Letters and packets of any weight being prepaid, may now be forwarded by Post, but must not exceed Two Feet in length or breadth.

Printed votes and proceedings in Parliament, or of the Colonial Legislatures, are charged—

Such votes and proceedings, whether paid or unpaid, pass at these rates between places in the United Kingdom, and also to the Colonies by Packet. To those places to which there are no Packets, they may be forwarded by “Private Ship,” at double the above rates. They are not, however, forwarded to the East Indies, *viâ* Southampton, nor to places through France, under the full rates of letter postage.

Members of each House of Parliament are allowed to receive by the post, petitions and addresses to her Majesty, and petitions addressed to either House of Parliament, *not exceeding thirty-two ounces in weight, exempt from postage, provided such petitions and addresses be sent without covers, or in covers open at the sides.* Should they exceed that weight, they will not require to be prepaid, but are charged according to their weight as unpaid letters, with double the rates of postage to which, if prepaid, they would be subject.

All Letters addressed to the United States, and not directed to be otherwise sent, will be transmitted by the First Packet, whether British or United States, which is despatched after they are posted; but Letters specially directed "by British Packet," "by United States Packet," or by any particular Vessel named, will be forwarded in accordance with the desire thus expressed by the writers.

The British Mail Packets on the New York Line will proceed direct from Liverpool to New York and from New York to Liverpool, without calling at Halifax. Letters and Newspapers, however, for Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island, may still be forwarded in closed Mails by these Packets, if specially addressed "via New York," or "via the United States;" but Letters and Newspapers not so addressed will be sent in the regular Mails to Halifax by the Packets proceeding from Liverpool via Halifax to Boston.

The United States Mail Packets, as well as the British Packets, will convey closed Mails for Canada, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island, and Letters and Newspapers will be forwarded in such closed Mails if specially addressed "via New York," or "via the United States." Letters for Canada, however, must, in addition, bear the words "By United States Packet."

The Postage upon Letters and Newspapers is precisely the same whether they are conveyed by British or United States Packets.

Letters, &c., for Bermuda and Newfoundland will be forwarded by the Packets proceeding to Boston; the Mails for Bermuda will be despatched from Halifax immediately after the arrival of the Packet at that Port, and those for Newfoundland will be despatched on the arrival at Halifax of the Homeward Packet from Boston.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Since January, 1841, a system of registration has been in operation, applicable to all descriptions of letters.

Letters intended for registration must be paid in stamps, and presented at the Post-Office at least 30 minutes before the closing of the letter-box for the particular mail by which it is to be dispatched. The registration fee is Gd., and must be prepaid.

In the case of Foreign, Colonial, or Ship letters, registration extends to the port of despatch in the United Kingdom only.

Letters *addressed to France*, may be registered to their destination; and those *passing through France*, so long as they may remain in the French territory—the former on payment of double the French rate to place of destination, in addition to the British rate and British registration fee—and the latter on payment of the usual postage rate, and registration fee. The arrangements for carrying out the system of registration have been made with a view of insuring the punctual delivery of registered letters; on their delivery, the parties to whom they may have been addressed will be required to sign a receipt.

MONEY ORDER DEPARTMENT.

The Money Order Office, for granting and cashing Money Orders, is open from 9, A.M., till 6, P.M., every lawful day.

The commission for money orders being, for sums not exceeding £2, three-pence; for sums exceeding £2, and not exceeding £5, sixpence. No order can be granted for sums beyond £5.

The Fifteenth Annual Meeting of this Corporation was held within their House in Aberdeen, on Friday, the 13th June, 1851—

JOHN CRUICKSHANK, Esq., LL.D., Professor of Mathematics in Marischal College and University, (Chairman of the Company), in the Chair—

THE Common Seal of the Company having been affixed, in terms of the Statute, to "the Registry of Shareholders," the Manager read the Report of the Directors, which commenced by stating that, on the present occasion, besides their usual Report on the Company's transactions for the year, they had to submit to their Constituents the result of the Second Investigation into the state of the Life business, appointed by the Act of Incorporation to be made at the Balance of the Books, on 30th April last.

It appeared from the Report, that, during the past year, a large business had been done in the various departments, and in particular:—

I.—That in the **Fire Department** the Annual Revenue from Premiums amounted to about £10,000, being an increase of upwards of £600 over that of last year, while the Losses by Fire had been considerably less than formerly.

II.—That 334 new **Life Policies** had been issued—yielding a large addition to the Annual Revenue—and that 42 Proposals had been declined, or accepted but not carried out.

III.—That the Annual Revenue of the Company, from all sources, was now about £45,000, and the Invested Funds £160,000.

After recommending that the usual Dividend of Six per Cent. free of Income Tax, should be paid from the Fire Department to the Shareholders,—that the Non-Participation Life Funds should be still allowed to accumulate—that, under such limitations as might be deemed proper by the Directors, the Life Policies of the Company should be declared indisputable—and that the restriction in the Contract, as to the number of Shares to be held by any one Partner should be removed—the Report referred to the Investigation which had been made into the state of the Company's business, showing:—

I.—The amount of the Company's Liabilities and Assets, as at 30th April, 1851, estimated by a Special Committee.

II.—A comparative view of the state of the business at the First and Second Investigations—the one embracing a period of Ten, the other of Five Years—from which it appeared that the business and funds had increased in a much greater ratio during the last Five Years than during the previous Ten Years.

III.—The manner in which the Investigation had been conducted, which was noticed in the following terms, viz.:—

“ Soon after the last Annual Meeting, your Directors remitted to Mr. H. A. SMITH, Fellow of the Institute of Actuaries of Great Britain and Ireland, the Actuary and Secretary of the Company, ‘to make the necessary valuations of the Office Life Business, preparatory to the Periodical Investigation appointed by the Act of Incorporation, to be made on 30th April, 1851;’ and these valuations have been accordingly, upon the same principle as was followed at last Investigation, viz. :—not by any approximate method, *but by a most minute valuation of every Policy upon the Books*, the usual Mortality Table adopted by the Office being used throughout, and the Additions to the Nett Premiums for Expense of Management, &c., being in every case deducted, thus not anticipating, in the smallest degree, any profit likely to accrue from that source, and thereby affording to the Partners and Policy-holders the best guarantee for the stability of the Institution.

“ In regard to the **Participation Scheme** of the Company, your Directors have much pleasure in reporting that its favourable state enables them to recommend the declaration of a Liberal and an **Increased Bonus** on all Policies on that Scheme, opened on or before 30th April last. In determining the amount of this Bonus, your Directors have adhered to the method followed at the Investigation in 1846, and, consequently, all Policies current on 30th April, will have allotted to them a Bonus proportioned to the Sums Assured, and to the term of years during which they have been in force; the amounts in Policies current at 30th April, 1846, being increased by the Bonus declared thereon at that time. After making ample allowance for contingencies, your Directors find themselves in a position to propose resolutions making **Vested Additions** for the quinquennial period, on all Policies current on 30th April last, at the rate of **One Pound Seven Shillings and Sixpence per Cent. per Annum** upon the Sums in these Policies, and also contingent **Prospective Additions** at the same rate per Annum on such of them as may become claims after payment of the Premium in any year of the period ending 30th April, 1856, when the next Investigation will be made.

“ The effect of these additions is exhibited in the following Tables, and the results shown by them cannot fail to be highly satisfactory to the Policy-holders. The additions, which range from **68 to 26 per Cent.** on the Premiums paid, and from **20 $\frac{1}{5}$ to 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ per Cent.** on the amounts assured, will be found to contrast favourably with those declared by any other similar Institution, and they **Vest immediately**, and are payable whenever the Policy becomes a claim, however short time the Assurance may have been in force :—

The Report then concluded as follows :—

“ In conclusion, your Directors would repeat the opinion expressed in their Report on last Investigation—that without taking too sanguine a view of the Company's affairs, the business actually on the Books is sufficient to secure to the Shareholders, as heretofore, a liberal return on their invested Capital, and to the Participation Policy-holders an ample Bonus at each Periodical Investigation.

“ It is obviously the interest of every one connected with the Institution, to use all legitimate means to promote the extension of its business, and to the Shareholders and Policy-holders your Directors would take the present opportunity of appealing for their aid and co-operation, in bringing its claims for support before their friends and acquaintances as often as they have opportunity.

(Signed) “ JOHN CRUICKSHANK, *Chairman.*”

After the reading of the Report, the Chairman said—

The Report which you have just heard shows that the business of our Company continues steadily to increase; and I trust you will see reason to be satisfied with its progress. I believe you will find that few Provincial Companies have obtained a greater share of public patronage within a similar period. During the last financial year, we added £625 to the amount of Annual Premiums in the Fire department, and we issued 334 New Life Policies, although we declined 42 of the Proposals made to us.

The Second Periodical Investigation into the affairs of the Company has been spoken of in the Report, as giving, in our opinion, very satisfactory results. It has been a work of no small labour, and has been executed by Mr. SMITH, our Secretary and Actuary, a gentleman well known to the best judges as eminently qualified for the task.

In the Participation Branch, the proposed Bonus of £1 7s. 6d. per Cent. per Annum, for the last Five years, on the Sums assured, and on the Bonus additions made to them Five years ago, with a like Prospective Bonus on all Policies current on the 30th April last, which may become claims before the 30th April, 1856, will, we trust, satisfy the Participation Policy-holders that we have not been slack in our exertions to compensate them for paying Premiums at a higher rate than those on the Non-Participation Scheme. At the same time, we would request them to observe, that the Premiums they pay are considerably lower than those which are charged by several Companies which give the encouragement of Bonus additions.

The balance at the credit of this department would have enabled us to give a somewhat higher Bonus, but we think it desirable to retain a margin to protect us against such fluctuations, in the rate of mortality, as Companies of our comparatively short standing are still liable to, and to secure that gradual advance in prosperity which is so encouraging when realized, and, therefore, so desirable.

On the same grounds, after mature deliberation, your Directors have not deemed it desirable to draw upon the Non-Participation Life Funds at present for any additional Dividend to Shareholders, but to allow these funds to accumulate in the meantime. The Dividend is, therefore, again proposed to be £6 3s. 6d. per Cent, or £6 free of Income Tax, out of the profits in the Fire Department.

Dr. Cruickshank then referred to proposals in the Report for declaring the Life Policies indisputable, and for the removal of the restriction in the Contract, as to the number of Shares to be held by any one Partner—and proceeded as follows:—

On occasions like the present, I feel called upon to make a few general remarks on the subject of Life Assurance, though at the risk of merely repeating in substance what has often been said already by others, and perhaps by myself.

For sometime after the first formation of Assurance Companies, the principles necessary to guide their procedure were ill understood, and the arrangements for proportioning the contributions to the ages and circumstances of the contributors, were extremely imperfect. Now, however, those principles have been carefully investigated by many of the most eminent men of science; and, although the schemes of different Companies vary to some extent, they are all fitted to promote, more or less, the benefit both of the Shareholders and of the Public. Every individual, indeed, who assures his life, cannot hope to secure to his heirs the full produce of his contributions. It is evident that this cannot happen in the case of one whose life is prolonged beyond the average span. But for this prolongation, such a one will no doubt be thankful to the great Preserver of men;—his enjoyment of it will most likely not be disturbed by great anxiety about the worldly interests of those near relatives whom he expects to survive him; and he will have the satisfaction of knowing that his payments are increasing the comforts of many widows and fatherless children of those to whom fewer than the average number of years have been granted. A man who assures his life, knows not but that his heirs may be great gainers at the expense of others, and therefore it ought to give him pleasure rather than pain to think that the heirs of others may profit by his contributions.

The great increase of business now done by Assurance Companies, is owing to an increased knowledge of the advantages to be derived from them; yet much remains to be accomplished to diffuse this knowledge more widely, and to render it

more influential. Though our countrymen are noted for prudence and forethought, generally speaking, they have shown less of these qualities in regard to Life Assurance than might have been expected. How many instances may we see around us, of widows, and children, and other relatives of deceased individuals being left in straitened circumstances, which might have been greatly alleviated by a moderate degree of economy and prudence in their natural protectors! How many men in the middle ranks of society enjoy such incomes as would, with a little self-denial, enable them to provide against a contingency which may sadly affect their dependents! How many young men in the prime of life, and vigour of health and strength, are earning, by the labour of their hands, liberal wages which are too often wholly and needlessly spent, but which would enable them to insure Annuities for old age, or sums payable at the age at which bodily strength may be expected to fail, or at which a young family is likely to be most burdensome; yet how few of either of these classes have recourse to this expedient! Perhaps not one in ten of the former class, and not one in five hundred of the latter. Independent of the uncertainty of human life's duration, the method of Life Assurance has one great advantage over that of attempting to accumulate small annual savings. He who has assured his life, ceases to consider the Annual Premium as part of an income at his disposal. He regards it as beyond his reach, and endeavours to accommodate his expenditure to the remainder; while he who attempts to accumulate small annual savings, is often at a loss for investments sufficiently productive and secure; and, by temporary difficulties which might be otherwise overcome, or by fancied wants, he is sometimes induced to withhold the annual addition, or even to encroach upon the stock. When we take into account the uncertainty of human life, the contrast between these two methods of providing for the future, becomes far more striking. These considerations are deeply interesting to us, and to the public. It is, therefore, extremely desirable that we should all do what we can to lead others to view them in the same light.

I have only again to congratulate you on the state and prospects of our Institution, and to move the Resolutions.

Those referring to the Bonus on the Participation Policies, are as follow:—

I—That on current **Participation Policies** for Assurances effected on or before 30th April, 1846, and which obtained **Vested Additions** at that time, there shall, for the quinquennial period ended 30th April, 1851, be **farther Vested Additions** at the rate of **One Pound Seven Shillings and Sixpence** per Cent. per Annum, on the Sums contained therein; and, also, if said former Vested Additions have not been commuted or surrendered, **One Pound Seven Shillings and Sixpence** per Cent. per Annum on the same.

II.—That on current **Participation Policies** for Assurances effected after 30th April, **1846**, and on or before 30th April, **1851**, there shall be **Vested Additions** of **One Pound Seven Shillings** and **Sixpence** per Cent. per Annum on the Sums contained therein.

III.—That, *over and above* the said **Vested Additions**, there shall be **Contingent Prospective Additions**, at the same rate per Cent. per Annum on such of these Policies as may become claims (after payment has been made of the renewal premium) in any of the Five years ending 30th April, **1856**.

Baillie Williamson said—

That after the very satisfactory Report which had been read, and the able address by the Chairman, it would be unnecessary for him to take up the time of the Meeting by any remarks, and he would content himself with simply seconding the adoption of the Resolutions, which he did with much pleasure.

The Resolutions having been put to the Meeting, were unanimously approved of, and a cordial vote of thanks having, on the motion of Provost Blaikie, been passed to Dr. Cruickshank, for his conduct in the chair, and for the warm interest he takes in the affairs of the Company, the proceedings terminated.

LIFE ASSURANCE.

THE AMOUNT OF ANNUAL EXPENDITURE required by most Offices for a Life Assurance deters many from adopting that mode of providing for those dependent on them. They would more readily make such a provision, could it be shown that an Assurance may be effected on such a system as to require *after a few years*—when, in all probability, their other expenses will be increased—the payment of a comparatively small sum, scarcely more than *one-half* of the amount usually necessary.

THE LIFE ASSOCIATION OF SCOTLAND,

(Founded 1839, and Incorporated by Royal Charter,)

Secures this desirable result by the mode in which its *Surplus Funds* are divided.

ON THE 5TH APRIL, *in every year*, the precise state of the affairs is ascertained by a detailed valuation.
