the safe delivery of Registered Letters; on their delivery the parties to whom they may have been addressed will be required to acknowledge in writing their receipt. *Parties transmitting Bank Notes, Bank Post Bills, Drafts, Jewellery, &c., should invariably secure their transmission by Registration; and persons having occasion to send by Post small sums, are recommended to make use of*

## THE MONEY ORDER OFFICE,

General Office, Castle Street, where they will incur *no hazard*. The charge for such Orders is threepence on sums under *two pounds*, and sixpence on sums between *two and five pounds*.

No order will be given for sums beyond this amount.

Letters may be forwarded, unpaid, to Smyrna, the Dardanelles, and Constantinople, by the French packets from Marseilles. All other places must be pre-paid, if directed by the latter route.

### LETTERS TO AND THROUGH FRANCE.

The postages on letters addressed to, and passing through France, are calculated on the following principle.

The *British* rate on all Letters addressed to *France* and *Algeria*, or to countries *through France*, is 5d on a Letter *not exceeding half an ounce* in weight, and the *French* rate on such Letters is 5d on a Letter *under the weight of a quarter of an ounce*, to whatever place in *France* or *Algeria* the Letter may be addressed; excepting, however, all Letters conveyed by *British* Packets in the Mediterranean, which are liable to the *British Mediterranean rates* in addition to the above mentioned *British* rate of 5d from England.

The *French transit* rate on Letters passing *through France* is also reduced to 5d on a Letter *under the weight of a quarter of an ounce*, but the other *Foreign* rates vary according to the limit to which the Letter may be paid.

All letters addressed to *France*, or to countries *through France* (except to certain countries, to which the *British* rate of 5d need only be paid), are liable to both the *British* and *Foreign* rates combined; for instance, a Letter *not exceeding half an ounce* is liable to one *British* rate, while a Letter *under a quarter of an ounce* is liable to one *Foreign* rate, and so on in proportion, as shown in the following scale:

The *British* charge increasing *two Rates of Postage* for every additional ounce, according to the scale of weight for charging *Inland* Letters, and the *Foreign* charge increasing *one Rate of Postage* for every additional quarter of an ounce. It must be observed, however, that this Table is not strictly correct, as the *English* and *French* modes of charging by weight are dissimilar; a Letter *not being* liable to an increased *British*



*Rate*, unless it *exceed* the half ounce or ounce, while an additional *Foreign Rate* is chargeable if it actually *attain* the quarter, half, three quarters of an ounce, or ounce, respectively.

Letters to *France* and *Algeria* must be either unpaid, or have the whole of the Postage to destination, British and Foreign, paid in advance, as it is no longer optional to pay the British rate only.

For further rates, see the General Alphabetical List of Foreign Countries in the previous pages.

Letters for *Baden* and *Bavaria*, paid to Calais, may be sent *unpaid through France*, or *paid to destination*.

Letters for the following places may be forwarded by the *French Mediterranean Packets*, which leave Marseilles on the 1st, 11th, and 21st of each month, either *unpaid or paid to destination*,—viz.

Alexandria; Constantinople; The Dardanelles; Greece; Malta; Papal States, or States of the Church; the Two Sicilies; Smyrna; Tuscany; and to the Ionian Islands, if pre-paid.

Letters intended to go by these Packets should be addressed "by *French Mediterranean Packet*."

Letters for Malta and Alexandria may be also sent by the closed mail on the 2d of each month, either *unpaid or paid to destination*; but on Letters for the Ionian Islands and the East Indies, sent by such closed mail, the *Postage must be pre-paid*.

#### PAID LETTERS.

On Letters tendered to be paid to France, or on Letters addressed to *places in the Mediterranean or beyond*, through France, the *whole Postage, both British and Foreign*, will be demanded. The whole postage must be paid on Letters addressed to *India, China, Ceylon, &c.*, when forwarded through France.

#### REGISTERED LETTERS.

*Registered Letters* to France continue to be sent under the *same regulations* as formerly; and Registered Letters addressed to countries *through France* will be treated in like manner,—that is, a Registration Fee of 1s over and above all rates of Postage, must be paid in advance, the *British rate* being the same as on other Letters similarly addressed but not registered; but *double the Foreign rates* to destination, or to the utmost limit to which the Postage can be paid, to which an ordinary Letter would be liable, will be taken, the whole Postage being paid in advance.

#### NEWSPAPERS.

English Newspapers may be forwarded to France by Packet *free* of Postage, or by Private Ship, for one penny each, and French Newspapers are delivered in England for one halfpenny each.

On Newspapers to and from Spain, *via France*, the rate is one halfpenny each.

On Newspapers to and from Greece, one penny each, if forwarded by the *French Mediterranean Packets*. Free, if addressed *via Trieste*.

On Newspapers forwarded by the *monthly closed mail*, and not *via Falmouth*, to or from the *East Indies, Malta, or any other place in the Mediterranean*, the rate is 3d each.

On newspapers to and from all other countries, either on the Continent of Europe or beyond sea, passing through France, the rate is 2d



each. *Prices Current and Commercial Lists, duly stamped*, enjoy the same privilege as Newspapers.

#### PERIODICAL WORKS AND PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS.

Periodical Works, not strictly Newspapers, which are published as Pamphlets, and Parliamentary Proceedings, may be forwarded to France, *but to France only*, under the following regulations:

They must be sent in Covers open at the sides, printed in the English language, and pre-paid.

The rates of Postage on such Works and Parliamentary Proceedings are,—

Not exceeding two ounces in weight, ~~~~~ 1d.

Above two ounces, and not exceeding three ounces, ~~~ 6d.

Above three ounces, and not exceeding four ounces, ~~~ 8d.

And 2d for every additional ounce up to the weight of 16 ounces, beyond which weight no publication can be forwarded.

The above-mentioned Rates and Regulations apply equally to all Letters passing between England and France, whether forwarded by the regular Mail Packet, or by Private Ship.

## LETTERS TO AND THROUGH BELGIUM.

The Postages on Letters addressed to and passing through Belgium are calculated on the following principle.

The British rate on Letters, addressed to *Belgium*, will be reduced to 8d on a Letter *not exceeding half an ounce* in weight, and the Belgian rate on such Letters will be reduced to 4d on a Letter *under the weight of a quarter of an ounce*. These Letters will be liable to both the British and Belgian rates combined, in the same manner as such combined rates are now charged on Letters addressed to France; for instance, a Letter *not exceeding half an ounce*, will be liable to one British rate, while a Letter *under a quarter of an ounce* will be liable to one Foreign rate, and so on in proportion, as shown in the following scale.

The British charge increasing *two rates of Postage* for every additional ounce, according to the scale of weight for charging inland Letters, and the Foreign charge increasing *one rate of Postage* for every additional quarter of an ounce. It must be observed, however, that this table is not strictly correct, as the two modes of charging by weight are dissimilar, a Letter *not* being liable to an increased *British rate* unless it *exceed* the half ounce, or ounce, while an additional *Foreign rate* is chargeable if the Letter actually *attain* the quarter, half, three quarters of an ounce, or ounce respectively.

Letters addressed to Belgium must be either sent unpaid, or the whole of the Postage, British and Foreign, to destination, must be paid in advance, as it will not be permitted to pay the British rate only, as at present. It is necessary, however, that the Postage on all *registered Letters*, as well as the British registration fee of 1s, *should be paid in advance*.

The *British Postage* on a Letter conveyed *via Belgium*, between the United Kingdom and the states of the Continent, beyond Belgium, either by packet or private ship, will be reduced to the uniform rate of 8d *when not exceeding the half ounce*; 1s 4d *when not exceeding the ounce*, and so on; but this rate must be *paid in advance*, by the sender, or the Letter cannot be forwarded, *unless there be some other route by which it can be transmitted unpaid*.

It must be understood, however, that no Letter, addressed to countries beyond Belgium, will be forwarded from the United Kingdom *via BELGIUM, UNLESS SO ADDRESSED*.

Letters from the United Kingdom, for any British Colony or Foreign country beyond sea, *addressed via Belgium*, will be liable to a British rate of 8d *when not exceeding the half ounce*, and a Belgian rate of 9d *under a quarter of an ounce*, and so on, according to the respective scales of progression shown above. Both these rates, however, *must be paid in advance*.

## NEWSPAPERS, &amp;c.

British Newspapers, duly stamped, may be forwarded by packet or private ship to Belgium, free of Postage ; and Newspapers published in Belgium, and addressed to the United Kingdom, will be liable, on their delivery, to a Postage of one halfpenny each.

British Newspapers sent from the United Kingdom to any British Colony or Foreign Country through Belgium, will be liable to a Postage of 2d each, which must be *paid in advance*.

Printed Prices Current, Commercial Lists, and Courses of Exchange, published in the United Kingdom, and addressed to Belgium, and *vice versa*, will be forwarded to Belgium, and delivered in the United Kingdom, upon payment in this country of One Penny each, under the following conditions,—viz.

They must be printed in the language of the country in which they are published.

They must be sent in covers open at the sides.

They must merely give the names and prices of the goods, without the names of the venders or senders, and they must not contain any writing or manual mark whatsoever, other than the name and address of the person for whom they are intended.

## PERIODICAL WORKS AND PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS.

Periodical Works, not strictly Newspapers, which are published in the United Kingdom as Pamphlets, and Parliamentary Proceedings, will be forwarded to Belgium, at reduced rates of Postage, under the following regulations :

The Postage must be paid in advance.

They must be sent in Covers open at the sides.

They must be printed in the English Language.

The rates of Postage on such Works and Parliamentary Proceedings will be as follows :

Not exceeding 2 ounces in weight, ~~~~~ 1d.

Above 2 “ and not exceeding 3 ounces, ~~~~~ 6d.

Above 3 “ and not exceeding 4 “ ~~~~~ 8d.

And 2d for every additional Ounce, up to the weight of Sixteen Ounces, beyond which weight no Publication can be forwarded.

## SHIP MAILS.

*Ship Letters.*—The single rate to places beyond sea, when conveyed by private ship, is 8d under half an ounce, 1s 4d under an ounce, 2s 8d under 2 ounces, and so on.

Owners, Consignees, or Charterers (resident in the United Kingdom), and the Owners, Consignees, and Shippers of Goods on board vessels inward bound, are entitled to receive their letters free from sea postage, to the extent of six ounces. In case of vessels from *Ceylon, Mauritius, the East Indies, and the Cape of Good Hope*, the privilege extends to twenty ounces in weight. The Owner, Charterer, or Consignee, must be described as such in the address ; and in case of Owners, Shippers, or Consignees of Goods, it must appear, by the ship's manifest, that they have goods on board.

A penalty of ten pounds is incurred by parties *falsely* superscribing a letter as Owner, Shipper, Charterer, or Consignee.

Letters for Foreign Countries, the pre-payment of which is required, when put into the unpaid box, or left at the office with *less* than the full postage, are sent to the Dead Letter Office, and returned to the writer, when his address can be ascertained.

---

## NEWSPAPERS AND SUPPLEMENTS TO NEWSPAPERS.

All Newspapers must be sent in covers, open at the sides, and no words or communication may be printed or written on such papers or covers after the same shall have been published, other than the name and address of the persons to whom they are sent; nor anything enclosed or concealed in either Newspaper or cover. News-venders *only* may *print* their names and addresses thereon. Newspapers may be examined by the Officers of the Post Office; and, if there be any breach of the above regulations, the packet is chargeable with treble the amount of postage which a letter of the same weight would have been liable to. Any person contravening the law, may, at the option of the Postmaster-General, be prosecuted as for a misdemeanour.

“And be it further enacted, that in all cases in which a question shall arise whether a printed Paper is entitled to the privileges of a Newspaper or other publication hereby privileged, so far as respects the transmission thereof by the Post under the Post Office Acts, the question shall be referred to the determination of the Postmaster-General, whose decision, with the concurrence of the Lords of the Treasury, shall be final.”

## NEWSPAPERS FROM THE BRITISH COLONIES

are delivered free of Postage at any place within the British dominions: Those for persons who have removed may be forwarded by Post, free of charge, provided they have not been opened at the place to which they were originally addressed.

## TO THE BRITISH COLONIES AND FOREIGN PARTS.

Newspapers liable to the Stamp Duty may be forwarded to the British Colonies and Possessions by her Majesty's Packet Boats, free of the duty of Postage, provided the same be duly stamped, made up open at the ends, and put into any Post Office *within seven* days after the day of Publication.

Newspapers may also be forwarded to the Colonies by Private Ships for a Postage of One Penny each, and to Foreign Countries for a Postage of Twopence each, to be paid when posted, *under the same regulation as to date, &c.*

## NEWSPAPERS TO THE EAST INDIES

are forwarded by the Packet *via* Marseilles, on payment of Threepence each; free by Southampton.

Newspapers arriving from BRITISH COLONIES or "FOREIGN PARTS," to which they are despatched free, are delivered free of Postage. From abroad, to which they are *not* despatched free, they are charged, on delivery, *Twopence* each; excepting those brought by the closed Mail through France, which are charged *Threepence* each. All Newspapers must be printed in the language of the country from which they are sent.

## PRICES CURRENT,

Posted within seven days after publication, pass at the rate of One Penny each, payment optional.

Any writing, mark, or reference, will subject them to letter postage.

*Printed Prices Current* and *Commercial Lists* from the British Colonies and China, are admitted at One Penny each, by private Ship.

*Do. do.* from any Foreign Country, except China, at Twopence each.

*Do. do.* from British Colonies, *passing through* the United Kingdom, Twopence each, paid at the time of being posted.

*Do. do.* published in the United Kingdom, if *duly stamped* and under the weight of two ounces, will be treated as Newspapers: The sanction of the Postmaster-General having been previously obtained.

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC, AND INSTRUCTIONS TO ALL POSTMASTERS, SUB-POSTMASTERS, AND LETTER-RECEIVERS.

General Post Office, Edinburgh, February 1845.

On and from the 1st March next, an additional rate of Fourpence per half ounce, over and above the present postage, will be chargeable on all letters, and an additional rate of twopence on every Newspaper, forwarded by the Overland Mail, whether *via* Southampton or *via* Marseilles, to or from places to the eastward of Calcutta, and also to and from the Mauritius, the Cape of Good Hope, Bourbon, or Madagascar, when despatched to such places from ports in India, or *vice versa*,—this sum being levied to defray the charge made by the East India Company, for the despatch and receipt of such Letters and Newspapers.

The rates of postage, chargeable from the date above mentioned, on Letters and Newspapers, transmitted between the United Kingdom and India, and despatched from ports in India, to places to the eastward of Calcutta (as well as those forwarded to the Mauritius, the Cape of Good Hope, Bourbon, or Madagascar), and *vice versa*, will therefore be as follows:

Letters and Newspapers, however, addressed to Australia, Bourbon, Cape of Good Hope, Madagascar, Mauritius, New Zealand, and Van Dieman's Land, must be specially directed *via* India, or they will not be despatched by that route.

Letters of Soldiers and Sailors, forwarded in conformity with the Act, will not be liable to this additional rate.

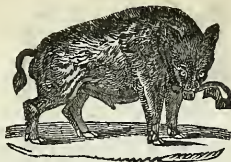

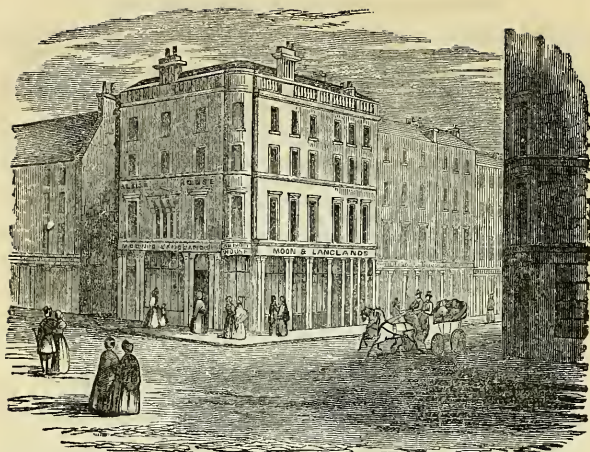

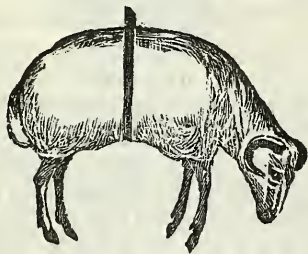
