THE Royal Burgh of Ayr, the capital of Ayrshire, is situated at the mouth of the River Ayr, the town and county receive their name from the River Ayr, a name which is probably a survival from the old times of the Strathclyde Britons, signifying in Cymric, "the gentle water." Distant about 30 miles S. S.-W. from Glasgow, and by rail 74 miles S.-W. from Edinburgh. The spot has been inhabited from a remote antiquity. It was the site of a Roman Station, and it has been ascertained that a hamlet remained here until the year 1197, when William the Lyon engrafted a new town upon it, which about the year 1202 he constituted a royal burgh.

In ancient times Ayr was distinguished both for trade and military strength; and being an important point of concentration on the west, it was the scene of frequent conflicts, and repeatedly changed hands during the wars of Scottish independence, in the time of the Edwards and the Bruces. Here Edward I. fixed a powerful garrison, and here the patriotic exploits of Sir William Wallace commenced.

When Scotland was over-run by Oliver Cromwell, he fixed upon it as the site of one of the four forts which he built to command the country. This fortification, termed the Citadel, enclosed an area of about ten or twelve acres, including the Church of St John. The Tower (which only remains) is a venerable relict, founded in the twelfth century, and dedicated to St John the Baptist. The church itself was built in the form of a cross. In 1560 it fell into the hands of the reformed clergy, of whom was the Rev. John Welsh, son-in-law of John Knox the Reformer. The Scottish Parliament met here and confirmed the title of Robert Bruce to the throne. When the Protector, in 1652, took possession of it, turning the Church into a storehouse, he indemnifying the inhabitants for the seizure by contributing 1000 merks (Scots) towards the erection of the present Old Church, on the site of a former Franciscan Monastery. The Citadel was purchased in 1853 by Mr John Millar, the present occupier of the Tower.

Wallace Tower.—A Gothic structure 113 feet high, erected on the site of a former one which was taken down about 1830. It was designed by a Mr Hamilton, and cost about £1400. It has always been associated with the name of Sir William Wallace. A statue of the renowned chief, cut by Tom, the famed sculptor of “Tam o’ Shanter and Souter Johnny,” occupies a niche in front. The cost of the statue was 120 guineas, and the money was subscribed in a fortnight, chiefly through the exertions of Mr Auld, Doonbrae (Tom’s chief patron). A figure of less pretensions, cut by Mr Reid of Glasgow, stands in a niche of the Scotch baronial building at the east end of Newmarket Street, placed there in 1810 by Henry Cowan, to replace an old representation of the head of Wallace which had fallen into decay. The effigy was originally erected there to commemorate the sheltering of Wallace from his enemies under this roof.

The Old Bridge was built in the reign of Alexander III. (1249-1284) by Isobel Lowe and her sister, two maiden ladies, who, tradition states, spent their fortune on the undertaking. In 1877 the heavy floods undermined the foundations of the New Brig, referred to by Burns, and the present New Bridge was built on the same site. Victoria Bridge, erected in 1897. Burns Statue unveiled, 1891. Burns Monument built, 1820. The Town’s Buildings, with a spire 226 feet high, erected 1828, cost £14,000, and greatly enlarged in 1881. Town Hall destroyed by fire on 1st July, 1897. The County Buildings, modelled after the Temple of Isis in Rome, completed in 1822, costing upwards of £30,000. The Ayr Academy was founded chiefly on a bequest of £1000 left for educational purposes in the year 1790 by Mr Fergusson of Doonholm. This sum was supplemented by private subscriptions of £6585. The cost of erection was £2837, and the balance of the fund was vested in Government securities. A charter was obtained in 1798, under which the management was committed to seven directors, annually chosen from among the Magistrates and Town Council. Since 1872 the Academy has come under the Education Act, and is now managed by the School Board.

Newton-upon-Ayr is of very ancient erection, owing its privileges to Robert Bruce, who, upon being attacked by leprosy, came to reside in it, and was induced to establish a lazar-house to confer considerable favours on the town. Newton and Wallacetown were comprehended within the Parliamentary Burgh of Ayr in 1832. The Municipal Burgh was in 1873 rendered conterminous with the Parliamentary, and again extended in 1885.

Municipal Constituency in 1901, 4,999, including 1,064 females—1st Ward, 681; 2nd, 672; 3rd, 367; 4th, 430; 5th, 1,908; 6th, 941.

Inhabited houses in 1891, 5,100; in 1901, 5,886, an increase in ten years of 786. Separate Families, 5,912. Rooms with one or more windows, 21,987. Annual value of real property, exclusive of railways, in 1901, £167,536; value of railways, £6,830. Rateable value, £174,576. Corporation Revenue, £6,093.

This Burgh, with Irvine, Campbeltown, Inveraray, and Oban, returns one Member to Parliament. Ayr is the Returning Burgh.

Parliamentary constituency of the Burgh in 1901:—Ayr, 1st Ward, 376; 2nd, 489; 3rd, 293; 4th, 306; 5th, 1,520; 6th, 729—Total, 3,713. Campbeltown, 822; Inveraray, 120; Irvine, 1,588; Oban, 754—Total, 6,997. Member for Ayr Burghs, C. L. Orr Ewing, Esq. Votes polled at General Election in 1900—C. L. Orr Ewing, U., 3,101; Colonel E. Browne, L., 2,511.

AYRSHIRE.

This county, which is about 60 miles in length and 26 in breadth, containing 1,128 square miles, or 722,229 acres, comprises the districts of Carrick, lying on the south of the Doon; Kyle, between the Rivers Doon and Irvine; and Cunningham, north of the River Irvine. These divisions, although abolished by statute in 1748, still continue to be recognised in statistical descriptions of the county. The surface undulates, reaching no great elevation, except in the S. and S.-E., which are somewhat mountainous, while there are few hills on the N. It is famous for its valuable breed of cows, and rich, yet mild cheese, known by the name of Dunlop.

Among the antiquities of Ayrshire are the cairns of Galston and Lorn; Camps, supposed to be Danish, at Dundonald, and on the hill at Knockgeorgan, near Ardrossan; the Castles of Loch Doon, Turnberry, Dundonald, Portincross, etc.; the Abbeys Crossraguel and Kilwinning; and the Kirk of Alloway, immortalised by Burns, who was born in a cottage a quarter of a mile distant, on 25th January, 1759, where upwards of 50,000 admirers annually pay homage to his immortal memory.

The principal rivers are the Ayr, Doon, Girvan, Stinchar, Irvine, and Garnock.

It was inhabited in the time of Agricola (first century), by the Damnonci, with whom were afterwards mixed the Scots from the opposite coast of Kintyre, and during the religious persecutions of the Stuarts it was a stronghold of the Covenanters.

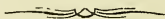

LETTERS.

The rate of postage to be prepaid on Inland Letters is:—For a letter not exceeding 4 oz. 1d, and so on at the rate of $\frac{1}{2}$ d for every additional 2 oz. Unpaid letters are charged double postage on delivery, and deficient postage double the deficiency.

Letters may not exceed in size 24 by 12 by 12 inches, unless to or from Government Offices.

RE-DIRECTION.—No charge is made for re-directing Letters, Post Cards, Books, or Newspapers, whether done by a Post Office official or by an agent of the addressee after delivery, provided the letter or packet is re-posted not later than the day following delivery (Sundays and Bank Holidays excluded), and it does not appear to have been opened; if posted later, unpaid rates will be charged. Parcels, however, are subject, when re-directed, to an additional postage at the prepaid rate for each re-direction.

Letters, when once posted, cannot be given back upon any pretence whatever, but must be forwarded to the person to whom they are addressed.

Letters containing articles of a perishable or dangerous nature, or anything that might prove injurious to the other letters, are not forwarded, but sent to the Returned Letter Office.

REGISTRATION.—Any Letter, Book, Packet, Parcel, etc., can be Registered on payment of the Registration fee in addition to the postage. The fee for Registration, which also secures Compensation in the case of loss or damage, is 2d for £5, 3d for £10, and a 1d additional for every £10 up to £120. Compensation to the extent of £2 only will be given in the case of a letter containing coin, whatever may be the amount of coin in letter. Such letter or packet requires to be handed over the counter and a receipt obtained. If it be desired to obtain Compensation for damages, the letter must bear the words "Fragile—With Care."

NEWSPAPERS.

All Newspapers Registered at the General Post Office, London, printed and published in the United Kingdom at intervals not exceeding seven days, may be sent by post singly or in a packet, within the United Kingdom, for a postage of One Halfpenny for each Newspaper, but a packet containing two or more registered papers is not chargeable with a higher rate than a book packet of the same weight. No Newspapers must bear on any part of it words of the nature of a letter. No packet of Newspapers must exceed 5lb. in weight, 2 feet in length, and one foot in width or depth.

BOOK POST.

The rate of postage is One Halfpenny for every 2 oz., or fraction thereof. All letters or sealed enclosures in a Book Packet are forbidden. A Book Packet may contain any matter

wholly printed on paper, or any other written or printed matter, not being in the nature of a letter, drawings, photographs, engravings on paper, maps, plans, invoices, orders for goods, credit notes, way-bills, bill of lading, receipts, statements of accounts, prices current, and market reports; that the only writing on the documents shall be the dates, prices of goods, and mode of consignment. Manuscript for press, and printed proofs with corrections and instruction, examination papers with corrections. Circulars, that is, printed notices and letters, that the circular may be corrected in writing name and address of sender.

EXPRESS DELIVERY.

Letters and Parcels are sent out for special delivery at the following rates, viz.:—For 1lb., 3d per mile or part thereof, and for every additional lb. or part thereof, $1\frac{1}{2}$; if the sender wishes a cab to be used, the fare in addition must be prepaid.

SINGLE POST LETTERS BY RAILWAY.—An agreement exists between the Post Office and certain Railway Companies for the conveyance of Letters not exceeding 1 oz. at a charge of 2d in addition to the postage of 1d. The postage must be prepaid in stamps and 2d in cash. When the letter reaches the terminal station it will be posted at the nearest Post Office receptacle.

Telegraph Money Order transactions are made between all Offices authorised to transact Telegraph and Money Order business at a charge of for sums not exceeding £3 4d, and above £3 and not exceeding £10 6d, and a minimum cost of 6d for the official telegram.

FOREIGN MONEY ORDERS.—The regulations are the same as for Inland Orders at the following rates of commission, viz.:—For sums not exceeding £2, 6d; £6, 1s; £10, 2s.

POSTAL ORDERS.—Postal Orders are issued at all Money Order Offices for fixed sums, for which a poundage is made, viz.:—

Payment of Postal Orders can also be obtained at Constantinople, Gibraltar, Hong-Kong, India, Malta, Newfoundland, and Straits Settlements.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.—Every Money Order Office, being a Post Office Savings Bank, receives deposits of One Shilling (or 12 Penny Stamps on an official form, or any number of Pounds and Shillings from any depositor, provided the sums deposited do not exceed £50 in any one year, and the total amount standing in the depositor's name does not exceed £200 inclusive of interest—interest at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum.

INVESTMENTS IN GOVERNMENT STOCKS.—Any depositor in a Savings Bank who desires to Invest a certain sum in Government Stocks must send to the Controller of the Savings Bank an application signed by him on a form to be obtained at any Postal Savings Bank. The sum invested shall not be less than a 1s, and shall not exceed £200. The whole amount of Stock credited to any one account shall not exceed £500 Stock.

TELEGRAMS.

The charge for a Telegram throughout the United Kingdom is Sixpence for Twelve Words and under, including the names and addresses of sender and receiver, and, if exceeding Twelve Words, One Halfpenny for every additional word. The amount paid for transmission of a message covers the cost of delivery within three miles from the terminal office, or within the town postal delivery of that office. When the addressee resides beyond the free delivery, portorage is charged at the rate of Threepence per mile or part thereof, reckoning from the terminal telegraph office.

POST OFFICE TELEPHONE.

Communication by Telephone has been established between the most important towns in the United Kingdom.

The scale of charges for three minutes conversation is as follows:—

For distance not exceeding 25 miles, ... 3d.

Exceeding 25 miles and not exceeding 50 miles, ... 6d.

“ 50 “ “ 75 “ ... 9d.

“ 75 “ “ 100 “ ... 1s.

Every additional 40 miles or fraction thereof, ... 6d.

When the conversation originates on the system of the Post Office, and is with a person on the system of the National Telephone Company, or *vice versa*, the following additional charges are made:—

When the Trunk Wire charge for three minutes conversation does not exceed 1s 6d, ... 3d.

Exceeds 1s 6d, but does not exceed 3s, ... 4d.

When it exceeds 3s, ... 6d.

The period of conversation for a single fee is limited to three minutes, but any person may secure the uninterrupted use of a Trunk Line for six minutes by prepaying a double fee. A subscriber of the Post Office or National Telephone Company may continue a conversation demanded for three minutes for a second period of three minutes.

POST CARDS, &c.

Inland Post Cards (thin) are 5½d, and thick 6d for 10 ; Reply Cards at double rate. Foreign Post Cards, 1d ; Reply, 2d each. Halfpenny Newspaper Wrappers at the rate of 7 for 4d, and Penny Wrappers, 8 for 8½d. Letter Cards, 3 for 3½d ; 7 for 8d.

PARCEL POST.

Parcels are conveyed at the rate of not exceeding 1lb. 3d, 2lb. 4d, and so on at the rate of 1d for every additional pound up to 9lb. ; 9lb. to 11lb. 1s.

In dimensions a Parcel must not exceed 3½ feet in length, or 6 feet in length and girth combined.

Parcels may be Registered, and Compensation in the case of damage or loss obtained, as in the case of letters (see under Registration, but no Compensation is given in the case of damage or loss of coin or money contained in a Parcel. Subject to regulations attending the posting of a Parcel, the Post Office will allow Compensation to the extent of £2 for loss or damage on an Unregistered Parcel.

COLONIAL AND FOREIGN RATES OF POSTAGE.

To all destinations outside of the United Kingdom (see note below) the Postage is at the following uniform rates:—For Letters, 2½d every ½ oz. ; Post Cards, 1d each ; Newspapers, Books, and Printed Papers generally, ½d every 2 oz. ; Patterns and Samples, ½d every 2 oz., but with a minimum charge of 1d ; Commercial Papers *i.e.*, documents not of the nature of personal correspondence), ½d every oz., but with a minimum charge of 2½d. The above named rates should in all cases be prepaid.

NOTE.—Postage on Letters from this Country for any of the British Colonies or Possessions, and British Post Offices in China, with the exception of the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, and Rhodesia, is 1d per ½ oz.

FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST.

The sender of a Parcel is required to fill up a Custom House declaration giving an accurate statement of the contents and value, date of posting, and sender's name and address. The nett. weight of the various articles in a parcel should, if possible, be given, and any other particulars which would facilitate the assessment of Customs Duty which is collected on delivery.

In addition to Customs Duty, a charge of 6d is made on all dutiable Parcels entering Cape Colony, Natal, and Transvaal, and 1s 6d for the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Mashonaland, Orange River Colony, and Rhodesia. In most European countries the fee does not exceed 2½d per parcel. The general conditions are much the same as for Inland Parcel Post, except that in several cases the dimensions and limit of

weight are more limited. The dimensions allowed are—:For most Continental countries, 2 feet in any direction ; for Turkey, 2 feet in length and 4 feet length and girth combined ; for Canada, 2 feet in length and length and girth combined ; othe British Colonies, Foreign possessions, and Constantinople and Egypt, 3½ feet in length and 6 feet length and girth combined. The limit in weight is in nearly all cases 11lbs., but Parcels for Paraguay, Persia, and Rhodesia must not exceed 7lbs., and Parcels for Spain, or sent through Spain, must not exceed 6½lbs. Articles in Parcels must be carefully packed. Moreover, such is taken into account in dealing with claims for Compensation, and all Parcels must be sealed.

The same scale and rate of Insurance for Foreign Parcels applies to the following countries :—Austria-Hungary, Belgium, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Cameroons, China, Denmark, Egypt (via Gibraltar), Finland, Germany, Luxemburg, Norway, Russia, Sweden, Switzerland (via Belgium). The Insured Parcels have all the safeguards of the Registration system, and, subject to the Post Office regulations, Compensation will be paid if they are lost or damaged in the post. To secure Compensation up to £12, the fee is 5d ; £24, 7½d ; £36, 10d, &c., &c. For further information see Post Office Guide.
