

The First Aberdeen Directory

A RECORD OF OLDEN TIMES

In the year 1824, a combination of Aberdeen booksellers undertook the formidable task of compiling and publishing a directory for the city of Aberdeen. The combination consisted of Mesors W. Gordon, G. Clark, A. Stevenson, T. Spark, and D. Wyllie. directory was printed by D. Chalmers and Company, and its price was 2s 6d. It was a small, paper-covered booklet of about 120 pages. One hundred pages contained the names of about 3500 persons, with their occupations and addresses, the remaining pages being devoted to information about carriers, mail and stage coaches, shipping, canal boats, rates for street and harbour porters, backmen of coals (now called coal heavers), etc.

Compared with the city directory of today, the 1824 publication was a humble thing indeed, but the compilers of the first directory considered theirs no small tack, for in their prefatory note "To the Public," they state-"A directory for Aberdeen and its vicinity has been long wished for, and strangers have often expressed their surprise at the want of it in a city of so great extent, population, and commercial importance. . . and now that it is finished it may be necessary to state that in a work of this nature perfect accuracy is not to be expected. The undertaking was new to the publishers, and, therefore, errors and omissions will no doubt be found; but it is hoped they are few and unimportant, and it can be confidently said that neither labour nor expense has been spared to prevent them."
