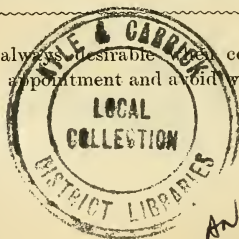

THE OBJECTS OF THE MISSION ARE :

1. To seek out all uneducated Deaf and Dumb persons, and provide for their education ; 2. To provide religious instruction to the Deaf and Dumb after they have left school ; 3. To visit the sick and other Deaf and Dumb persons at their homes ; 4. To assist the Deaf and Dumb in obtaining employment, and to aid, if necessary, apprentices in learning a suitable trade ; 5. To relieve either by gifts or otherwise deserving and necessitous Deaf and Dumb persons.

INLAND PARCEL POST.

Parcels *not exceeding 11 lbs. in weight* are received at any Post Office for transmission between places in the United Kingdom.

In order that a packet may go by Parcel Post it must be tendered for transmission as a parcel, and should bear the words "Parcel Post," which should be clearly written in the left-hand top corner.

Every Post Office is open to the public for Parcel Post business on week days during the same hours as for general postal business. No Parcel Post business is, as a rule, transacted in England or Ireland on Sundays, Christmas Days, and Good Fridays; nor in Scotland on Sundays and all public holidays.

The following are the principal conditions and regulation:—

The size allowed for an Inland Postal Parcel is:—

Greatest Length3 ft. 6 in.

Greatest length and girth combined...6 ft. 0 in.

For example—

A parcel measuring 3 ft. 6 in. in its longest dimension may measure as much as 2 ft. 6 in. in girth, *i.e.*, round its thickest part; or—

A shorter parcel may be thicker; thus, if it measure no more than 3 ft. in length, it may measure as much as 3 ft. in girth, *i.e.*, round its thickest part.

The most convenient mode of measuring is by means of a tape 6 ft. long, having the length of 3 ft. 6 in. marked thereon. So

much of the tape as is not used in measuring the length is the measure of the maximum girth permissible. Such a tape, if provided by stationers, may conveniently be marked in one colour up to 3 ft. 6 in., and the remaining portion in another colour.

The rates of Postage are—for a Parcel—

Not exceeding 1 lb. in weight 3d

Every additional lb. or fraction of a lb. up to 11 lbs., 1½d extra.

Compensation for loss or damage will be given subject to certain regulations, in accordance with the following table:—

Without payment of fee, to amount not exceeding £1

On payment of insurance fee of 1d in addition to postage, to an amount not exceeding £5

On payment of insurance fee of 2d in addition to postage, to an amount not exceeding £10

No parcel is accepted which weighs more than 11 lbs., or is not sufficiently paid. The postage must in all cases be *paid in advance*, and by ordinary postage stamps, which must be affixed by the sender before tendering a parcel for transmission by Parcel Post at a Post Office.

Parcels must not be posted in a letter box, but must be taken into a Post Office and handed over the counter. Care must be taken that every parcel bears a clean address.

A parcel bearing the words “Parcel Post,” or otherwise marked for transmission as a parcel, and posted out of course in a Letter Box, must be forwarded as a Letter or Book Packet if it is fully prepaid at the rate proposed to either, and it is otherwise in accordance with the regulations of the Letter or Book Post.

If it does not comply with the above conditions, but is fully prepaid at the Parcel rate and is otherwise in accordance with the Parcel Post regulations, it will be forwarded by Parcel Post and charged with a fine of 3d, together with the deficient postage, if any, at the Parcel Post rate.

The address of a parcel must be clearly written either on the outer wrapper or on a separate address label securely fastened to the parcel; and the necessary stamp or stamps, to prepay the postage must in all cases be placed (as in the case of letters) close above the address.

Parcels which bear on the outside any writing or drawing of an indecent or offensive nature, or within which any contents of a like nature may be observed, and parcels containing gunpowder, cartridges, lucifer matches, or anything explosive or liable to

sudden combustion, bladders containing liquid, live animals, grossly offensive or filthy matter, and anything in a condition likely to injure other parcels or any officer of the Post Office, are prohibited.

If any such parcel be tendered for posting, it is refused, or, if detected in transit, it is detained. Parcels containing fish, game, meat, eggs, &c., or razors, scissors, needles, knives, forks, or other parcels. Liquids, or semi-liquids, such as jellies, pickles, paint, varnish, &c., are not accepted unless in bottles or cans securely stoppered; nor powders, unless so packed that they cannot escape in transmission. Bottles or glass in any form can be accepted only when so packed as to be secure from breakage. If a parcel be tendered in a damaged or insecure condition, or in a condition likely to injure other parcels or any officer of the Post Office, it is refused. If a parcel in such a condition is observed in transit, it is, if possible, made secure and sent forward; but, if it cannot be so secured, it is detained.

Parcels known to contain a letter, packet, or parcel intended for delivery at an address other than that borne on the parcel itself are prohibited.

3. No Order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

4. No Money Order can be issued, unless the applicant furnish in full the surname and at least the initial of one Christian name, both of the remitter and the payee, together with the remitter's address. In the case of Foreign Orders the full address of the payee must be given ; and if the Order be payable to a native in British India, the Tribe or Caste and the Father's name must also be furnished.

Exceptions.—1st. When the remitter directs at the time of issue (which he is at liberty to do) that the Order, by being crossed like a cheque, be made payable only through a bank, it is left to his own option to give or withhold the name of the payee.

2nd. If the remitter or payee be a Peer or a Bishop, his ordinary title is sufficient.

3rd. The designation of a firm is sufficient, except in the case of a company trading under a title which does not consist of the names of the persons composing it, as the "Carron Company."

Commission on Foreign Orders :—

For sums not exceeding £2, 6d ; £5, 1s ; £7, 1s 6d ; £10, 2s.

A Money Order, when once issued, cannot be cancelled.

TELEGRAPH MONEY ORDERS. (INLAND.)

The Telegraph Money Order System (Inland) is now extended, and Money may be transmitted between all Head and Branch Offices in the United Kingdom at which Telegraph and Money Order business is transacted. Full particulars may be obtained at any Post Office.

POSTAL ORDERS.

1. Postal Orders, for certain fixed sums from 1s up to £1, are now issued to the public at all Post Offices at which Money Order business is transacted.

2. The following are the amounts for which Postal Orders are issued, together with the Poundage payable in respect of each Order :—

Postal Orders can be so combined that any sum consisting of shillings and sixpences up to 20s, may be transmitted by two Orders, and Postage Stamps may be used up to fivepence for broken amounts, *which stamps should be affixed on the face of the Orders.*

3. The person to whom a Postal Order is issued must, before parting with it, fill in the name of the person to whom the amount is to be paid, and may fill in the name of the Money Order Office at which the amount is to be paid. The person so named must, before payment can be made, sign the receipt at the foot of the Order and must also fill in the name of the Money Order Office, if that has not been already done.

4. Every person to whom a Postal Order is issued should keep a record of the number, date and name of office of issue to facilitate inquiry if the Order should be lost.

No Money Order, Postal Orders, or Savings Bank business is transacted on a Sunday.

APPLICATIONS TO RETURN LETTERS. — A letter when it has once been posted, cannot be returned to the writer, but must be forwarded to the person to whom it is addressed.

CHANGE AND BAD MONEY. — No Postmaster is bound to give change, or is authorised to demand change; and when any money is paid at this office whether as change or otherwise, no question as to its right amount, goodness, or weight can be entertained after it has been removed from the counter.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

1. Post Office Savings Banks are established at all Money Order Offices in the United Kingdom and are open for the receipt and payment of money daily during the hours appointed for Money Order business.

2. At these banks deposits of one shilling, or any number of shillings, will be received; but no one may deposit more than £30 in one year ending 31st December, or make a further deposit when

the total amount standing to his credit has reached £150 exclusive of interest.

3. Interest at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum (which is at the rate of sixpence in the pound for each year, or at the rate of one halfpenny on each complete pound for each month reckoning from the first day of the calender month next following the day on which a complete pound has been deposited, up to the last day of the calender month preceding the day on which the money is withdrawn) is allowed until the sum due to a depositor amounts to £200, when interest ceases to be allowed.

INLAND LETTERS RATES OF POSTAGE.

The rates of postage when prepaid are as follows:—

And so on by ½d for every additional 2 oz.

A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage; and a letter posted insufficiently prepaid is chargeable with double the deficiency.

R E - D I R E C T I O N .

1. Every inland re-directed letter, post card, or other postal packet is liable to an additional postage (at the prepaid rate) for each re-direction, unless both the original and the second address be within the delivery of the same Post Office, or Sub-Office, or rural walk, and the redirection be made by an officer of the Post Office. Thus on a paid or unpaid letter not exceeding 1 oz. in weight re-directed either by an officer of the Post Office, or by any one else to a different delivery, an additional postage is levied of one penny; and if the weight be more than 1 oz., but less than 2 oz., of three-halfpence, and so on.

Exception.—No charge for re-direction is made on Government letters.

2. An inland registered letter, when re-directed to any place within the United Kingdom, is only liable to the same additional charge as an ordinary letter.

3. If an inland registered letter, when re-directed, instead of being taken back to the Post Office to be dealt with as a registered letter, is dropped into the letter box as an ordinary letter (the word “registered” not having been erased or having been erased in

pencil only), it becomes liable to the same treatment as any other letter which is marked registered and found in the letter box; and must be subcharged with a registration fee of 8d *minus* the value of any stamps already fixed for the registration.

4. Notices of removal, and applications for letters to be re-directed, must in all cases be duly signed by the persons to whom the letters are addressed, and in provincial towns they must be sent to the local Postmaster. Printed forms of notice can be obtained at any Head or Branch Office, or from the Postman of the walk; and when filled up and signed, they should be given to the Postmaster of the District or to the Postman; but owing to the frequent removals which take place in the Metropolitan district, it is desirable, for the prevention of mistakes, that persons who are about to change their residence should inform their correspondents beforehand of their intention, so that their letters may be directed in the first instance to their new address.

5. A Postmaster is not bound to re-direct for a person temporarily leaving his home, and not having a private bag or box, unless the house be left uninhabited.

ADDRESSES TO THE QUEEN AND PETITIONS TO PARLIAMENT.

Petitions and addresses to Her Majesty, forwarded direct, are exempt from postage, and such petitions and addresses, as also petitions to either House of Parliament, if sent to a Member of either House, are likewise exempt, provided they do not weigh more than two pounds, and are without covers, or are in covers open at the ends. No letter or other enclosure, however, must be inserted, and if one be found, such enclosure, unless it bears the proper number of postage stamps, will be charged as an unpaid letter.

INLAND NEWSPAPERS.

For each inland newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet, the postage when prepaid is one halfpenny; but a packet containing two or more registered newspapers is not chargeable with a higher rate of postage than would be chargeable for a book packet of the same weight, viz., one halfpenny for every 2 oz., or part of that weight.

A newspaper posted unpaid, or a packet of newspapers posted either unpaid or insufficiently paid, is treated as an unpaid or insufficiently paid book packet of the same weight.

The Newspaper Wrappers are sold at 10 for 5½d.

The Post Cards are sold at the following prices:—Thin Cards, 5½d; Stout Cards, 6d per packet of 10.

Foreign Post Cards may be sent to all the countries comprised in the General Postal Union.

Foreign Post Cards with an impressed stamp of 1d and 1½d each are sold at that rate, and are transmissible to the majority of the countries of the Union without extra charge.

Registered Letter Envelopes sold at 12 for 2s 2½d, or 2½d each.

INLAND BOOK POST.

The following are the regulations for the Inland Book Post :—
The postage is one halfpenny for every 2oz., or part of that weight.

A packet posted wholly unpaid is charged with double the book postage; and if posted partially prepaid, with double the deficiency

A book packet may be posted either without a cover (in which case it must not be fastened, whether by means of gum, wafer, sealing wax postage stamp, or otherwise), or in a cover entirely open at both ends, so as to admit of the contents being easily withdrawn for examination; otherwise it is treated as a letter. For the greater security of the contents, however, it may be tied at the ends with a string; Postmasters being authorised to cut the string in such cases, although if they do so they must again tie up the packet.

CIRCULARS, *i.e.*, letters which, according to internal evidence, are being sent in identical terms to several persons, and the whole or the greater part of which is printed, engraved, or lithographed, may also be sent by book post.

ABUSE OF THE BOOK POST.

It seems to be but imperfectly understood that there is no legal way of sending a letter, other than a circular letter, through the post for a postage of a halfpenny, except by means of a postcard.

A notion appears to prevail that, because a post card which is open to inspection may have a letter written or printed upon it, any card whatever, and even any piece of paper, if only it be placed in open wrapper, may be sent through the post with a letter written or printed upon it for a postage of a halfpenny.

It seems necessary, therefore, to explain for the guidance of the public—

2. That the letter rate of postage must be prepaid for any communication of the nature of a letter, whether it be placed in a closed envelope or in an open cover, unless a post card be used for the purpose, or unless the letter be a circular letter—*i.e.*, a letter having internal evidence that it is intended for transmission, in identical terms, to several persons, and the whole or greater part of which is printed, engraved, or lithographed.

Large number of letters, not being circular letters, are from time to time found in halfpenny wrappers, contrary to the express provisions of the book post; and, as the officers of the department are instructed to surcharge all such letters with additional postage, it will save not only trouble to the Post Office but annoyance to the public, if care be taken always to pay letter postage for letters other than circular letters, unless they be written or printed on post cards.

REGISTRATION.

The fee for registering a letter, newspaper, or book packet passing between any two places in the United Kingdom is 2d.

Compensation for loss or damage of registered letters, books, or newspapers will be given, subject to certain regulations, as follows :—

Where no fee, except postage and registration fee is paid, to an amount not exceeding,	- - - - -	£5
Where, in addition to postage and registration fee, insurance fee of 2d is paid, to an amount not exceeding,	- - - - -	£10

Every letter, &c., to be registered should be presented at the counter, and a receipt obtained for it, and should on no account be dropped into a letter box. If, contrary to this rule, a letter marked "Registered" be dropped into a letter box, it will, "if directed to any place in the United Kingdom," be liable to a registration fee of 8d, instead of the ordinary fee of 2d.

Every article presented for registration must be enclosed in a strong cover, securely fastened. If the article contains money, it must, in order to gain the benefit of the guarantee, be enclosed in a Registered Letter Envelope sold by the Post Office; and if coins are sent, they must on no account be put in loose, but must be packed and enclosed in such a way as to move about as little as possible.

All inland letters which contain coin, watches, or jewellery, even though they be posted without registration, are treated as registered, and are charged on delivery with a registration fee of 8d in addition to the ordinary postage; and any such letters which cannot be registered in time to be forwarded by the Mail for which they are posted are detained for the next despatch.

The registration of a packet makes its transmission much more secure, inasmuch as under ordinary circumstances, a registered packet can be traced through its whole course, and thus the loss of a registered packet is a very rare occurrence.

ARTICLES NOT ALLOWED TO BE SENT BY POST.

1. It is forbidden to forward by post any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book, or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, publication, packet, or card, having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character. Anything posted contrary to this prohibition will be stopped and sent up to the Returned Letter Office, London.

2. Postmasters are instructed not to receive any letter which there is good reason to believe contains anything likely to injure the contents of the Mail bag, or to do bodily harm to any officer of the Post Office. If such a packet be posted without the Postmaster's knowledge, or if at any time before its despatch he should discover any such packet, he is directed not to forward it, but to report the case, with the address of the packet, to the Secretary. The following are the examples of the articles referred to :—

A glass bottle or glass in any form ; leeches, game, fish, meat, fruit or vegetables ; bladders or other vessels containing liquids ; gunpowder, lucifer matches, or anything which is explosive or liable to sudden combustion ; razors, scissors, needles, forks, or other sharp instruments are also forbidden, except when sent in packets or samples to foreign countries on the condition mentioned in Rule.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST, INLAND.

1. Trade Patterns and Samples of Merchandise may be sent between places in the United Kingdom, at the following rates of postage :—

For a packet not exceeding 4 oz. in weight	-	1d.
„ „ 6 oz. „	-	1½d.
„ „ 8 oz. „	-	2d.

2. No packet must exceed 8 oz. in weight. The limits of dimensions are 12 in. by 8 in. by 4 in.

3. A packet posted wholly unpaid will on delivery be chargeable with double postage ; and if insufficiently paid will be chargeable with double the deficient postage.

4. Patterns and Samples must be sent in wrappers (marked “Pattern Post” or “Sample Post”) entirely open at both ends, and must be so packed that they may be easily withdrawn for examination ; but Samples of seeds, flour, drugs, and such-like articles,

which cannot be sent in open wrappers, may be enclosed in boxes (but in such a way as admit of easy examination) or in bags of linen or in other like material, tied at the neck. Closed bags, even if transparent, will not be allowed.

5. The name, address, and trade of the sender must be in all cases *printed* (not written) on the outside of the wrapper above the address. If this rule be not complied with the packet will be liable to be charged on delivery.

6. The number, price, and private business marks may be written (at the top left-hand corner), but no other writing will be allowed. Packets infringing this rule will be surcharged at the letter-rate.

7. No glass bottle, or glass in any form, may be sent; no explosive liquid, semi-liquid or greasy matter, nor powders of any kind which may stain or do other damage; nor any living creature.

8. Patterns of scissors, knives, razors, and other sharp articles must be so packed and guarded as to completely prevent injury to the other contents of the Mail Bags, or to the officers employed, but the packets must at the same time admit of easy examination. When these requirements are not complied with, the packet will be stopped.

9. When necessary for securing the due transmission, or delivery, of letters, Patterns and Samples may be kept back for the succeeding despatch or delivery.

10. The Postmaster-General wishes it to be clearly understood that the Post is expressly intended for the benefit of, and is absolutely restricted to *bona fide Trade Patterns and Samples of Merchandise*. Packets not containing *bona fide* Patterns, and posted prepaid at the pattern-rate only, will be charged with double fee deficient postage, *at the letter rate*, together with a fine of 6d.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST, FOREIGN.

1. The Pattern and Sample Post to Foreign Countries and the Colonies generally is restricted to *bona fide trade patterns or samples of merchandise*. Goods sent for sale or in execution of an order are not admissible, nor any article liable to Custom Duties. Patterns and Sample Packets must be prepaid.

2. Patterns or Samples, when practicable, must be sent in covers open at the ends, and easy of examination. But samples of seeds, drugs, &c., may be enclosed in boxes or in bags, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened.

3. There must be no writing or printing upon or in any packet for non-Union Countries except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the address of the sender, a trade mark or number, the price of the articles, the weight or size, and quantity to be disposed of. But a packet for any country in the Postal Union may contain Printed Papers; and, if the rate applicable to Commercial Papers be paid, it may also contain Commercial Papers.

4. Samples of saleable value must not be sent to any foreign country in the Postal Union. Eider down, raw or thread silk, woollen or goats' hair thread, vanilla, or isinglass, fall under this rule, if weighing more than three ounces.

5. Samples of scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, must be packed and guarded so as not to injure the contents of the mail bags or the officers of the Post Office, while at the same time they may be easily examined. Indigo, liquids, or explosives cannot be sent.

6. A packet of Patterns or Samples sent to any place comprised in the Postal Union (except Belgium, France, Greece, Luxemburg, Portugal, Switzerland via France, the Argentine Republic, and the United States) must not exceed 8 inches in length, 4 inches in width, 2 inches in depth, and 8 oz. in weight. The limit to Belgium, France, Greece, Luxemburg, Portugal, Switzerland via France, the Argentine Republic, and the United States is 12 inches in length, 8 inches in width, 4 inches in depth, and 12 oz. in weight. The size of a packet for a non-Union country or colony is limited to 24 inches in length, 12 inches in width or depth, and 5lbs. in weight, except New South Wales, Queensland, and Fiji, for which the limit is 3lbs. in weight.

POST OFFICE TELEGRAPHS.

Telegraph business is transacted from 7 A.M. till 9 P.M. on Week Days, and on Sundays from 9 till 10 A.M.

Ayr Docks from 9 A.M. till 5 P.M. Saturdays from 9 A.M. till 2 P.M. No Sunday attendance.

INLAND TELEGRAMS.

The charge is 6d for the first 12 words, and $\frac{1}{2}$ for each additional word. Addresses are charged for.

THE sparkling and refreshing qualities of aerated waters have secured for these beverages an immense popularity. The beneficial effects arising from their use have firmly established them in the public mind. As quenchers of thirst they undoubtedly stand first, though that is not the only virtue they possess, their value being enhanced by the medicinal properties with which they can be so skilfully impregnated. In Great Britain, though the climate is temperate, the rapid growth of the consumption of such beverages has been very manifest, and, combined with the demand from those countries whose climatic influences cause great thirst, has increased the manufacture of aerated waters into a very flourishing industry. The sparkling and refreshing qualities of these beverages, and in some measure their flavour and hygienic properties, are due to the presence of carbonic acid gas. I have before said, and I still hold to my opinion, that the rôle played by the gas is threefold: to give them a sparkling effervescence, thereby rendering them far more refreshing than they were before aeration; to afford them an agreeable piquant flavour, and, as in the case of mineral waters especially, to render them capable of holding in solution certain mineral salts possessing valuable medicinal properties. The physiological effects of this gas upon the human system are well known; it exerts a peculiar action upon the nervous system, and has also a favourable action upon the digestive organs.

Of recent years gas-generating, filtering, syrup-making, and bottling machinery has been brought to a very high state of perfection, and I must confess that I was never more convinced of this fact than when, the other day, I visited Messrs Buchanan & Sons' bottling establishment, River Terrace, Ayr, the nucleus of whose business was laid in 1822. At that early date Mr M'Cormick, the founder of the trade, was favourably known as a brewer of ginger beer. His premises, known as "The Auld Mill," were beneath the shadow of the old and unfinished jail tower, which held

"The drowsy dungeon clock."

But a transformation has taken place, and many of the buildings of historical interest are now no more. From the premises at the end of the New Bridge the industry was removed to the High Street, where to it was added the wine and spirit trade. Year by year the business grew, and sixteen years ago, just previous to Mr M'Cormick's death, the present very interesting factory was erected; and ten years later Messrs Buchanan & Sons assumed proprietorship.

The most interesting approach to the factory, I was told at the railway station, would be down the High Street and over the old bridge that spans the Ayr.

In crossing "the auld constricted brig" I at once realised the truth of the poet's sarcasm when he speaks of its

" . . . poor narrow footpath of a street,
Where twa wheelbarrows tremble when they meet."

It is nevertheless a useful old bridge, though grey and wrinkled with age. Once over, I soon found Messrs Buchanan & Sons' premises, and making myself known, soon obtained the pleasure of what my American cousin calls a "run through."

The trade conducted by Messrs Buchanan & Sons is of much larger dimension than is generally supposed, and the premises I found much larger and better appointed than I had anticipated. There are three departments—the malt liquor, wine, and aerated water. The cellars are scrupulously clean, and by a system of steam pipes kept uniform in temperature. In the covered-in courtyard I observed stacks of casks of India pale ale from the famous Edinburgh brewery (Mr Daniel Bernard's) ready for moving to the bottling cellars, which are fitted with patent machinery for corking, etc. Messrs Barclay, Perkins & Co.'s celebrated London stout is also in great demand in Ayr, if one may judge by the very large stock held by Messrs Buchanan & Sons, who are the firm's agents. In the bottled malt-liquor warehouse I examined one of the largest and best conditioned stocks I have ever seen in a provincial town. I say large, for it is capable of holding eight thousand dozen of beer and stout; and as the firm make a practice of putting up the October and March brewings only, which is kept a sufficient time to thoroughly condition in a uniform and pure temperature, customers can always rely upon obtaining well-conditioned malt liquor.

The stock of wines held by Messrs Buchanan & Sons is a varied and reliable one, as will be understood when I say they are agents for the reputed Leith house, Messrs J. G. Thomson & Co., whose port, sherry, and claret has obtained such an enviable reputation in the Modern Athens, where an appreciative and educated palate understands pure wine from chemical concoctions. I make this statement because I know that Messrs Thomson & Co.'s wines are carefully selected from the best vintages, and kept maturing in the purest of cellars, and when sent to the public through their agents, Messrs Buchanan & Sons and others, are reliable wines of good age and purity.

The aerated water factory is spacious, lofty, and scrupulously clean, with concrete floor. The bottle and chemical stores are conveniently near. In the former I found a very large stock of bottles, indeed; already this year the firm have ordered not less than 650 gross of soda-water bottles. The stables and van sheds (for the firm have seven horses in the summer constantly taking goods through the town and district) are isolated from the factory. After scrutinising the factory it next became my duty to see what kind of water was employed. This I found to be wonderfully free from caliche and mineral matter.

The next thing that required attention was to see to the machinery, etc., for the thorough aeration of the water and the incorporation of pure essences on its way to the bottling machines, for it must be remembered the sparkling and refreshing qualities of these beverages, and in some measure their taste and hygienic properties are due to their thorough aeration. The machinery employed in this factory is a most perfect plant. The carbonic gas generator has all the newest attachments and bears the stamp of that famous engineer, M. Mondletti, Paris. The aerating machine is a double cylinder one of the newest type by Gibson, and the bottling machinery is the most unique and perfect obtainable, for MacDonald's patent machines are here found, which easily bottle sixty dozen a hour; M'Ewan's patent multiple bottling machine, which, by a very clever automatic action, syrups, fills, and stoppers four bottles at a time in the most cleanly manner at the

rate of 200 dozen per hour, whilst there are other bottling machines technically known as the arm-over bottling machine, each capable of bottling forty dozen per hour; whilst the bottle-washing department is fitted with the best machinery and an abundant supply of hot and cold water. The motive power for the machinery of the factory is obtained from a 7 H.P. horizontal engine up to date. The physiological effects of carbonic acid gas upon the human organism are well known. It exerts a peculiar action upon the nervous system, and especially upon the brain; but these effects are dangerous only when long continued, or when the gas is respired in large quantities and unmixed with air. In its action with mineral waters it has a pleasant, exhilarating influence. This gas has also a favourable action upon the organs of digestion. Provided they are carefully made, artificial medicinal waters have certain distinct advantages over the natural waters. The most important is obviously that the various constituents of the latter determined by analysis can be saved; the artificial drinks, in order to suit particular requirements and cases; and, further, waters which are brought from a natural source at a distance cannot be so fresh as those prepared artificially, and certainly are not supposed, like wine, to gain in virtue by keeping. It is now generally admitted that the artificial waters are wholesome and pleasant beverages, and they are produced so cheap that they are within the reach of all. The two principal points to be gained in this manufacture is to ensure the water being free from metallic impregnations, and the proper regulation and supply of carbonic acid gas. That these two points have received the greatest possible attention at Messrs Buchanan & Sons' works is beyond all doubt. The water, syrups, and, indeed, the whole of the pipes are made of the purest block tin. No lead enters into the construction of pipes or machinery, so that the carbonated products are entirely free from metallic impregnation.

The generators and purifiers, as I have said, are of most scientific modern type. I found that the carbonic acid used in the production of these aerated waters was obtained by the action of sulphuric acid upon calcine matter, and after being liberated the gas passed into a washer, where it was thoroughly washed, retaining excessive acid or particles of carbonate of lime. From here the purified acid flowed into the gas holder and thence into the condenser, where it was dissolved into water, and, of course, thence transmitted to the bottling machines. I noticed that Codd's patent globe-stoppered bottles were used for certain classes of aerated drinks, and the ordinary corked bottles for others. Both of these systems have much to recommend them. Certainly, before being used, the bottles are made scrupulously clean, and I might add that very great care is exercised in the production of their syrups and essences. It is not every one who can make a pure and successful syrup, simple as it may seem. There is much involved in the process of manufacture which makes it necessary to have a knowledge of the laws of chemistry and the technique of the laboratory. The syrup, pharmaceutically and dietetically, as prepared in these works, is all that could be desired; and not less attention has been given to the essences, which are the most carefully produced that I have seen for a year and a day.

There are two or three specialities of these works which deserve something more than a passing comment, namely, their superior lemonade, soda-water, and ginger ale, all of which have many excellent properties. The soda-water is thoroughly aerated, and becomes at once a palatable and useful anti-acid. The superior lemonade is in reality what its name implies; but it is deservedly Messrs Buchanan & Sons' most popular aerated water, the sale of which is perhaps more than all their other aerated drinks put to-

gether. It is their speciality, and every connoisseur of lemonade who tests its thirst allaying, gentle reviving, anti-scorbutic properties will thank me for the recommendation. The ginger ale I examined—and I sampled it from various quarters of the factory—was one of the best preparations that I had seen, and I therefore think it due to the public and to them to direct special attention to this ginger ale, for, as a safe medicinal and delicious beverage, it is everything claimed for it. Though it possesses stimulating properties, they are those, of course, obtained from the active properties of the ginger, and non-intoxicating. The aeration, colour, palate, bouquet, and even the plain manner in which it is put up, all go, in my opinion, to make it an essential article to every well-ordered dining-table.

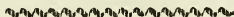
Aerated water, as found in this little unique factory, which is capable of turning out 2000 dozen a day, is a delightful luxury—a luxury for which the humblest class of humanity cheerfully pay, because it is one of the most delightfully refreshing and safest of drinks. Now, this is saying a great deal, indeed, in an age when there are so many beverages, both alcoholic and non-alcoholic, passed down the oesophagus of unsuspecting mortals. This is, doubtless, owing to their high standard of quality, and the complex gratifications they yield. Being made up of harmless ingredients, and having that peculiar palatable but indescribable bouquet, they are used for such a variety of purposes that few drinks, tea and coffee excepted, can at all compete with them. We all know how great is their demand as a summer drink, as a drink to be mixed with stronger liquors, as a necessary ballroom or evening party refreshment; but that is not all—they penetrate deeper than that.
