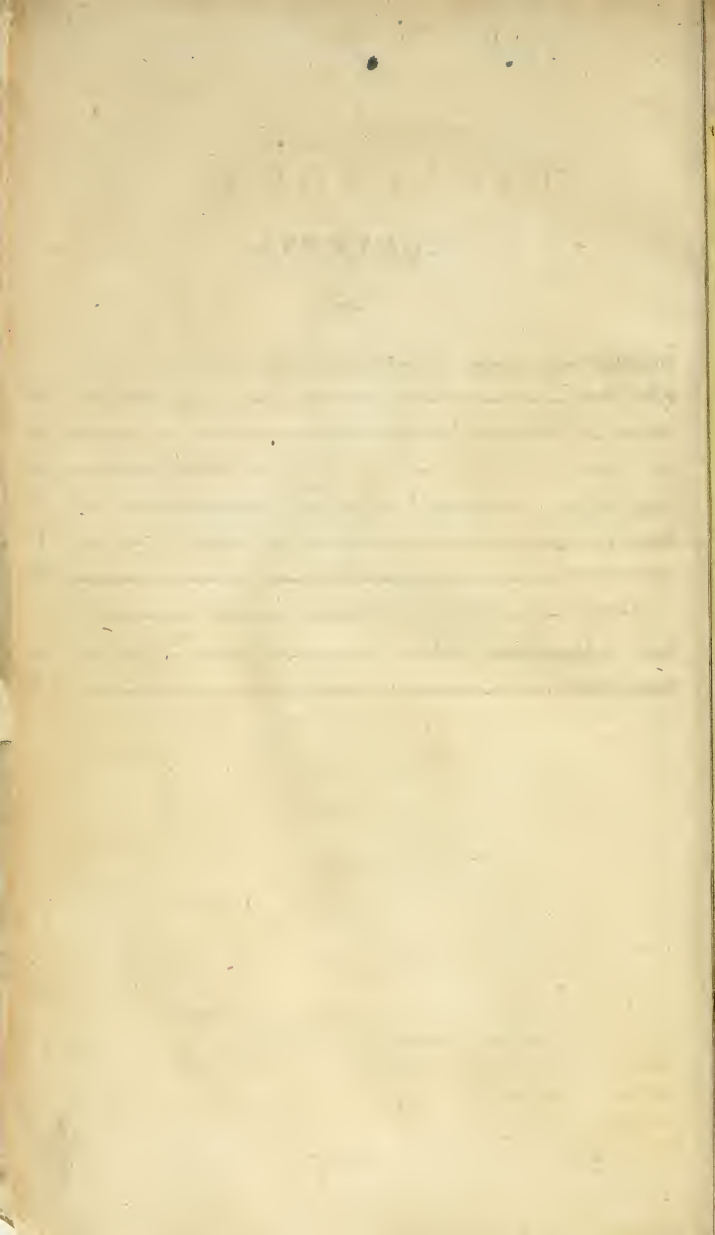

DESCRIPTION
OF THE
POLICE WARDS,
AND ALSO OF
The Six Parishes

INTO WHICH THE PARISH OF ST. NICHOLAS IS NOW DIVIDED.

FIRST WARD—(EAST PARISH):—Beginning at the centre of Union Street, opposite the Back Wynd; keeping along the Back Wynd to Schoolhill; along the Schoolhill and Upperkirkgate, eastward, to Broad Street; along Broad Street, southward, to Union Street; along Union Street, Castle Street, and Justice Street, eastward, to Park Lane; along Park Lane, and the Road or Street leading along the foot of the Castlehill, to James Street; along James Street, southward, to the south side of the Quay; and then along the south side of said Quay, westward, to opposite the Shorebrae: up the Shorebrae and Shiprow, to Union Street; and along Union Street, westward, to the point of commencement, opposite the south end of Back Wynd.

SECOND WARD—(WEST PARISH):—Beginning at the north boundary of the Parish of Saint Nicholas with the Parish of Old Machar, at or near the north end of Spa Street; and thence, along the Woolmanhill, Schoolhill, and Upperkirkgate, to the south end of Gallowgate; then northward, along Gallowgate, and the east branch of the Turnpike Road leading from Aberdeen to Inverury, to the north boundary of the Parish, at or near Causewayend; and thence, west and southward, along the boundary betwixt the Parishes of Saint Nicholas and Old Machar, to the point of commencement aforesaid, at or near Spa Street.

THIRD WARD—(NORTH PARISH):—Beginning at the north boundary of the Parish of Saint Nicholas, with the Parish of Old Machar, in King Street, at or near Love Lane; keeping southward, along King Street, as far as North Street; then along Queen Street, to Broad Street; then along Broad Street, to Union Street; along Union Street, Castle Street, Justice Street, and Bowl Road, eastward, to the Links; crossing the Links, from the east end of Bowl Road, in a direct line due east, to the Sea Beach; and along the Sea Beach, northward, to the line of march between Old Machar and Saint Nicholas Parishes; and along that march, westward, to the point of commencement, in King Street, aforesaid.

FOURTH WARD—(SOUTH PARISH):—Beginning at the north boundary of the Parish of Saint Nicholas with the Parish of Old Machar, at or near the north end of Spa Street; and thence, holding along Woolmanhill and Schoolhill, to opposite the north end of Back Wynd; along Back Wynd, to Union Street; along Union Street, eastward, to opposite the head of Shiprow; down the Shiprow, to opposite the Shorebrae; down the Shorebrae, to the south side of the Quay; and then, keeping along the south side of the Quay, and along the Flood-mark, east and southward, to the Denburn; and from thence, along the march between the Parishes of Old Machar and Saint Nicholas, to the point of commencement, at near the north end of Spa Street.

FIFTH WARD—(GREYFRIARS PARISH) :—Beginning at the north boundary of the Parish of Saint Nicholas, with the Parish of Old Machar in King Street, at or near Love Lane; and thence, along King Street, as far as North Street; and then along Queen Street, to Broad Street; then along Broad Street and Gallowgate, and the east branch of the Turnpike Road leading from Aberdeen to Inverury, to the boundary between the Parishes of Saint Nicholas and Old Machar, at or near Causewayend; and from thence, eastward, along the boundary between the said Parishes, to the point of commencement, in King Street, at or near Love Lane.

SIXTH WARD—(SAINT CLEMENT'S PARISH) :—Beginning at the Sea Beach, at a point due east, from the east end of Bowl Road; keeping across the Links, in a straight line, due westward, to the east end of Bowl Road; and along the Bowl Road to Park Lane; along Park Lane, and the Road or Street leading from it by the foot of the Castlehill, to James Street; keeping along James Street, to the south side of the Quay; and keeping along the south side of the said Quay, and along the Floodmark, west and southward, to the Denburn; and then along a march between the Parishes of Old Machar and Saint Nicholas, to the extremity of the Parish of Saint Nicholas, on the north bank of the River Dee; and then crossing that River, and holding eastward, along the boundary with the Parish of Nigg, to the mouth of the said River; and after there crossing it, holding northward along the Sea Beach, to the point where the line commenced, opposite the Bowl Road.

SEVENTH WARD :—Comprehends the houses and grounds beginning at Union Street Bridge, which crosses the Denburn, thence keeping the boundary between the said parishes of Old Machar and Saint Nicholas northward, and eastward to Hutcheon Street, thence westward and southward along the boundary line before described to the Dam of Gilcomston, thence along the waste water burn which leads therefrom eastward to the Bridge, which crosses the said burn at Hardweird, thence southward along the road which leads from said Bridge to Skene Street and Summer Lane, thence along said lane to Union Street, thence along said street to the said Bridge which crosses the Denburn.

EIGHTH WARD :—Beginning at a point in Union Street opposite to Summer Lane aforesaid, thence going southward along the road or street which leads to the old Hardgate Road, thence along said road to Newbridge, thence westward along Holburn, keeping the boundary line before described to the Rubislaw toll bar, thence northward and eastward to the point at which the boundary of the seventh ward touches the dam of Gilcomston, thence along the boundary of the said seventh ward to Union Street aforesaid.
