LAURISTON CASTLE LIBRARY ACCESSION

TO THE PUBLIC OF DUNDEE.

IT is now upwards of six months since I resolved to publish a DUNDEE DIRECTORY, and began to make the necessary arrangements for that purpose. The value of such a publication depending, of course, on the extent and accuracy of the local information which it might furnish,-my chief object therefore was, to procure correct lists of the principal Inhabitants, and of the Magistrates, Banking and Trading Companies. But owing, in part, to the time unavoidably employed in collecting these Lists, and, in part, also to the changes which annually occur amongst the Members of the Town Council and the representatives of other public bodies, I intended to delay putting the whole of the Directory to Press till a period subsequent to October next; circumstances however, which it is not worth while to detail here, have induced me to alter that resolution, and I now lay the work before the Public, trusting that it may be found tolerably correct, and useful to the trading part of the community, as well as to strangers.

I am aware, however, that notwithstanding the labour and attention which have been bestowed on the preparation and adjustment of the different Lists, errors and omissions in them will be found. Perfect accuracy in such productions is unattainable, and it is vain to pretend to it, more especially in the absence of those facilities for collecting information on every point, which the publishers of the Edinburgh and Glasgow Directories enjoy; yet in justice to myself I may state, that every precaution has been taken with the view of rendering the Directory complete. The proof sheets have been revised by several Gentlemen, who, from their official situations, have a very general knowledge of every thing connected with Dundee, and were consequently well qualified to suggest such corrections and additions as were necessary. To Mr. Home, Superintendent of Police, Mr.

BLYTH, the Treasurer, Mr. BELL, Post-master, and their Assistants, I have been particularly indebted. The Managers and Secretaries of the different Public Companies and Institutions furnished me with lists of Directors, Governors, &c. Instead, however, of printing these lists in the order in which I received them, I thought it would facilitate the reference to any particular name, to arrange the whole alphabetically, and this has accordingly been done.

The Post-office list, with the notices of the different Mails, were chiefly supplied by Mr. Bell, and are perhaps the most complete of any ever published in a local Register.

The Dundee Shipping List has been corrected by several Gentlemen engaged in, and most intimately acquainted with the trade; and that of Aberdeen, (corrected to this time,) added at the particular request of some of these Gentlemen, in consequence of the great connexion between the Ports.

Immediately after the ensuing Elections, Lists of the new Magistrates, &c. will be supplied gratis to the purchasers of the Directory.

Meantime I beg to thank the numerous Subscribers for their support, and to intimate that I will at all times be happy to receive communications for the improvement of a subsequent edition.

NEW EXCHANGE COFFEE-ROOM.

In consequence of the interest which of late has been manifested in the progress of this building, it occurred to the publisher that his Subscribers might be gratified to receive an engraved representation of it.

Several months must yet elapse before the building will be completed, so that little in the meantime can be said regarding it. Reyond doubt, however, it will be a great ornament to the town, deficient as it is in public buildings; and although it would be ridicu--lous to compare this erection, which is necessarily on a limited scale, with the splendid monuments of architecture in other places; yet, in beauty, simplicity, and adaptation to the purposes intended, it is not surpassed by any building whatever. The situation is admirable. Placed almost at the centre of our magnificent harbour, the Coffee-Room will command a delightful view of the entrance of the Tay, and of the coast of Fife from that point to Newburgh. But another public building on the site of the Packhouse is wanting, to render the harbour improvement complete; and for this it is hoped the community will at no distant period be indebted to the wealth and public spirit of the Seamen Fraternity. By the united efforts of the Merchants and Shipowners the Harbour has been brought to its present state of perfection; and it is equally the duty of the two bodies to unite their contributions for adorning and embellishing it.

The ground story of the Coffee-Room consists of a range of cellars, the greater number of which are arched. The next story has been laid out for Shops. Instead of being used in this manner, however, every person connected with the trade of the Port has felt that these Shops ought to have been converted into a Customhouse; but the attempts to arrange with Government terminated unfavourably.

The style of the architecture above the cellars is Grecian. The west front of the basement story is composed of Doric columns and pilasters, boldly relieved by the deep recesses of the doors and windows. The same front of the Coffee-Room story is of the Ionic order, and taken from the Temple of Erectheus at Athens. This Ionic example has received more decoration than the one commonly used. The north front is of plain ashlar; but it is well connected by the horizontal line of the cornice and string course, which are carried round the three fronts.

It appears from the drawings that the interior of the Coffee-Room will be laid out as follows:—The Reading-Room is to be 73 feet, (exclusive of the space allowed for an Orchestra,) by 38, and 30 in

height. The floor is to be laid with Oak, and the furniture, (to be made of Oak,) has been ordered from Mr. TROTTER of Edinburgh. At the north end there is a communication with the waiter's apartments, Cemmitte-room and closets, and beyond these are two rooms to be used separately or thrown into one for public meetings or sales of property. To the south end of the Coffee-Room two other rooms are attached, one intended for a consulting room to the Subscribers, and in which accommodation will be provided for their transacting business if they require to do so; and the other as a Library. Adjoining to them there are two appartments which have been somewhat prematurely designated, the Writers' Library.

The entrance to these spacious rooms passes through the middle of the west front. The Lobby is built of polished stone, and terminates at the Staircase with fluted Doric columns. Judging from the

Plan, the Staircase will be very elegant.

Altogether, the accommodation afforded to the Subscribers by these rooms will be complete; and what is rather unusual with regard to public works built by subscription, there is every prospect of the Subscribers receiving fair interest on the capital expended.

The Plan of the Town which accompanies the Directory, although on a small scale, exhibits the new streets and other late improvements, and with the references, will, it is hoped, be found useful. It has been drawn and engraved on Stone by Mr. SIME, Land Surveyor, and printed at the publisher's Lithographic Press, and is the first attempt of the kind ever made in Dundee.

SETT OF THE BURGH.

THE Nine Incorporated Trades meet in their Hall, at Eleven o'clock forenoon, on the second Wednesday preceding Michaelmas, and elect their Convener, by a majority of votes of the Nine Incorporations, through their Deacons; who, for the year ensuing, shall be a constituent Member of the Town-Council; but who must not, at the same time, be Deacon of a Trade.

The Council, (of twenty-one,) meet on Tuesday preceding Michaelmas, and, after lecting ten Guild-brothers and four Members of the Nine Trades, they make choice of five Guild-brothers and two Members of the Trades, (not of the same Trade) to be Counsellors for the year ensuing. After the said Counsellors are chosen, the old Council. and such of the new as are present, make up leets for the offices of Provost, Bailies, and Treasurer; nominating four who have been Magistrates, and then make choice of two to be on the leet for Pro-They then make up leets for the Bailies, and nominate sixteen who have been Counsellors, and out of these male choice of eight to be on the leet for Bailies; and then nominate four Burgesses, being also Guild-Brethren, for the Treasurer's Office, and of these make choice of two to be on the leet. On Wednesday thereafter, these leets are extracted, and given to the Convener of the Nine Trades, who on the same day delivers a copy to each of the Deacons, for the use of his Trade. On Thursday thereafter the old and new Council and Nine

Deacons, meet for the election of the Provost, Bailies, and Treasurer, which are carried according to the plurality of votes. The four Bailies of the preceding year continue in Council another year, as old Bailies and Counsellors; but in case of one of the present Bailies being elected Provost, the old Provost remains a Counsellor ex officio for the year. In case any of the Members of Council, or Deacons of Trades, do not attend the Meeting for electing Office-bearers, those present appoint a proxy to act at that meeting, for each absentee. Proxies for Trades' Counsellors to be Burgesses and Members of the Nine Trades, and proxies for any other Members of Council to be Burgesses and Guild-Brothers.

On Tuesday thereafter the Council meet, and elect a Guild

Brother to be Shore-master.

On the Wednesday after the election of the Provost and Bailies, the Guildry Incorporation meet at Eleven o'clock in the Guild-Hall, or such other place, as a General Meeting of the Guildry shall at any time fix, and by a majority of the Members present, elect a Guild Brother, to be Dean of Guild; and another Guild Brother, (both Burgesses,) to be Counsellor to the Guild for the year ensuing. These to be Constituent Members of Council.

The Counsellor to the Guild, and Shore-master, are entitled to vote at the Meeting of Council for electing the Provost and other Office-

bearers.

If any of the Members of Council, or Deacons, shall be elected a Counsellor for the year immediately succeeding that in which he is then serving, such Member or Deacon, shall not thereby have two votes in making up leets for the Provost, Bailies, and Treasurer, nor in electing them; the Council shall choose a Proxy to vote for him in that election, in the character which he held previous to his new election.

No Member of the Nine Trades, being also a Member of the Guildry, shall be entitled to vote as a Member of the Guildry in the election of any Member of the Town Council, unless he shall have previously renounced* his political rights as a Member of one of the Nine Incorporations; and no Member of the Guildry, being also a Member of any of the Nine Trades, shall vote in his Incorporation in the election of any of the Town Council, unless he shall have previously renounced his political rights as a Guild-brother: Such renunciation, in either case, shall in noways affect any beneficial right competent to such persons as Members either of the Guildry or Trades.

By an opinion of Counsel lately taken on this point, it was declared, that an unqualited renunciation of the political right of either the one or other is necessary. This certainly was not contemplated when the Sett was altered, beyond the period of one election as the parties themselves inclined.

The Convener attends the Meeting of Council, to be held on Tuesday, for making up the leets, and takes his seat immediately after the two Trades' Counsellors have been elected. But he must first produce his Burgess and Trade's Tickets, as evidence of his being a Burgess and a Member of one of the Trades, with an Extract of the Minute of his election as Convener, certified by the Clerk of the Nine Trades. The Dean, and Counsellor to the Guild, attend the first stated Meeting of Council after their election; but before taking their seats, must produce their several Burgess and Guildry Tickets, with an Extract of the Minute of their election, certified by the Clerk of the Guildry. In like manner, the Deacons, before taking their seats for the first time after they are elected, also have to produce certificates of their elections, signed by the Clerks of their Trades, with their Burgess and Trades Tickets, as evidence of being Burgesses and Members of their respective Incorporations.

In case the Dean of Guild, Counsellor to the Guild, and Convener, or any of them, shall fail to appear in Council on the days appointed for taking their seats; or, appearing, fail to produce the requisite evidence of their several elections and qualfications; or if it shall appear from the evidence produced, that the Guildry and Trades, or either of these bodies, have made a double election, then, and in any of these cases, the right of supplying the deficiency which shall have thus arisen in the Council, shall, for that year, devolve on the Magistrates and Council, who shall elect a Dean, and Counsellor to the Guild, or either of them in place of the Dean and Counsellor, who have so failed to take their seats, as elected by the Guildry, and a Trades Counsellor, in place of the Convener who has so failed to take his seat as elected by the Trades; without prejudice, however, to the Guildry and Nine Incorporated Trades exercising their respective

rights to elect those Members of Council in future years.

^{*} When the census was taken last, (1821,) the return was made 30,575, but the general supposition is that there were then 34,000 Inhabitants in the Town and Parish, and from the great increase of buildings and trade since 1821, the Population must now be nearly 40,000.



JUSTICE OF PEACE, OR SMALL DEBT COURT,

For sums not exceeding 5l, exclusive of costs.

DUNDEE DISTRICT—comprehending the parishes of Dundee, Mains and Strathmartine, Monikie, Monifieth, Murroes, Barry, Panbride, Auchterhouse, Tealing, Liff and Benvie—held within the Guild-Hall, every Monday fortnight, at eleven o'clock forenoon. The acting Justices of the Peace are Judges, and any two form a quorum.

Wm. Chalmers, Principal Clerk.—Alex. Christie, Dep.-Clerk.

The parties are heard viva voce only, either by themselves or any one in the family. The Court cannot sustain actions for spiritous liquors; nor any debt for rent upon lease, or where the written titles or deeds may come to be brought in question; nor for gambling debts. Six days after the sentence is pronounced, the decreet can be put in force by poinding or imprisonment, when parties are present in Court; but in the case of a decree in absence, a charge of six free

days must take place before putting the sentence in force. The sentence is not subject to advocation, suspension, or any other stay of execution, except when the Justices exceed their powers-in which case the cause must be brought in the shape of a reduction before the Supreme Court; and the party bringing it must find sufficient caution for all expenses that may be awarded in the event of his reduction being dismissed. Where decree has passed in absence, the defender shall be re-heard on consigning the sums decerned for in the hands of the Clerk of Court, within the days of the charge, and giving intimation thereof to the complainer before the following Court day—And in like manner where absolvitor has passed in absence, the cause to be re-heard on the complainer consigning 2s. 6d. and giving intimation to the defender. The following are the fees fixed by Act 39 and 40, Geo. III. cap. 46; but subject to the modification of the Justices in very small cases, or where one petition is directed against different defenders, viz. :-

POLICE COURT AND ESTABLISHMENT.—1824.

The Police Act was obtained in 1824, and is entitled "An Act for the better paving, lighting, watching, and cleansing of the Burgh of Dundee and its vicinity; also for building and maintaining a Bridewell there."

The bounds of Police extend within a line commencing on the east at the river Tay, and running northwards in the line of the east march of Mayfield on the lands of Craigie, to the southern extremity of that march; thence along that march to the Turnpike road leading from Dundee to Arbroath; thence eastward along that Turnpike road until its junction with the old Craigie road; northwards along

that road to the Stobsmuir Turnpike road; across that road, and from it along the old road by the back of Stobsmuir and Clepington, till it reaches the East road to the Fair Muir, so as to include it, until it joins the Strathmartin road; southwards along the Strathmartin road until its junction with the road which leads by the back of the Law of Dundee from the Strathmartin road to the Coupar and Meigle Turnpike road; along the northern boundary of that road to the Lochee Toll Bar, on the Turnpike road from Dundee to Coupar and Meigle; from that Toll Bar westwards along the road until it reaches the Stone Wall which runs on the west side of the Houses and garden ground known by the name of Lark or Lerrick Hall; across from the Turnpike road to the march between the estate of Logie and the estate of Balgay; from the Turnpike road southwards along that Stone Wall to the said march; thence along the march southwards to the extremity of Logie; thence southwards to the Blackness road, along the Dyke and Hedge which form the present boundary between Blackness and Balgay; thence along the northern boundary of the Blackness road, westwards to the line of march which is on the south side of that road, between Blackness and Balgay; and southwards along that march down to the river Tay. Which bounds are divided into Eleven Wards, each Ward having the right to elect by the votes of those assessed for 51. or upwards of rent, two General and two Resident Commissioners on the last Monday of June annually. These General Commissioners, along with the ex officis, are authorized to levy at the rate of 1s. per Pound on all rents from 21. to 51., and 1s. 3d. per Pound on those of 51. or upwards; the assessment so levied to be applied for the purposes of the Act.

The limits of the wards run along the centre of the streets, roads,

lanes, and closes, by which they are bounded.

The Judges of Police are the Provost, the four Bailies, and the Dean of Guild, as to all offences, &c. committed within the borough, and the Sheriff and his substitutes beyond the borough. The Court may hear and give judgement, in a summary manner, in all complaints made under the act against persons accused of theft, swindling, unlawful gambling, assault, rioting, breaking the peace, or any such other criminal, riotous, or disorderly conduct, or of offending against any of the provisions of the act, or any other of the regulations established by its authority. No complaint, can be entertained in the Police Court for offences beyond three months from the date of the complaint; and neither the Judges, the Commissioners, the Superintendent, nor any other person can be prosecuted for any thing done under the act, unless wilful corruption, or oppression, or culpable negligence, out of which real injury has arisen, be charged.

The warrants of the Police Court may be executed upon any part of the Firth of Tay within the limits of the port of Dundee,—that is,

from the Burn of Invergowrie to the Gaa of Barry.

At the commencement of any establishment on so extensive a scale as that of the Police for Dundee, it may have been expected that the expenses would be greater than if it had been organized for years, particularly where so much paving, lighting, &c. were required, and the result is, that the assessment has not hitherto been adequate to meet the expenditure; it is, however, satisfactory to observe the great improvement that has taken place in every department, particularly in the watching, under the vigilance of our active Superintendent and his officers.

Copies of the Regulations for Cleansing, &c. have been already very generally circulated, and may still be had by applying at the Police Office.

SHORE-DUES,

LEVIABLE AT THE PORT OF DUNDEE.

Goods shipped over-side to pay one half dues only.

Goods imported or exported by persons who are not Burgesses of Dundee, or who are not free by service of His Majesty's navy or army, and domiciled within the borough of Dundee, to pay one-half more than the dues specified in the schedule.

Lime and coal landed within the precincts of the harbour, to the eastward of the Rood-Yards and to the westward of the Magdalene Yard, to pay one-half of the dues.

Five cubic feet, not exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ cwt. to be rated a barrel bulk; but when the weight of five cubic feet is greater than $2\frac{1}{2}$ cwt. then

25 cwt. to be rated a barrel bulk. 1

In weighing or measuring goods, for ascertaining the shore-dues payable, the weight or measurement of the packages is to be included.

EXEMPTIONS.—Goods having paid dues inwards, when shipped outward, if they be in the original state.—Goods having paid dues outwards, when brought inwards, if they be returned to the original shipper, and in the original state.—Returned empty boxes, barrels, bags, sacks, and pack-sheets.—All goods, merchandizes, wares, &c. and all beasts conveyed in licensed passage-boats from any of the ferries of Ferry-Port-on-Craig, Newport, Woodhaven, or Balmerino, in the county of Fife, to the ferry of Dundee, or from the ferry of Dundee to any of those ferries.

Goods not enumerated in the schedule to be charged by the Commissioners in proportion to other goods of similar bulk and value

specified in the schedule.

Where vessels are not registered at the port of Dundee, it shall be in the option of the Commissioners to charge either the tonnage-dues on the voyage inwards or outwards, at the rates specified in the schedule, according to the distance; and if the charge be made on the outward voyage, there shall be deducted from it the amount of the duties that may have been previously paid on the inwards. such vessels sail in ballast, they shall be charged with dues on the inward voyage only.

British vessels not registered at the port of Dundee to pay one-half

more than the dues in the above schedule.

Vessels, although registered at the port of Dundee, if navigated by masters who are not burgesses, to pay one-half more than the dues in the above schedule; but if the masters be domiciled in the borough, and be free by service in His Majesty's navy or army, the vessels to pay the same dues as if navigated by burgesses.

Vessels navigated by foreign masters to pay double the above dues. Vessels leaving the harbour or precincts thereof, having paid tonnage-dues on the voyage inwards, and taking on board goods at any other port or place in the river Tay, and returning to the harbour or precincts thereof, to complete their cargoes, shall not be liable in tonnage-dues for such returns.

Vessels launched at the port, to pay tonnage-dues on the voyage outwards, according to the distance of the port to which such vessels sail, provided they take goods on board; but if they sail in ballast,

no dues shall be charged.

Vessels remaining in the harbour six months to pay one-third more than the above dues, excepting those belonging to Dundee employed in the whale fishery.

Vessels remaining in harbour for one year to pay double dues.

Each vessel entering the harbour, and loading or unloading goods or ballast within the same, or performing both operations before leaving the harbour, to pay plank-money whether a plank be used or not.

Vessels loading or unloading goods in the precincts of the harbour,

exempted from payment of plank-money.

Steam-vessels employed in the river Tay, in carrying passengers

and their luggage exclusively, exempted from shore-dues.

Vessels leaving the harbour for the purpose of taking on board ballast in any part of the river, and returning to the harbour or precincts with ballast, shall not be liable in shore-dues for such return.

Vessels sailing from the port and put back by stress of weather or. any other cause without having accomplished their voyage, shall not be liable in additional shore-dues.

Vessels from any part of the river with stones, and having no other goods on board, and delivering their cargoes in the precincts of the harbour, to pay two shillings each voyage, in name of tonnage-dues.

Vessels arriving in ballast for the purpose of being repaired in the graving-dock, and departing in ballast, exempted from shore-dues.

Coaches and other four-wheeled carriages, gigs, and taxed carts, with the horses employed in drawing them, will be allowed to pass and repass the ferry on the same day, for payment of one fare, provided they return with the same company, or empty.

The preceding freights are for boats or pinnaces, &c. from 6 morning till 10 at night, from 1st. April to 31st. October; and from 7 morning till 9 at night, from 1st. November to 31st. March. The freights at other hours to be one-half more than those above-mentioned.

In cases where the rates are chargeable by weight or measure, it

shall be optional in the collector to charge either way.

A person engaging a boat or pinnace to sail at a particular hour, must deposit the freight when he makes the engagement.

HOURS OF SAILING.

A steam-boat will sail from Dundee every day except Sunday, at the following hours in the morning, and continuing to ply every subsequent hour until the under-mentioned hours in the evening:—

August to 10th. September, from 7 morning to 7 evening. From 11th. Sept. to 30th. Sept. from 7 morning to 6 evening. From 1st. October to 15th. October, from 7 morning to 5 evening. From 16th. October to 14th. February, from 7 morning to 4 evening.

There are 187 Carters and 100 Porters, appointed and licenced by the Magistrates, under the control of the Superintendent of Police, in virtue of Regulations enacted by the Magistrates. Every Carter and Porter so licenced, receives a badge and copy of his respective Regulations, which he is bound to carry with him and exhibit to his employers when required; and in the event of any overcharge of the Rates therein specified, or otherwise transgressing, he is liable to be fined. All offences committed by either, are cognizable before the Police Court. By an Act of the Magistrates of 15th. June last, Carters may now engage to perform work out of their regular turns by special agreement, if at or under one-fifth part of the Rates specified in the Table.
