#### LICENSING COURTS.

By the Act 9 Geo. IV. cap. 58, 16 & 17 Vict. cap. 67, and 25 and 26 Vict. cap. 35, the Magistrates of Burghs are required to meet on the last Tuesday of April and the last Tuesday of October in each year, to consider the applications for License Certificates within the Burgh, and the Justices of Peace on the first Tuesday of May and the last Tuesday in October in the County, with power to adjourn for seven lawful days after each meeting. The applications must be lodged, and a fee of 2/ paid, ten days previous to each meeting; and the Magistrates and Justices are restricted from granting Certificates except at the statutory periods. The following is the Perth district of the County, as appointed by the Quarter Sessions on the 20th September, 1828—viz., Aberdalgie, Abernethy, Arngask, Dunbarney, Dron, Dunning, Forgandenny, Forteviot, Findogask, Kinnoull, Methven, Moneydie, Redgorton, Rhynd, Scone, Tippermuir, Perth.

#### APPEAL COURTS.

Quarter Sessions, for hearing appeals in Licensing cases, held at Perth on the first Friday of May and third Friday of November. Appeals must be lodged within ten days after the judgment appealed against.

#### DEALERS IN GAME.

The Justices meet in the beginning of July for granting Licenses to Dealers in Game under Acts 23 & 24 Vict. cap. 90, and previous relative Acts.

## SOCIETY OF SOLICITORS.

This Society was instituted in 1825, and is now incorporated by Royal Charter, dated 3d September, 1857, into a body politic and corporate, by the name of "The Society of Procurators and Solicitors in the City and County of Perth." The main object of the Society was the establishment of a Law Library, and accordingly there has been formed an extensive collection of books, containing almost every work immediately relating to the profession. There is a standing Committee of Management, appointed annually, consisting of the office-bearers and five members.

The Library of the Society is in the County Buildings, and is open from 11 a.m. till 1 p.m.

An additional fee of 1d will secure a despatch till within 10 minutes of each departure. Both postage and fee must be paid in stamps, and dropped into the late letter-box.

Registered Letters require to be posted 30 minutes before the box closes; but, for a late fee of 4d, can be received up to the closing

of the box.

The Office is open every lawful day from 7 a.m. till 9 p.m., and on Sunday from 9 till 10 a.m. only.

## RATES OF POSTAGE.

### Inland Letters.

The rates of postage to be prepaid are as follows, viz.:— For a letter not exceeding I oz.,.... .... Id exceeding I oz. but not exceeding 2 oz. I 1/2 d 2 OX. ,, 4 OZ. 2d 4 oz. ,, 6 oz. ,, 8 oz. ,, 6 oz. 22 9 9 S oz. 3d 9.9 22 31/2d IO OZ.

A letter exceeding the weight of 12 oz. is liable to a postage of 1d for every ounce, beginning with the first ounce. A letter, for example, weighing between 14 and 15 ounces must be prepaid

fifteenpence.

A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage; and a letter posted insufficiently prepaid is chargeable with double the deficiency. On re-directed letters the charge for re-direction is the same whether prepaid or collected on delivery.

No letter may exceed the dimensions of one foot six inches in

length, nine inches in width, and six inches in depth.

## Colonial and Foreign Letters.

The rates of postage on letters to the colonies and foreign countries are entered in the table of Colonial and Foreign Postage at page 70.

### NEWSPAPERS. Inland.

By the "Post Office Act, 1870," the use of the Inland Revenue impressed stamp denoting the stamp duty, under which newspapers and other periodicals had been previously transmissible by post within the United Kingdom, was abolished, and a postage of one halfpenny was fixed for each transmission of any newspaper coming within the definition laid down in the Act.

Inland newspapers are subject to the following regulations:—

To have the privilege of passing as a newspaper, the publication must first have been accepted as a newspaper by

the Postmaster-General, and have been placed on a Register at the General Post Office.

Registration for inland circulation includes registration for

transmission abroad.

It must be printed and published in the United Kingdom, must be published in numbers at intervals of not more than seven days, and must be printed on a sheet or sheets unstitched.

The full title and date of publication must be printed at the

top of the first page.

For each newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet, the postage, when prepaid, is one halfpenny; but a packet containing two or more registered newspapers is not chargeable with a higher rate of postage than would be chargeable on a book packet of the same weight, viz., one halfpenny for every 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz.

A newspaper posted unpaid, and a packet of newspapers posted either unpaid or insufficiently paid, will be treated as an unpaid or insufficiently paid book packet of the same

weight.

The postage must be prepaid either by an adhesive stamp

or by the use of a stamped wrapper.

No newspaper can be sent through the post a second time for the original postage.

Newspapers going abroad are also subject to the foregoing

regulations.

Publications registered for transmission abroad must be posted within eight days from the date of publication, including the day of publication.

# BOOK POST. Inland.

A book packet may contain not only books, paper, or other substance in ordinary use for writing or printing, whether plain or written or printed upon (to the exclusion of any written letter or communication of the nature of a letter), photographs, when not on glass or in frames containing glass or any like substance, and anything usually appertaining to such articles in the way of binding and mounting, or necessary for their safe transmission by post, but also *circulars*, when these are wholly or in great part printed, engraved, or lithographed.

The postage is one halfpenny for every two ounces or fraction

of that weight.

The postage must be prepaid either by adhesive stamps or by means of a stamped wrapper, or by a combination of the two.

A packet posted wholly unpaid will be charged with double the book postage.

Every book packet must be posted either without a cover or in a cover open at both ends.

No book packet may exceed 5 lbs. in weight, or one foot six inches in length, nine inches in width, and six inches in depth.

### COLONIAL AND FOREIGN.

For information respecting rates of postage and regulations applying to book packets for places abroad, see the Tables, pages 70 and 71.

### COLONIAL AND FOREIGN PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

There is a pattern and sample post to such colonies and foreign countries as are marked in the Table of Colonial and Foreign postage with the letter "p"; but it is restricted to bona fide trade patterns or samples of merchandize.

### Post-Cards.

Post-cards, which bear a halfpenny impressed stamp, are available for transmission between places in the United Kingdom only.

The front (or stamped) side is intended for the address only. There must be nothing else written, printed, or otherwise impressed on it, nor must there be any writing or printing across the stamp. On the reverse side any communication, whether of the nature of a letter or otherwise, may be written or printed; but such communication may not extend to the front side. Nothing whatever may be attached; nor may the card be folded, cut, or otherwise altered. If any of these rules be infringed, the card will be charged 1d on delivery.

### POSTAGE STAMPS.

Every Head Postmaster is required to keep, for sale to the public, a sufficient stock of halfpenny Post-cards, of the various postage labels in use, and of envelopes with the penny stamp embossed. The labels are of the respective values of ½d., Id., I½d., 2d., 3d., 4d., 6d., 9d., Iod., Is., 2s., and 5s. Sub-postmasters are required to keep halfpenny and penny labels, and halfpenny post-cards only. Envelopes are made of four sizes, viz., 5¼ in. × 3¾ in., -5¼ in. × 3 in., 4¾ in. × 2¾ in., and 4 in. × 2½ in.

Head Postmasters are also required to keep newspaper wrappers bearing an impressed halfpenny stamp, of three different

sizes.

Every Rural Messenger is authorised to sell penny postage labels at the same price at which Postmasters are empowered to sell them; and when any person applies to him for postage labels, the messenger must either supply them, or (if he have none in his possession) must, without extra charge, receive the postage in money, and, on his arrival at the Post Office, obtain labels for it, and affix them carefully to the letters.

### REGISTRATION.

By the prepayment of a fee of fourpence, any letter, newspaper, or book packet may be registered to any place in the United Kingdom or the British Colonies.

Every letter to be registered should be presented at the window, and a receipt obtained for it, and should on no account be dropped

into the letter-box.

At all Post Offices the latest time for posting registered letters on the payment of the ordinary fee is entered in the notice exhibited in the office window; but, upon payment of a late fee of fourpence, in addition to the ordinary registration fee, letters, whether inland, foreign, or colonial, may be registered after the hours specified, until the closing of the letter-box for each despatch (exclusive of the time during which late letters are received), or until the office is closed for the night.

No Letter Carrier, Rural Messenger, or other servant of the Post Office, is allowed to carry a letter for any person to be

registered.

### DELIVERY.

Letter Carriers and Rural Messengers are prohibited from distributing any letters, newspapers, &c., whether before beginning their rounds, whilst on their rounds, or after they may have completed them, except such as have passed through a Post Office. The prohibition, however, from receiving payment in addition to the postage does not extend to Christmas gratuities.

No person living within the town free delivery, or within the limits of a rural post free delivery, unless he rent a private box, can claim to have his letters delivered at the office window if a delivery by Letter Carrier or a despatch by Messenger is about to take place; but letters which arrive by a mail, after which there is no immediate delivery by Letter Carrier or Messenger, may be obtained by any person on application at the office window, so long as the office is open for delivery.

Any person can have a private box who is willing to pay the appointed fee. Where this fee goes to the Revenue, it is generally fixed at one guinea per annum, to be paid in advance, and for a period of not less than a year. The same also, in most cases, are the terms for a private bag, except that, in addition, there is the cost of the bag itself, and a charge for conveyance, the maximum of the latter being half a guinea per annum, if the bag be conveyed by a Rural Messenger.

### MONEY ORDERS.

The public are recommended, when applying for Money Orders, to use printed "Application Forms," which save time, and afford greater security than verbal messages against mistakes. These forms are supplied gratuitously at all Money Order Offices.

No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny. No Money Order can be issued unless the applicant furnish, in full, the surname and at least the initial of one Christian name, both of the remitter and the payee, together with the remitter's address.

When application is made for a Money Order payable in London, or at any other town where there is more than one Money Order Office, the remitter should say at which of such offices he wishes it to be paid; otherwise the order can be cashed at the Head Office alone.

An order once issued cannot be cancelled; and should repayment or transfer to a different office be required, the remitter or

payee must apply to the paying Postmaster.

When an order is presented for payment (otherwise than through a bank), the Postmaster has first to see that the signature of the payee be as full as the name given in the advice, and be not in any way inconsistent therewith. He has then to call on the applicant to give the name of the remitter, and if the reply be correct, the order will be paid, unless the Postmaster have good reason for believing that the applicant is neither the rightful claimant, nor deputed by him.

The holder of a Money Order is always at liberty to direct, by crossing it, that the order be paid through a bank; and when the order is thus presented, the question put on the presentation of an

ordinary Money Order is dispensed with.

Money Orders do not require a receipt stamp.

### POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

Every Post Office Savings Bank, which is also a Money Order Office, is open for bank business during the same hours as for

Money Orders.

Deposits of one shilling, or any number of shillings, or of pounds and shillings, may be made by any person at the Post Office Savings Banks, provided that such depositor shall not make deposits amounting to more than £30 in any year ending the 31st December, or make any further deposit when the amount standing in his name exceeds £150, exclusive of interest. When any depositor's principal and interest amount together to £200, all interest will cease so long as the balance of the account continues to amount to the said sum of £200.

On making his first deposit, every person must give his Christian and surname, and state his occupation and residence, and must sign the following declaration, to be witnessed by the Postmaster or by some person known to the Postmaster; and if such declaration, or any part thereof, shall not be true, the depositor making the same will forfeit all right to his deposits:—

Depositor's Book. COPY OF DECLARATION TO BE SIGNED BY Place...... DEPOSITOR ON MAKING FIRST DEPOSIT.

In pursuance of an Act of Parliament, I, of do hereby declare to the Postmaster-General that I am desirous on my own behalf to become a Depositor in the Post Office Savings Bank. I do further hereby declare that I am not, directly or indirectly, entitled to any deposit in, or benefit from, the funds of this or any other Savings Bank in Great Britain or Ireland, nor to any sum or sums standing in the name or names of any other person or persons in the books of said Post Office Savings Bank; and I do hereby also testify my consent that my deposits in the said Post Office Savings Bank shall be managed according to the regulations thereof.

Witness my hand this day of 187
Signed by the said Depositor in the presence of me,

Save and except such benefit as I may be entitled to from being a member of a Friendly Society legally established, or from such sum or sums as may be standing in my name as trustee jointly with the name or names and on behalf of any other depositor or depositors.

Every deposit must be entered in the Depositor's book, and attested by the officer making such entry, and by the dated stamp of the Office. The book must then be given to the Depositor, and kept by him as a primary evidence of the receipt of the deposit. When a book is first given to a Depositor he must, in the presence of the Postmaster, sign his name in it.

Interest calculated yearly at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum will be allowed on every complete pound deposited, reckoned from the first day of the calendar month next following the day on which a complete pound shall have been deposited or completed, up to the first day of the calendar month in which the moneys are withdrawn.

### GOVERNMENT INSURANCES & ANNUITIES.

The Postmaster-General is empowered, under the Act 27 & 28 Vic., cap. 43, to insure the lives of persons of either sex, between the ages of 16 and 60, for not less than £20 or more than £100. He is also empowered under the same Act to grant Immediate or Deferred Annuities of not more than £50 on the lives of persons of either sex, and of the age of 10 years and upwards. The persons whose lives are insured, or to whom Annuities are granted, by the Postmaster-General, have direct Government security for the payment of the money at the proper time.

Tables of the premiums to be charged for the Insurance of Lives; for the grant of Immediate Annuities; for the grant of Deferred Annuities or Deferred Monthly Allowances, without return of purchase money, and for the grant of Deferred Annuities or Deferred Monthly Allowances, with return of purchase money, have been printed, and may be seen at the Post Offices which

have been opened for the receipt of proposals.

The premiums to be charged for the insurance of lives vary with the ages of the persons whose lives are to be insured, and

with the mode in which they are to be paid.

The life of a man or woman in his or her 30th year may be insured for £100 under any one of the following arrangements:

By a single payment of

Smaller sums may be insured by proportionate payments, but no one of the periodical payments must be of less amount than

two shillings.

No one life can be insured for less than £20 in the whole; but when a life has been insured for £20, further insurances may be effected on the same life from time to time, for any amount, until the whole sum for which it is insured amounts to £100.

### MISCELLANEOUS.

The Post Office is not responsible for any injury which books or other articles forwarded by post may sustain; and the public, therefore, should not employ the Post Office for the conveyance of anything likely to suffer injury, unless such things be sufficiently protected. Neither is the Post Office responsible for any loss or inconvenience which may arise from the mis-sending, mis-delivery, loss, &c. of a letter or any other postal packet.

No information can be given respecting letters which pass through a Post Office except to the persons to whom they are addressed, and in no other way is official information of a private character allowed to be made public. A Postmaster may, however, give the address of any person, unless he have reason to believe that the person for whose address he is asked would disapprove of his doing so.

Postmasters are not required to correspond with the public on official matters. All applications, therefore, which require an answer by letter, should be addressed to the Secretary, at the

General Post Office.

Postmasters are not allowed to return any letter or other packet to the writer or sender, or to any one else, or to delay forwarding it to its destination according to the address, even though a

request to such effect be written thereon.

Any person who, on receiving a surcharged letter, has reason to think that the letter has been wrongly taxed, should take it, before it has been opened, to a post office to be weighed, and should have its exact weight certified in writing at the Post Office. This will in most cases be sufficient evidence that the letter has been erroneously charged; though sometimes, owing to the paper being damp when it is posted, a packet weighs more then than when it is delivered, and it is the weight at the time of posting that determines the charge.

If a letter be forwarded under cover to any Postmaster, with a request that he will re-post it at his office, the letter, on being re-posted, will be endorsed with the words, "Posted at———,

under cover, to the Postmaster of----."

Except where the surveyor may deem a longer interval necessary, late letters\*, &c., are received till within five minutes of the despatch of the mails; although no office is kept open merely for this purpose after ten o'clock at night, and no late letters, &c. (except Government letters) are forwarded by the mails preparing for despatch unless prepaid, and that by stamps, so as to include both the ordinary postage and the late letter fee; but in the case of letters directed to any department of Government, it is sufficient to prepay the fee. Prepaid letters may, however, be

<sup>\* &</sup>quot;Late letters" are such as are posted after the ordinary time, and which cannot be sent forward by the mail then in preparation unless extra payment be made.

handed to the sorters in the Travelling Post Offices on any of the lines of railway upon which such offices are run, on payment of an

extra fee in postage stamps of 2d. on each letter.

Every re-directed letter, post-card, or other postal packet, is liable to an additional postage (at the prepaid rate) for each redirection, unless the re-direction be made by an officer of the Post Office, to a place within the same free delivery as the last address. Thus on a paid or unpaid letter, weighing not more than half an ounce, re-directed either by an officer of the Post Office or by any one else to a different postal district in the United Kingdom, or from one place to another in the same postal district, provided these places be not in the same free delivery, an additional postage is levied of one penny; or, if the weight be more than half an ounce, but does not exceed an ounce, of twopence, and so on. Upon a book thus re-directed to any other postal delivery in the United Kingdom; and weighing not more than four ounces, an additional postage of one penny is levied, or, if the book weigh more than four ounces, but not more than eight ounces, an additional postage of twopence, and so on.\*

A registered letter, when re-directed, is only liable to the same additional charge as an ordinary re-directed letter. If, however, instead of being taken back to the Post Office to be dealt with as a registered letter, it is dropped into the letter-box as an ordinary letter (the word "registered" not having been erased, or having been erased in pencil only), it becomes liable to the same treatment as any other letter marked "registered" and found in the letter-box, and is surcharged with a registration fee of eightpence, minus the value of any stamps already affixed for the registration.

Letters which have once been posted addressed to commissioned officers in the army, navy, or ordnance, or to schoolmasters or schoolmistresses in the army, or to non-commissioned officers, private soldiers, or seamen employed on actual service in any of Her Majesty's colonies, or on any foreign station, and who, before receiving the letters, may have started on their return 'home or to another station, may be re-directed to such officers, private soldiers, or seamen, &c., when these have removed upon service, and will be delivered to them without any charge for re-direction. The same privilege extends to the letters of non-commissioned officers, schoolmasters in the army (of all but the first-class), schoolmistresses in the army, private soldiers and seamen, re-directed from one part of the United Kingdom to another, or from the United Kingdom to a place abroad, provided the original postage is prepaid and the letters do not exceed half an ounce in weight; but no such privilege is allowed with regard to letters for a commissioned officer, or for a

<sup>\*</sup> Newspapers from abroad, provided they have not been opened, are not chargeable for re-direction; but if they have been opened they are liable to postage as books.

superintending or first-class schoolmaster in the army re-directed from one part of the United Kingdom to another, or (if posted

in the United Kingdom) re-directed to a place abroad.

A Postmaster is not bound to re-direct letters for a person temporarily leaving his home, and not having a private bag or box, unless the house be left uninhabited, or the letters would be delayed in their transmission by being sent to the house to be re-directed there. In all cases of re-direction a written authority, duly signed by the person to whom the letters are addressed, must be sent to the Postmaster.

Every Postmaster is required to have a notice conspicuously placarded, giving the information respecting the hours of attend-

ance, the despatch and delivery of letters, &c.

At all offices which are open on Sunday the public are allowed, during the time that they are so open (viz., from 9 to 10 in the morning and one other hour), to prepay foreign and colonial letters, to purchase postage stamps, and to have letters registered; and all other duties are performed as usual, except Money Order, Savings Bank, Insurance, and Annuity business, which on that day is wholly suspended.

At no provincial town in England or Ireland is there more than one delivery on the Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday; nor in Scotland on Sunday or the Sacramental Fast Days; and any person is at liberty to prevent even this delivery, so far as relates to himself, as shown by the following regulations:

Any person can have his letters, &c., retained in the Post Office on Sunday by addressing to the Postmaster a written request, duly signed to that effect; and such request will be held to include newspapers and all other postal packets, even such as may be marked "immediate," as no distinction can be allowed.

No letters, &c., the non-delivery of which by the letter-carrier on Sunday has been directed, can be obtained from the

Post Office window on that day.

Private box-holders have the option of applying for letters at the office while it is open for delivery on Sunday, or of abstaining from so doing, as they may think proper; but no person can be permitted to engage a private box for Sunday only.

To prevent the inconvenience and confusion which would arise from frequent changes in these instructions, no request can be entertained unless it extend to a period of at least three months, nor be withdrawn, even after the lapse of

that time, without a week's notice.

No Postmaster is bound to give change, or is authorised to demand change; and when money is paid at a Post Office, whether as change or otherwise, no question as to its right amount, goodness, or weight can be entertained after it has been removed from the counter.

Except as regards foreign and colonial letters about to be prepaid in money, a Postmaster is not bound to weigh any letters or other packets for the public; though he *may* do so if his duty be

not thereby impeded.

When the reason for the non-delivery of a letter, &c., is that the person to whom it is addressed is deceased, the letter is sent, as soon as practicable, to the Returned Letter Office, as are all letters intended for ships which have sailed before the arrival of such letters at the port of departure. When an inland letter is refused, it is retained by the provincial Postmaster for one day only before being sent to the Returned Letter Office, unless the refusal be conditional, in which case the letter is kept for three days, as are all colonial or foreign letters when refused, and letters, whether inland or foreign, addressed to persons not known,

or gone away.

When a letter addressed to a Post Office is not called for, it is retained by the Postmaster one month; except in the case of letters at seaports addressed to persons on board ships expected to arrive at such ports, which letters are kept three months. London district letters and letters from the country addressed to London and its neighbourhood, for persons deceased or gone away, or which have been refused, are sent to the Returned Letter Office on the day after the attempt to deliver them. All town and provincial letters which contain the name and address of the senders are returned to them the same day they reach the Returned Letter Office. Colonial and foreign letters are, with a few exceptions, returned in periods varying from one week to two months.

Every letter which is opened at the Returned Letter Office, and found to contain the address of the sender, is sent back to him; and even when a letter does not contain this address, yet if it encloses money or other articles of value, it is preserved; but in

other cases the letter is destroyed.

By the Act 1st Victoria, cap. 36, sec. 2, any person conveying (otherwise than by the Post) a letter not exempted from the exclusive privilege of the Postmaster-General, incurs a penalty of £5 for every letter, and £100 for every week the practice is continued. The sender also incurs a penalty of £5 for every letter, with full costs of suit.


