

*British Colonies and Possessions.*—Printed Newspapers, duly stamped, addressed to any of Her Majesty's Colonies and Possessions beyond seas, sent by Her Majesty's packets, forwarded free of charge—if to be sent by private ships a postage of one penny each must be paid on putting them into a post-office. Newspapers sent to India, the Cape of Good Hope, New South Wales, &c. are no longer charged by weight, but one penny each. Newspapers printed in the British Colonies and Possessions, brought to the United Kingdom by Her Majesty's packets, are delivered free of charge—if brought by private ships, they are charged one penny each on delivery. Newspapers may be sent from one British Colony to another, *via* the United Kingdom, by Her Majesty's packets free of postage.

*Foreign Parts.*—Printed Newspapers, duly stamped, addressed to the undermentioned countries and places, may be forwarded by Her Majesty's packets free of charge, viz.—France, Hamburgh, Bremen, Denmark, Greece, Corfu and Ionian Islands, Spain *via* Cadiz, Brazil, Buenos Ayres, Columbia, Caraccas, Carthagena, Bogota, Hayti or St. Domingo. If sent by private ships, one penny each must be paid on putting them into a post-office. Newspapers pub-

lished in any of the afore-named countries and places, and brought by Her Majesty's packets, will be delivered free of charge, except those from France, which are liable to one half-penny each on delivery:—If brought by private ships, they are charged one penny each. Printed Newspapers, duly stamped, and sent by Her Majesty's packets, or by private ships, to other Foreign Countries and places, not enumerated in the preceding list, must be charged two-pence each, when put into the post:—Newspapers from such countries, brought into the United Kingdom by Her Majesty's packets, or by private ships, are charged two-pence each upon delivery. Newspapers intended to be sent either to the British Colonies and Possessions, or to Foreign parts, must be put into the post within seven days after the day on which they were published;—and Foreign Newspapers must be printed in the language of the country from which they have been forwarded. On failure of either of these provisions, they are to be charged as letters. If the person to whom a newspaper from the British Colonies, or from Foreign parts is directed shall have removed from the place to which such newspaper shall be addressed, prior to the delivery thereof at the place of its address, it may (provided it has not been opened or used, but not otherwise), be re-directed and forwarded to such person at any other place within the United Kingdom free of any additional charge, but if it shall have been opened or used, the same is, on re-direction, to be charged with the rate of a single letter from the place at which it shall have been re-directed or re-posted, to the place where delivered.

### NEW LICENSING SYSTEM.

The granting of Licenses is now regulated by the act 9 Geo. IV. cap. 58, entitled, "An Act to regulate the granting of Certificates by Justices of the Peace and Magistrates, authorizing persons to keep common inns, alehouses, and victualling houses in Scotland, in which ale, beer, spirits, wine, and other exciseable liquors may be sold by retail under Excise Licenses, and for the better regulation of such houses, and for the preventing of such houses being kept without such Certificates." By this act, the *Magistrates of Burghs* are required to meet on the last Tuesday of April and the last Tuesday of October, in each year, to consider the applications for License Certificates within burgh, and the Justices of Peace on the first Tuesday of May and last Tuesday of October in the county, with power to adjourn for seven lawful days after each meeting. The applications must be lodged, and a fee of 2s. paid, ten days previous to such meeting; and the Magistrates and Justices are restricted from granting Certificates except at these statutory periods. The Justices are also empowered to divide their counties into districts, for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the act.—The following is the Perth District of the county, as appointed by the Quarter-Sessions on 20th September, 1828, viz. Aberdalgie, Abernethy, Arngask, Dunbarney, Dron, Dunning, Forgandenny, Forteviot, Findogask, Kinnoull, Methven, Moneydie, Redgorton, Rhynd, Scone, Tibbermore, Perth.
