Abstract of the Regulations enacted by the Magistrates.

#### STANDS.

On the High Street in front of the Town-House-four cabs

On Nethergate Street, opposite top of Union Street

On Panmure Street-along south side thereof-west from Murraygate

On west side South Union Street

On west side Victoria Dock

#### FARES.

That the following and no higher fares shall be charged :--

- For any distance betwixt places within the town, not lying beyond the Lilybank tollbar and Taybank gate on the east; Blackness and Logie toll-bars on the west; or Somerville Place, Head of Bonnet-hill, and Stobswell (at crossing of Forfar and Murroes Road, Lunatic Asylum) on the north, One Shilling
- Murroes Road, Lunatic Asylum) on the north, One Shilling For any distance beyond the said bounds, but within the limits of the extended Royalty, (besides payment of Tolls,) One Shilling and Sixpence

#### PUBLIC CONVEYANCES.

MONEY ORDERS .- At the Head Office, High Street, and Newport, Fife. Hours from 9 A.M. to 1 P.M., and from 2 to 6 P.M. Sums not exceeding £2 charged 3d ; up to £5, 6d. They must be presented before the end of the second month, or a new order will be necessary, for which a second commission must be paid. If beyond twelve months, the amount will not be paid.

REGISTERED LETTERS.—By the prepayment of a fee of 6d in postage stamps, any letter, book, or other packet, on which the postage has been prepaid in stamps, may be registered. This will make its transmission more secure, by rendering it practicable to trace it, when inland, from its receipt to its delivery; and when foreign or colonial, if not to its delivery, at least to the port of despatch. The Post Office does not guarantee the safe delivery of the letter, &c., though the officers are, of course, responsible to the Postmaster General, who will call to strict account any one neglecting his duty on this point, and, if His Grace think proper, will require him to make good any loss that may be sustained thereby.

The Postage of registered letters must be prepaid; and if the letter be inland, it must be prepaid in stamps.

Every letter to be registered should not be dropped into the letter box, but be presented at the window, and a receipt obtained for it.

The latest time for posting a registered letter is half-an-hour before the closing of the box for the mail by which it is intended to be despatched.

To France and Prussia an additional fee is required.

CAUTIONS .- No explosive nor perishable articles can be transmitted, nor glass, sharp instruments, nor anything dangerous or calculated to injure the mail bags and contents. Letters to hot climates should be wafered, as wax is liable to melt.

POSTAGE STAMPS may be used for printed votes and proceedings in parliament, and on foreign, colonial, and ship letters, &c., outwards. If any letter, however, addressed to places beyond sea, bear an insufficient number of stamps, it will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, to be returned in all practical cases to the writer. Stamps are not permitted to be used on letters arriving in the United Kingdom from the Colonies or foreign countries. These regulations are applicable to newspapers in those cases where they are liable to postage. If the stamps affixed to letters have been mutilated or defaced, the letter will be liable to the unpaid rate.

SHIP LETTERS.—Letters for foreign parts to which there are no regular packets are forwarded through the Ship Letter Office, London, by every outward-bound vessel; and letters can be forwarded to the Colonies and foreign parts through the Post Office, by any ship or from any port, if specially addressed. In cases where wanted to go by a particular ship, the name must also be specified, as, "Hamburg Steamer via Hull." All ship letters must be prepaid 8d under one-half ounce, and so on in the ratio as inland letters.

NEWSPAPERS.—There are specific regulations for the reception of Foreign and Colonial newspapers into this country; and for the despatch of British newspapers, periodical works, Parliamentary papers, &c.

NEWSPAPERS AND OTHER PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS BEARING THE NEWSPAPER STAMP.

Although provision is made for forwarding newspapers, books, and money through the post, it is not compulsory on any one to employ this mode of transmission : everything except letters may be sent in any other way.

All periodical publications, including newspapers published in the United Kingdom, at intervals not exceeding thirty-one days, and which bear an impressed stamp or stamps denoting the stamp duty, (of the kind formerly confined chiefly to newspapers,) may be transmitted and retransmitted through the post within the United Kingdom free from postage under the following regulations,—viz. :

They are subject to the same restrictions with regard to the number of sheets and superficial extent as were lately applicable only to newspapers properly so called. These restrictions are shown in the following table.

No publication, or portion thereof, can pass through the post unless the impressed stamp which it bears be at least a stamp of the value of one penny.

The title and date of publication must be printed at the top of every page.

The publication must be folded in such a manner that the whole of the stamp or stamps, denoting the full duty, shall be exposed to view, and be distinctly visible on the outside, except when there are more than two publications in the same cover it will be considered sufficient if the stamps are so arranged that they can readily be examined.

It must not be printed on pasteboard or cardboard, or on two or more thicknesses of paper pasted together, nor must any pasteboard or cardboard, or such pasted paper, be sent with it as a back or cover thereto, or otherwise. It must be posted within fifteen days from the date of publication.

It must either have no cover or a cover open at the ends. (As a newspaper sometimes slips from the cover, it is recommended that when a cover is used the address be written also on the newspaper itself, except when the newspaper is intended for retransmission, in which case, if the first address remain, the newspaper would become subject to letter postage.)

It must contain no enclosure,

It must have no writing or other mark thereon but the name and address of the person to whom it is sent, nor anything on the cover but such name and address, the printed title of the publication, and the printed name of the publisher or vendor who sends it.

If the publication be addressed to any person within the free delivery of the place where it is posted, it becomes liable to a postage of one penny, which must be prepaid by affixing a postage stamp.

When a newspaper is so folded as not to expose the stamp or stamps, a postage of one penny is charged in addition to any other postage to which the publication, if properly folded, would have been liable ; and if the newspaper, &c., be addressed to any person within the free delivery of the place where it is posted, and do not bear a penny postage stamp, it will be charged 2d. In case of any other irregularity, the publication is dealt with in accordance with the regulations of the book post.

Unstamped or stamped publications which have been issued more than fifteen days can be forwarded within the United Kingdom, and to most of the colonies, under the regulations of the book post.

Newspapers sent abroad are liable to the same regulations as newspapers passing (under the newspaper privilege) between different parts of the United Kingdom, except that, before going abroad, the name of the newspaper must have been registered at the General Post Office, and that, instead of requiring to have an impressed stamp, each newspaper, if sent to a British Colony, is liable to a postage of ld, (which must be prepaid by a postage label or in money,) together with an additional postage when the newspaper has to pass through a foreign country. In all cases of newspapers going abroad, the impressed stamp stands for nothing.

1. The postage must be prepaid in full, by means of postage stamps affixed outside the packet or its cover.

2. Every packet must be sent either without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends or sides.

3. If the postage paid on the packet amount to as much as 4d, it may contain any number of separate books or other publications, prints, or maps, and any quantity of paper, parchment, or vellum, (to the exclusion, however, of letters whether sealed or open.) And the books or other publications, prints, maps, &c., may be either printed, written, or plain, or any mixture of the three. Further, all legitimate binding, mounting, or covering of a book, publication, &c., or of a portion thereof, will be allowed, whether such binding, &c., be loose or attached, as also rollers, in the case of prints or maps, markers, (whether of paper or otherwise,) in the case of books, and, in short, whatever is necessary for the safe transmission of literary or artistic matter, or usually appertains thereto.

4. But if the postage paid be less than 4d, the packet must consist exclusively of printed matter; without restriction, however, either as to the number of publications or separate sheets, or as to whether they are bound or unbound. If any other matter be included, the packet will be subject to the penalty mentioned in the 9th condition.

5. A book packet, whatever may be the postage paid thereon, must not contain any letter, closed or open, or any inclosure sealed or otherwise closed against inspection; nor must there be any letter, nor any communication of the nature of a letter, written or printed, in any such packet or on its cover. Entries, however, merely stating who sends the book, &c., or to whom it is given, are not regarded as a letter, and may therefore be made when any writing is permitted, that is, when the postage of 4d at least is paid.

6. No book packet can be received if it exceeds two feet in length, width, or depth.

7. Any packet which shall not be open at the ends or sides, or shall have any letter, or any communication of the nature of a letter, written or printed, in it, or upon its cover, is charged with the "unpaid" or double letter postage.

8. If a packet be found to contain any letter, whether closed or open, or any enclosure sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or any other unauthorized enclosure, the letter or enclosure is taken out and forwarded to the address on the packet, charged with full postage as an unpaid letter, together with an additional book rate, that is, with the postage chargeable on a book weighing not more than half a pound. The remainder of the packet, if duly prepaid with stamps, is then forwarded to its address.

9. If a packet be not sufficiently prepaid with stamps, but nevertheless bear stamps equal to a single book rate, it will be forwarded charged with the deficient book postage, together with an additional book rate; but any packet which shall not bear postage stamps equal to a single book rate is charged with the letter postage. 10. No book packet weighing more than three pounds can be sent to the East Indies or to New South Wales.

11. In no case can a book packet be sent to the Colonies (except at the letter rate of postage) through a foreign country.
