## STAMP DUTIES.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT, OR ORDER, after the 10th October, 1853, for the payment of any sum of money to the bearer, or to order on demand, 1d. And the following instruments shall be deemed and taken to be drafts or orders for the payments of money within the intent and meaning of this Act, and of any Act or Acts relating to the stamp duties on bills of exchange, drafts or orders, and shall be chargeable accordingly with the stamp duties imposed by this Act or any such Act or Acts, viz:—All documents or writings usually termed letters of credit, or whereby any person to whom any such document or writing is or is intended to be delivered or sent, shall be entitled or be intended to be entitled to have credit with or in account with or to draw upon any other person for or to receive from such other person any sum of money therein mentioned.

EXEMPTIONS.—Any draft or order drawn by any banker upon any other banker, not payable to bearer, or to order, and used solely for the purpose of settling or clearing any account between said bankers. Any letter written by a banker to any other banker, directing the payment of any sum of money, the same not being payable to bearer or to order, and such letter not being sent or delivered to the person to whom payment is to be made, or to any person on his behalf.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT, OR ORDER for the payment of any sum of money, though not made payable to the bearer or to order, if the same shall be delivered to the payee, or some person on his or her behalf the same duty as on a Bill of Exchange for the like sum payable to bearer or to order.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT, OR ORDER for the payment of any sum of money weekly, monthly, or at any other stated periods, if made payable to the bearer, or to order, or if delivered to the payee, or to some person on his or her behalf, where the total amount of the money thereby made payable shall be specified therein, or can be ascertained therefrom, or shall be indefinite, the same duty as on a bill payable to bearer or order on demand.

PROMISSORY NOTE for the payment of any sum of money by instalments, or for the payment of several sums of money at different days or times, so that the whole of the money to be paid shall be definite and certain, the same duty as on a promissory note, payable otherwise than to the bearer on demand, for a sum equal to the whole amount of the money to be paid.

N.B.—The duties on Foreign Bills, drawn out of the United Kingdom are to be denoted by adhesive stamps. The amount of duty on adhesive stamps is impressed in two parts. The Board of Inland Revenue recommend that the cancellation should be one of the parts and the other left legible.

If a Foreign Bill payable abroad, and as to which the provision “drawn in sets of three or more” apply, should be drawn in a single bill, the duty will be the same as on an Inland Bill, and if in a set of two, the duty on each will be the same as on an Inland Bill. This is in accordance with the opinion of the Board of Inland Revenue. But the Board have given an opinion that a Foreign Bill drawn abroad and payable in this country in duplicate or triplicate only represents one transaction, and is liable to the duty on one Inland Bill of the same amount—this is, if one of the parts have the full duty, the others may be unstamped—the Schedule of the Act does not provide for such a bill being drawn in sets. Bills bearing to be drawn out of the United Kingdom are to be deemed Foreign Bills so drawn, although they may in reality be drawn in the United Kingdom, 17 and 18 Vic., c. 83 § 4. A person in the United Kingdom drawing and issuing a bill payable out of the United Kingdom in a set must draw the whole set, and a person transferring or negotiating such a bill, must transfer and deliver, stamped, the whole number of the set. Penalty, £100. A person taking such a bill must get the whole stamped, or otherwise he cannot recover on it or make it available—ib. § 6. This applies only to bills drawn within and payable out of the United Kingdom.

## RATES OF POSTAGE & CONDITIONS OF TRANSMISSION.

### *Inland Letters.*

The rate of Postage on all inland letters is regulated by weight, irrespective of distance, and with the exceptions afterwards mentioned, is as follows:—

#### *If paid in advance.*

Letter weighing not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.*	1d.
" " more than $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. but not exceeding 1 oz.	2d.
" " more than 1 oz.	3d.
" " more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz.	4d.
" " more than 2 oz.	5d.
" " more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz.	6d.

and so on; one penny being charged for every additional half-ounce.

### *Unpaid Letters.*

As a general rule, the postage, if not paid in advance, is double the foregoing: and if the payment in advance be insufficient, double the deficiency is charged. An inland letter, for example, weighing more than half an ounce, and not exceeding one ounce, if bearing a penny stamp only, is, on delivery, charged twopence. The unpaid *additional* postage on re-directed letters, however, is not doubled, being the same as if such postage were prepaid.

\* If the weight be exceeded to the smallest extent, even though the balance be merely turned, the letter becomes liable to higher postage. The same rule applies to letters going abroad. To provide, therefore, for errors in scales, &c., it is well to allow a little margin, or to pay the postage of the next greater weight.

*Newspapers and other Periodical Publications bearing the Newspaper Stamp.*

Although provision is made for forwarding newspapers, books, and money through the post, it is not compulsory on any one to employ this mode of transmission; everything, except letters, may be sent in any other way.

All periodical publications, including newspapers published in the United Kingdom at intervals not exceeding 31 days, and which bear an impressed stamp or stamps denoting the stamp duty (of the kind formerly confined chiefly to newspapers) may be transmitted and re-transmitted through the post within the United Kingdom, free of postage, if posted within 15 days from the date of issue.

### INLAND PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

In consequence of the difficulty which has been experienced in deciding what is and what is not of intrinsic value, it has been deemed expedient to rescind the prohibition against the transmission of articles of intrinsic value by the Inland Pattern and Sample Post, and the Regulations are now as follows:—

1. Rates of Postage:—

For a Packet of Patterns or Samples—

Not exceeding 4 oz. in weight,	-	-	-	-	-	1d

2. The postage must be prepaid by means of postage stamps.
3. No packet of patterns or samples must exceed 12 oz. in weight. Any packet exceeding that weight will be sent to the Returned Letter Branch.
4. There must be no writing or printing on the packet or its cover in addition to the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, except the address of the sender, a trade mark and numbers, and the prices of the articles; otherwise the packet will be treated as a letter.
5. There must be no enclosure other than the samples themselves. The particulars which are allowed to be furnished under the preceding rule must in all cases be given, not on loose pieces of paper, but on small labels attached to the samples or to the bags containing them. Any loose enclosure will be taken out and forwarded to the address on the packet, charged with full postage as an unpaid letter, together with an additional rate of a penny.
6. The patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, of



- seeds, &c., may be enclosed in boxes, or in bags of linen or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; bags so closed that they cannot be readily opened, even although they be transparent, must not be used for this purpose. If this rule be infringed, the packet will be treated as a letter.
7. If a packet of patterns or samples be posted altogether unpaid it will be charged with double the postage which should have been prepaid. If a portion of the postage be prepaid, even although only a penny stamp be affixed, the packet will be charged with the amount of the deficiency, together with an additional rate of a penny.
  8. In order to prevent any interruption to the regular transmission of letters, a packet of patterns or samples may, when it is necessary, be kept back by any Head Postmaster for 24 hours beyond the time when, in the ordinary course, it would be forwarded.
  9. The rule which forbids the transmission through the post of any article which might injure the contents of the mail bags, or the Officers of the Post Office, is so far relaxed as to permit the transmission of scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like, as samples, provided that they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags and the Officers of the Post Office, while at the same time the samples may be easily examined. If any packet containing such articles as these be posted, which is found not to be sufficiently guarded, it will be stopped, and a notice of its detention sent to the person to whom it is addressed, or to the sender, who may then obtain it on personal application; but the packet will be charged with a fine equal in amount to the postage to which the packet was liable as a packet of patterns.
  10. Information as to the best modes of packing the articles named in the preceding clause may be obtained in the Secretary's Office, General Post Office, London, between the hours of 10 and 4 o'clock, or on Saturdays between 10 and 1 o'clock, and specimens may be seen.
  11. The preceding regulations do not affect the transmission of patterns or samples beyond the United Kingdom.

### INLAND BOOK POST.

*The following are the regulations of the Inland Book Post:—*

#### 1st. Rates of Postage:

and so on, 1d being charged for every additional quarter of a pound, or fraction of a quarter of a pound.

- 2d. The postage must be prepaid, to the extent of one rate at least, by means of postage stamps affixed outside the packet or its cover; and if the whole postage be not thus prepaid the packet is treated in the manner described in section 9.
- 3d. Every packet must be sent either without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends or sides; so as to admit of the enclosures being removed for examination. For the greater security of its contents the packet may be tied at the ends with string, but in such cases the Postmaster is authorised to cut the string, although he is required to refasten the packet.
- 4th. A book-packet may contain any number of separate books or other publications (including printed letters or printed matter of every kind), photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, prints or maps, and any quantity of paper, parchment or vellum. And the books or other publications, prints, maps, &c., may be either printed, written, or plain, or any mixture of the three. Further, all legitimate binding, mounting, or covering of a book, &c., or of a portion thereof, will be allowed, whether such binding, &c., be loose, or attached; as also rollers in the case of prints or maps; markers (whether of paper or otherwise), in books; and in short, whatever is necessary for the safe transmission of literary matter, prints, or maps, or usually appertains thereto; but no patterns or books of patterns (unless these consists merely of paper) can be allowed.
- 5th. No book packet may contain anything which is sealed or otherwise closed against inspection; nor must there be any letter, nor any communication of the nature of a letter, whether separate or otherwise, unless the whole of such letter, or communication be printed. Entries, however, merely stating who sends the book, &c., or to whom it is given, are not regarded as a letter. Indeed, as respects the name and address of the sender, not only is the writing permitted, but recommended; so that if the cover come off, or from any other reason the packet cannot be forwarded, it may be returned.
- 6th. No book must exceed two feet in length, or one foot in width or depth; and if any such packet be presented at a Post Office it will not be received.
- 7th. Any packet which shall not be open at the ends or sides, or shall have any written letter, or any communication of the nature of a letter written in it, or upon its cover, will be charged the "unpaid" letter postage.
- 8th. If a packet be found to contain any written letter, whether closed or open, or any enclosure, sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or any other unauthorised enclosure, the letter or enclosure will be taken out and forwarded to the ad-

dress on the packet, charged with the full postage as an unpaid letter, together with an additional rate; and the remainder of the packet, if duly prepaid with stamps, will then be forwarded to its address.

9th. If a packet be not sufficiently prepaid with stamps, but nevertheless bear a stamp of the value of one rate, it is forwarded, charged with the deficient book-postage, together with an additional rate; but any packet which bears no postage stamp is charged with double the book-postage.

10th. In every case in which the postage chargeable under these regulations is greater than the letter rate, the letter-postage is substituted.

## POSTAGE STAMPS.

Every Postmaster is required to have on hand a sufficient stock of postage labels and embossed penny envelopes, and to sell them to the public at the following prices:—

Postage stamps are bought at this office, if in strips of at least two at a discount of two and a-half per cent.

Two kinds of embossed envelopes are now issued; one with a thread passing through the stamp, and the other without any thread, but made with thicker and better paper.

No coloured paper can be received for stamping, or any paper which is too thin to bear the impression of the dies.

Envelopes provided by the Office of Inland Revenue, with the proper stamps thereon, will be substituted for any which may be spoilt in the operation of stamping.

A license to sell postage stamps can be obtained, free of expense, by any respectable person on application to the office of the Inland Revenue.

## REGISTRATION.

By the payment of a fee of fourpence, any letter, newspaper, book, or other packet on which the postage has been prepaid in stamps, may be registered to any place within the United Kingdom. Book packets and newspapers can also be registered to the Colonies. To foreign countries *letters only* can be registered. The registration of a packet makes its transmission more secure, by rendering it practicable to trace it, when inland, from its receipt to its delivery, and when foreign, at least to the port of despatch. The Post Office does not guarantee the safe delivery of the letter, &c., though any officer who may neglect his duty on this point will be called to strict account, and if the Postmaster-General think fit, will be required to make good any loss that may be sustained.

The postage and registration fee of registered letters must be prepaid; and if the letters be inland, such payments must be by stamps.

Every letter to be registered should be presented at the bar of the Post Office, and a receipt obtained for it, and must on no account be dropped into the letter-box. If, contrary to this rule, a letter marked "Registered" be dropped into the letter-box, it will, *if directed to any place in the United Kingdom*, be liable to a registration fee of eight-pence instead of the ordinary fee of fourpence. No Letter Carrier or Rural Messenger is required to take letters from the Public to have them registered.

Letters containing coin should not, *under any circumstances*, be dropped into the letter-box, but handed in at the bar of the Post-Office to be registered. In the event of letters being posted containing coin, they are treated as registered letters, and charged with double registration fee.

Prepayment of inland letters, &c., must be by labels or embossed stamps,\* except at the Chief Post Office, London, where prepayment of such letters from 10 a.m. till 5 p.m., is permitted in money, provided the amount be not less than £1. Letters also to the colonies and foreign countries may be prepaid in money. Except in the case of letters posted in Malta, Gibraltar, Constantinople, Alexandria, Cairo, Suez, Buenos Ayres, Lagos, and Fernando Po, and those sent by officers and seamen serving on board her Majesty's ships, British postage stamps are not available for the payment of letters, &c., *coming into this country*.

By using embossed envelopes all risk of the stamp being detached may be avoided; but when labels are used these should be examined to see if they firmly adhere, since, if they fall off, the letters, &c., will be charged postage; which in the case of inland letters, is double the prepaid rate to some places abroad, also, double the pre-

\* Payment in labels must always be made by affixing outside the letter, &c., before it is posted, a number of labels equal in value to the amount of postage.

paid rate is chargeable in such cases ; and in other instances the letters, &c., are liable to be detained for the deficient postage. The labels should be placed on the front of the letter, and upon the upper corner of the right hand side.

Arrangements have been made by which paper and envelopes taken by the public to the office of Inland Revenue, Somerset House, can be embossed with stamps equal to any rate of postage (including a threepenny stamp), under the following regulations :

- 1st. When the stamps required do not amount to £10 worth, one shilling is charged, in addition to the postage stamps, for each distinct size of paper.
- 2nd. When the stamps amount to £10 worth, no fee is charged, provided not more than one size of paper be sent.
- 3rd. When the stamps amount to £20, no fee is charged, provided not more than two sizes of paper be sent.
- 4th. When the stamps amount to £30, no fee is charged, provided not more than three sizes of paper be sent.
- 5th. When the stamps amount to £40, no fee is charged, provided four sizes of paper only be sent ; and no more than four sizes can be received on a single Warrant\*
- 6th. No *folded* envelopes can be stamped ; and therefore, papers, whether intended for envelopes or letters, must be sent unfolded, and without being creased.

---

### MONEY ORDERS.

The public are recommended when applying for Money Orders to use printed "Application Forms," which saves time, and afford greater security, than verbal messages, against mistakes. These Forms are supplied gratuitously at all Money Order Offices.

The Commission on an Inland Money Order or on orders to Belgium and Switzerland not exceeding £2, is threepence ; above £2 and not exceeding £5, sixpence ; above £5 and not exceeding £7, ninepence ; above £7 and not exceeding £10, one shilling ; above which amount no single order can be granted, but as many £10 Orders may be granted as are desirable. The commission on Money Order to British Guiana, Canada, Cape of Good Hope, Honduras, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, New South Wales, New Zealand, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Queensland, South Australia, Victoria, West Coast of Africa, West Indies, Western Australia, is fourfold the above sums, and on Money Orders payable at Malta or Gibraltar threefold.

\* The warrants (or requisition forms) used in applying for paper to be stamped are obtainable on application at the office of Inland Revenue, Somerset House, London, W.C.



No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

With the subjoined exceptions, no Money Order can be Issued unless the applicant furnish, in full, the surname, and, at least the initial of one Christian name, both of the remitter (the person who sends the order) and the payee (the person to whom the money is to be paid), together with the remitter's address:—

- 1st. If the remitter or payee be a peer or a bishop, his ordinary title is sufficient; and if a firm, the usual designation of such firm will suffice (the term "Messrs." however, is not sufficient, except a company trading under a title which does not consist of the names of the persons composing it, as the "Carron Company;" to which kind of company the above privilege does not extend.
- 2d. Money Orders for transmission by the Public to the Privy Council Office will be issued payable to the "Privy Council Office," the name of the payee not being required in these cases.
- 3d. When the remitter notifies in writing that the order is to be paid through a bank, it is left to his option to give or withhold the name of the payee; and he may, if he wish it, substitute for the name of the payee, any other designation or any modification of the name, as, for example:—"The Cashier of the Bank of England,"—"The Chief Clerk of the Foreign Office,"—"The Publisher of *The Times*,"—"Messrs Longman & Co."

When an application is made for a Money Order payable in London, or at any other town where there is more than one Money Order Office, the remitter should say at which of such offices he wishes it to be paid, otherwise the order can be cashed at the Head Office alone. It is not incumbent on a Postmaster to supply such information relative to local or provincial offices, but the nearest Money Order Office to any street in London may be ascertained by referring to the Street List published in the Post Office Regulations.

An order once issued cannot be cancelled; and should repayment or transfer to a different office, or alteration of name be required, the remitter must apply to the issuing or paying Postmaster according to the directions printed on the back of the Order.

The remitter of an order may make that order payable ten days after date, provided he sign the requisition "C," printed on the back of that order, to defer payment until ten days after date, and affix a penny receipt stamp thereto.

When an order is presented for payment (otherwise than through a bank) the Postmaster has first to see that the signature of the payee be as full as the name given in the advice, and be not in any way inconsistent therewith. He has then to call on the applicant to give the name of the remitter, and if the reply be correct, the



order will be paid, unless the Postmaster have good reason for believing that the applicant for payment is neither the rightful claimant, nor deputed by him. When an order is payable through a bank it is sufficient that it be receipted (without regard to any discrepancy between the signature and the name in the advice, or to whether the receipt is given by the payee himself or by another person); and that it be presented (crossed with the name of the receiving bank), by some person known to be in the employment of the bank.

The holder of a Money Order is always at liberty to direct, by crossing it, that the order be paid through a bank, even though its payment was not originally so restricted, that when the order is thus crossed, the question put on the presentation of an ordinary Money Order is dispensed with.

1. The Postmaster-General is empowered, under the Act 27 & 28 Victoriae, cap. 43, to insure the lives of persons of either sex, between the ages of 16 and 60, for not less than £20 or more than £100. He is also empowered, under the same Act, to grant Immediate or Deferred Annuities, of not more than £50, on the lives of persons of either sex, and of the age of ten years and upwards. The persons whose lives are insured, or to whom Annuities are granted by the Postmaster-General, have direct Government security for the payment of the money at the proper time.

2. Certain Post Offices (the names of which may be obtained at any Post Office) have been opened for the receipt of proposals for the Insurance of Lives and the purchase of Annuities; and forms of proposal, with full instructions for filling up and delivering these forms, may be obtained at these Post Offices.

3. Tables of the premiums to be charged for the Insurance of Lives; for the grant of Immediate Annuities; for the grant of Deferred Annuities or Deferred Monthly Allowances, without return of purchase money, and for the grant of Deferred Annuities or Deferred Monthly Allowances, with return of purchase money, have

been printed, and may be seen at the Post Offices which have been opened for the receipt of proposals. These Tables may also be obtained of Messrs Eyre and Spottiswoode, London. The price of the Tables for the insurance of Lives and the grant of Annuities without return of purchase money is 3½d. The price of the Tables for the grant of Annuities with return of purchase money is 2d. If sent by post, 8d is charged in the one case, and 3d in the other.

4. The Premiums to be charged for the Insurance of Lives vary with the ages of the persons whose lives are to be insured, and with the mode in which they are to be paid.

Smaller sums may be insured by proportionate payments, but no one of the periodical payments must be of less amount than two shillings.

5. No one life can be insured for less than £20 in the whole; but when a life has been insured for £20, further insurances may be effected on the same life from time to time, for any amount, until the whole sum for which it is insured amounts to £100.

6. If, after having duly made his payments for a period of five years, the insured person shall be unable to continue, or shall desire to discontinue such payments, a portion of the premiums paid by him, which portion will in no case be less than one-third of the whole sum paid by him, will be returned to him.

7. The sums to be charged for the purchase of Immediate Annuities will vary with the age and sex of the person on whose life the Annuity is to depend :—

The sums to be charged for the purchase of Deferred Annuities, or Deferred Monthly Allowances, will vary with the age and sex of the person on whose life the Annuity or Monthly Allowance is to depend; and with the length of the term for which the Annuity is deferred (or, in other words, with the number of years which are to pass before the commencement of the Annuity), and with the conditions of the contract as to the mode of purchase, mode of payment, and return or non-return of purchase money.

When the condition of the contract is to be that, in the event of the person on whose life the Annuity or Allowance is to depend dies before the commencement of Annuity or Allowance, the purchase money is to be returned to his representatives, and that if the purchaser at any time before the commencement of the Annuity or Allowance is unable to continue, or wishes to discontinue the purchase, the purchase money shall be returned to him; the price charged will be higher than when no such condition is made.

9. The Annuity or Monthly Allowance granted on any one life must not exceed £50 per annum, or £4 3s 4d per month; but purchasers need not purchase the whole amount of such Annuity or Allowance at one time. They may begin by purchasing such part as they can afford to purchase, and go on increasing their purchases from time to time as their circumstances will permit.

10. Husband and Wife may each be insured to the full amount of £100, and may each purchase an Annuity of £50, or a Monthly Allowance of £4 3s 4d. Any two persons may purchase an Annuity on their joint lives, with or without continuance of the Annuity to the survivor.

11. Persons contracting for the insurance of their Lives, or for the purchase of Annuities or Monthly Allowances, will be allowed to pay their periodical premiums or instalments of purchase money at such of the Post Offices, which have been or may hereafter be opened for the purpose, as will suit them best.

12. Persons proposing to effect Insurances on their Lives, or to purchase Deferred Monthly Allowances, must provide at their own cost such certificates of their birth or baptism, or other evidence of age, as shall be required of them, but will not be required to pay any fee for medical examination, or to pay the cost of any inquiry which the Postmaster-General may think fit to make with regard to their health, habits, age, and occupation, or to pay any fee for the issue of any contracts which may be made in accordance with their proposals, or to pay any postage for the transmission of their proposals, or for the transmission of any correspondence arising out of such proposals between them and the Postmaster-General, in as much as a provision for all such costs and

charges is included in the premiums which they will be required to pay, in accordance with the Tables framed for the purpose, for the Insurance of their Lives or the purchase of Deferred Monthly Allowances.

Persons proposing to purchase Immediate or Deferred Annuities, payable half-yearly, must provide at their own cost such certificates of birth or baptism, or other evidence of age, as shall be required of them; and, inasmuch as the premiums fixed by the Tables framed for the grant of such Annuities do not include any provision for costs and charges, must pay, at the time of purchase, a fee of 1s. for every £1 of Annuity purchased.

#### PRINCIPAL RULES OF THE POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

A. Post Office Savings Banks are established at all Money Order Offices in the United Kingdom, and are open for the receipt and payment of money daily during the hours appointed for Money Order business.

At these banks deposits of one Shilling, or any number of Shillings will be received; but no one may deposit more than £30 in one year, or more than £150 in the whole, exclusive of interest.

Interest at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum (which is at the rate of Sixpence in the Pound for each year, or at the rate of One-Halfpenny on each complete Pound for each month, reckoning from the first day of the Calendar month next following the day on which a complete Pound has been Deposited, up to the last day of the Calendar month preceding the day on which the money is withdrawn) is allowed until the Sum due to a Depositor amounts to £200, when interest ceases to be allowed. The interest due to each Depositor is added to the principal due to him on 31st December in each year.

B. Every deposit in a Post Office Savings Bank must be immediately entered by the Postmaster, or other person receiving it, in a book, which book is to be kept by the Depositor, and the Postmaster or other person receiving the deposit should affix his signature and the stamp of his office to each entry. Depositors should carefully examine their books before leaving the offices at which they make their deposits, and ascertain that they have obtained correct receipts for the sums deposited by them.

In addition to the receipts which the depositors will thus obtain in their deposit books, they will receive for each deposit an acknowledgment by post from the Savings Bank Department in London. This acknowledgment should reach the depositor within three days from the day on which he makes his deposit, if the deposit be

made in England or Wales. If the deposit be made in Ireland or Scotland the acknowledgment should reach the depositor within five days. The acknowledgment should be quite free from erasure, and should state the exact amount of the deposit, and the day on which the deposit was made. If the acknowledgment does not reach the depositor in proper time, or if, when it reaches him, it shows any signs of erasure, or does not agree with the entry in the depositor's book, the depositor should immediately apply to the Postmaster-General by letter, and should renew his application again and again until he obtains a satisfactory reply.

C. Once in each year, on the anniversary of the day on which the first deposit was made by him, the Depositor should forward his deposit book to the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank Department in London, in order that it may be compared with the books of that Department, and in order that the interest due to the previous 31st December may be inserted in it.

D. When a Depositor wishes to withdraw the whole or any part of the sum due to him, he must make application for the same to the Postmaster-General on a printed form called a Notice of Withdrawal, which he can obtain at any Post-Office Savings Bank. When he has properly filled up this form, he must fold it and secure it, and forward it by post as if it were an ordinary letter. In return for it he will receive, probably by return of post, a warrant for the amount required by him, payable at the Post-Office Bank named by him in the notice of withdrawal.

E. A Depositor in any Post-Office Savings Bank may add to his deposits at that or any other Post-Office Savings Bank, and may withdraw the whole or any part of them from that or any other Post-Office Savings Bank, without change of deposit book. For instance, if he makes his first deposit at the Post-Office Bank at Huddersfield, he may make further deposits at, or withdraw his money from, the Post-Office Bank at Huddersfield, or Leeds, Manchester, Birmingham, Edinburgh, Dublin, or any other place which may be convenient to him.

F. No charge will be made to Depositors for the books first supplied to them, or for the renewal of those books; but if any Depositor shall lose his book, and shall desire a new book, he must make application to the Postmaster-General for the same, and must enclose in his application Postage Stamps to the value of 1s. to pay for the new book. If a Depositor loses his book, he should immediately give notice of the loss to the Postmaster-General.

G. No charge for Postage will be made on the Depositor for any letter passing between him and the Savings Bank Department with regard to his deposits, or with regard to the withdrawal of the same, or for the transmission of his deposit book between him and the Savings Bank Department.



H. The Postmasters and other Officers of the Postmaster-General employed in the receipt or payment of deposits, are strictly forbidden to disclose the name of any Depositor, or the amount of his deposits, except to the Postmaster-General, or to such of his Officers as are appointed to assist in carrying on the business of the Post-Office Bank.

I. A full statement of the Regulations of the Post-Office Banks may be seen in the "British Postal Guide," and at any Post Office Bank; where also information may be obtained with regard to the Rules affecting—

- (A) The deposits made by Trustees on behalf of another person.
- (B) The deposits of Minors.
- (C) The deposits of Married Women.
- (D) The deposits of Friendly or Charitable or Provident Societies or Penny Banks.
- (E) The repayment of the deposits of deceased Depositors to their representatives.
- (F) The repayment of the deposits of Depositors who have become insane, or who are, from other causes, unable to act for themselves.

## SOCIETIES.

### RELIGIOUS.

Greenock Sabbath School Union in connection with the Church of Scotland—Instituted 1864.—President, William Thomson; Vice-President, George Wylie; Treasurer, James Arbuckle; Secretary, David Sutherland; and a committee of eighteen, composed of three members from each Sabbath School Association. The objects of the Union are the encouragement of friendly intercourse and co-operation among the members, and the promotion of the cause of Sabbath Schools in Greenock and neighbourhood, without interfering with the management. Meetings are held quarterly to receive reports from schools connected with the Union, and papers on suitable subjects contributed.

Greenock United Bible Society and Association—Instituted 1842.—president; Rev. Dr M'Culloch, James Duff, and Jas. Morton, vice-presidents; Rev. J. J. Bonar and Hugh Buie, secretaries; James Paterson, treasurer; James M'Kelvie, stationer, depository; with a committee of 26 members.

Greenock Town Missionary Society.—Rev. Sutherland Sinclair, president; D. Paterson, treasurer; William Hastie, secretary; Mr Borland, missionary. This society is supported wholly by four United Presbyterian Churches. Mission Chapel, St Lawrence St.

Greenock Seamen's Friends' Society.—Instituted 1820.—Archd. Adam, president; Andrew Carmichael, treasurer; John M'Ilvain, secretary; U. Walton, assistant-secretary; D. Brochie, chaplain; with forty-eight directors. Walter Sinclair, officer. This society

has a Chapel, seating 350, in which Divine Service is conducted three times each Lord's Day. Ministers in town generally take the evening service. A Reading Room and Library daily open from 10 to 6 o'clock, free of charge. It supplies Loan Libraries, each containing 24 volumes, to every Greenock ship; 250 are sent out yearly in foreign going ships. It has a Depot, where the Scriptures are sold at reduced prices in various languages. The society keeps a boat in which the chaplain visits the ships in the roads when weather permits.

Sailors' Home, Dock Breast.—Instituted 1852.—Having accommodation for 80 seamen, with every convenience and comfort. Duncan Ritchie, superintendent. Committee of management—the Provost of Greenock, the Chairman of Harbour Committee, the Collector of Customs, and the Shipping Master, with the President, Treasurer, Secretary, Chaplain, and Seven Members of the Seamen's Friends' Society.

Greenock Young Men's Christian Association—Instituted 1839—Rooms, Temperance Institute, West Stewart Street. Office-bearers, David Kerr, President; Hugh M'Arthur, Vice-President; John Morrison, and ——— Joint Secretaries; Colin M'Culloch, Corresponding Secretary; Thomas Hunter, Reading Room Secretary; John Paterson, Treasurer; ——— M'Grigor, Librarian. This Association has for its object the religious, moral, and intellectual improvement of young men. It is divided into six branches, which meet in the following places every Friday evening for religious services, viz.—Branch No. 1, Wellpark Free Church Session House; No. 2, Free Middle Church do.; No. 3, Nicholson street, U.P. Church do.; No. 4, Union street U.P. do.; No. 5, East Parish Church do.; No. 6, St Andrew's Free Church do. Young men of good moral character are admitted members upon assenting to the constitution and laws of the Association. There is a library of 700 volumes for the use of the members. Tract distribution and other schemes of utility are engaged in. A popular course of lectures and reading room are also carried on by the Association. The Reading Room, Temperance Institute Buildings, is open to the public at the following rates of subscription:—Annual subscription 7s 6d; half yearly 4s; quarterly, 2s; apprentices, annually, 2s 6d.

Greenock Young Men's Protestant Association—Instituted 1862. Object—The study of the Bible and Romish Works; the enlightenment of Protestants as to the real character of Popery in its religious, social, and political aspects, and the conversion of Romanists. President, John Fleming; vice-president, Allan P. Paton; chairman, Walter Gunn; treasurer, George Brown; secretary, Wm. Munro, Jamieson Place, Nicolson street; corresponding secretary, Andrew Swan; librarian, W. J. Brown; with a committee of twelve members. The members meet during the winter months on Monday

evenings at a quarter-past eight o'clock, in the Lower Mission Hall, Church Place. Essays are read, and conversations and readings engaged in for mutual improvement. Young men of good moral character who admit the Bible to be the Word of God and their guide, are admitted as members. Annual subscription, one shilling. The distribution of Protestant publications, delivery of sermons and lectures, and other schemes are engaged in by this association; and there is a Library to which all the members have access. Prizes for essays, or answers to questions on the Romish Controversy, are offered yearly.

George Square Mutual Improvement Society.—The aim and object of this society is the moral and intellectual improvement of its members, and the diffusion of general learning and knowledge amongst them. Ordinary meetings are held weekly in the Session-house of George Square U.P. Church, from the first Monday of October till the last Monday in April in each year, during which time each session extends. At each meeting an essay is read, or a conversational subject introduced. There is a Library in connection with the society, to which all the members have access.

St. Andrew's Free Church Mutual Improvement Association.—President, Rev. J. J. Meets every Thursday evening (from October to April), in St Andrew's Free Church Library, and has in view the moral and intellectual improvement of its members.

Greenock Literary Association—Instituted 1866.—President, Thomas W. E. Bone; Vice-President, Wm. M. M'Lelland; Treasurer, James Nicoll, jun.; Secretary, James Bone; Members of Committee, Messrs Thomas King, jun., John M'Farlane, and W. P. Millar. Meets every Tuesday evening from October till April, in the Upper Mission Hall, Church Place, and has for its object the moral and intellectual improvement of its members. At each meeting an essay is read or a debate engaged in.

Greenock Working Boys' and Girls' Religious Society.—Hon. President, Provost Morton; Hon. Vice-Presidents, Rev. Messrs F. L. Robertson, Wm. Laughton, S. Sinclair, and J. M. Jarvie, Bailie Birkmyre, James T. Caird, Esq., Alexander Scott, Esq., and Robert Blair, Esq.; Board of Management, Messrs Q. L. Anderson, M. F. Dunlop, James Slater jun., A. S. Mories, John Lang, R. W. Cameron, Wm. Bowman, John M'Phail, James Barr, David Service, John Flockhart, Alex. C. Smith, James Auld, A. J. Turnbull; President, Wm. Hastie; Vice-President, Wm. Crawford; Treasurer, Peter M'Kellar; Secretary, John Somerville. The object of this society is to promote the religious, educational, and social elevation of boys and girls employed in building yards, foundries and factories. Its



chief aim is to impart religious instruction, and form a connecting link between the Sabbath School and the Church: it provides classes for teaching the elements of education, and meetings for social entertainment; and by means of savings banks it seeks to foster provident habits. ### B E N E V O L E N T.

Greenock Female Benevolent Society—Instituted 1811, for the benefit of aged females of good moral character. Supported by voluntary subscriptions. Lady Octavia Shaw Stewart, patroness; Mrs David Johnstone, president; Mrs Robert Millar, 41 Union street, treasurer; Miss Buchanan, secretary; Rev. William Laughton, chaplain; 34 superintendents, 34 visitors, and 18 collectors. The committee meet on the second Monday of every month, in the hall connected with the Free Gaelic Church, and a general meeting is held once a year, in January, in the School of Industry, for the election of a Committee of Management for the coming year; as also for the purpose of being informed of the past year's transactions.

Industrial Home for Friendless Girls, Upper Ann street, was opened June, 1865, as a necessary adjunct to the operations of the "Mission to Friendless Females," one of the objects of this Association being to rescue from falling into vicious habits, friendless girls, from 12 to 16 years of age. These are trained in the "Home" for domestic service, besides being instructed in reading, writing, arithmetic, sewing, &c., and having habits of industry and well-doing inculcated. After obtaining situations for these inmates, the committee continue to take a lively interest in them.



The Home is supported by voluntary subscriptions, and by washing and dressing done at the Institution.

The Greenock Academy, situated in Nelson Street, was opened in September, 1855, and is intended to provide a good general education for boys and girls. It contains twelve spacious and well-aired class-rooms, with teachers' rooms, &c., and a large hall in which all the pupils may be assembled; there is also an extensive playground attached, with covered sheds for exercise in wet weather. The curriculum for the senior classes embraces a wide and varied course of study, extending over five years, and the arrangements are such as to allow a selection of classes to be made, suitable for those intending afterwards to pursue their studies at any of the Universities, as well as for those wishing to qualify themselves for the public service or for mercantile pursuits.

Rector—Archibald Montgomerie, LL.D., Mathematical Department—Arithmetic and Mathematics, the Rector. Classical Department, E. L. Neilson; Assistant, James Rutherford. English Department—Head Master, Francis H. Mure; Assistants, A. Bremner and Stephen B. Landells. Modern Languages—Robert Dryden. Writing—John Fraser. Drawing—Thomson Kirkwood. Lady Superintendent—Miss Molland. Pianoforte and Singing—George T. Poulter and Miss Wilson. Class Singing—W. P. Cross. Dancing and maintien—Mrs J. S. Wallace. Fencing and Gymnastics—Charles Long. Sewing and Fancy Work—Miss McLean. Janitor—John McKelvie.

There are two Bursaries in connection with the Academy, the holders of which are entitled to attend all the ordinary classes gratis:—1. The Macfie Bursary, founded by the late Wm. Macfie Esq. of Langhouse, which is competed for annually, and is open to boys from any school—5 boys. 2. The Fairrie Bursary, founded by the late Thomas Fairrie, Esq., Greenock. One boy is appointed each year by Mr Fairrie's Trustees—5 boys.

Regulations of the Macfie Bursary.—1. The Directors shall select annually, after competitive examination, one boy to be admitted to the Classical Department, and to be educated in all the accompanying branches. There shall be no appointment in place of Bursars who may be prevented from completing the curriculum. 2. The competition shall be open to boys not under eight nor above twelve years of age, from the Academy or any other school approved of by the Directors; and due advertisement shall be made accordingly. 3. A boy may be selected to enter in any year of the classical curriculum, according to the judgment of the examiners; the parents or guardians of the Bursar undertaking that he shall complete the curriculum. 4. An examination of the Bursars shall be made annually; and the Bursaries shall be continued only on proof being given of regular attendance and satisfactory progress.

The Fairrie Bursary was founded by the late Thomas Fairrie, Esq., and he stipulated by his deed of settlement, that in return for the bequest made by him to the Academy, the directors should present

a gratis education to one boy of promise in each year of the Latin curriculum, along with the free enjoyment of all the accompanying classes, who should be recommended by his Trustees, and failing them by the superintendent of the schools endowed by Mr Fairrie.

In addition to the ordinary class prizes, the following are competed for annually, at the close of the Session :—1. The Stewart Gold Medal.—Open to Boys and Girls of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Years, attending the Academy during the Session in which the Medal is given—£5. Competitors may select any six of the following ten subjects (one at least being a language)—Mathematics, Arithmetic, Latin, Greek, French, German, English Literature and Analysis, English Grammar and Composition, History and Geography, Scripture Knowledge. 2. The Brown Society's prize.—Open to Boys in the Classical Department during the Session—£10. 3. The Campbell Prize.—A case of Mathematical Instruments to the best scholar in the Mathematical Department—£5. Prize for Scripture Knowledge.—Open to all Pupils of the fourth and fifth years.

Greenock Ragged School Association—School buildings, with teacher's house attached, Wellington and Captain streets. President Sir M. R. S. Stewart, Bart.; Vice-President, Patrick Fraser, Esq., Sheriff of Renfrewshire; chairman of acting committee, James Stewart; deputy-chairman, Andrew Munro; treasurer, John C. Hunter; secretary, Claud Marshall. It is the object of this association to reclaim the neglected and destitute children of Greenock by affording them the benefit of a good common and Christian education, and by training them to habits of regular industry, so as to enable them to earn an honest livelihood, and fit them for the duties of life. Rodger, the Provost of Greenock, the Sheriff-Substitute at Greenock, and the President of the Greenock Seamen's Friends' Society, all for the time being, along with two or more persons to be appointed by the Town Council and Police Board, for the purpose of founding "an Asylum in Greenock, to afford shelter during the night to poor persons without a home, and to supply them with a nourishing meal on entering and on leaving the Asylum." In terms of the Codicil, the Town Council and Police Board appointed Trustees of the Asylum. A building is in course of erection in Captain Street, in which persons will be accommodated according to the testator's wishes.

Scott Bequest.—By will, dated 8th January, 1836, Mr Wm. Scott, of St Andrew's, New Brunswick, bequeathed the residue of his estate in trust "to the Provost and Magistrates for the time being, as also the two clergymen of the east and west parishes of his father's native town of Greenock," for "the endowment of a school for the maintenance and education of as many indigent orphan children to be instructed in English Reading and Grammar, together with writing, arithmetic, and a few of the plain branches of mathematics." ## HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

## PUBLIC STANDS.

The following places are the public stands :—

1. Steamboat quay.
2. East end of Cathcart street.
3. Cathcart street, near Railway station.
4. Cathcart square.
5. West Burn street, north of Hamilton street.

## FARES.

It shall be in the option of the hirer to engage any hackney carriage either by time or distance, provided this be done at the time of hiring.

## FARES BY DISTANCE.

When a party, not exceeding four grown-up persons, with luggage not exceeding 56 lb. weight, enters a carriage at a stand, or when driving along disengaged, they shall be driven to any point within the places after referred to at the following rates, viz. :—

## SHILLING FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Cartsburn on the east, Roxburgh street on the south, and Margaret street on the west.

## ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Ratho Street on the east, and Wellington Street on the south, and Martha Brae on the west.

## TWO SHILLING FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Ladyburn on the east, Drumfrochar Road on the south, and Berryburn on the west.

## GENERAL RATES OR FARES.

Where the point to or from which the carriage is driven shall be beyond the limits of the preceding special fares, the fare shall be regulated by the following table. The charge in the table shall include going from the nearest stance to the hirer's residence and waiting ten minutes, but if detained more than ten minutes, to receive sixpence for each additional ten minutes:—

Half fare returning.

When parties return (which they shall have the option of doing), and the fare going is one shilling, the carriage shall wait ten minutes without any charge for waiting; when one shilling and sixpence, fifteen minutes; when two shillings and upwards, twenty minutes. If the carriage be detained longer, a charge shall be allowed for waiting, at the rate of sixpence for every twenty minutes or part thereof, commencing at the period when the free waiting expires.

When a carriage is called but not used, a charge of sixpence shall be allowed, if the place to which it is called be under half a mile from the stance, and one shilling if beyond that.

## FARES BY TIME, &amp;C.

For shopping, making calls, and where the driving is not continuous, the charge shall be one shilling for the first half-hour, and sixpence for every additional quarter of an hour.

Whether the fares are by distance or by time the hirer pays tolls.

If there be more than four grown-up persons driven, a charge of sixpence extra shall be made for each additional grown person, and a charge of sixpence for every two children above six years of age. No additional charge for one child above six or children under six.

4d per 56 lbs over the first 56 lbs may be charged for all luggage which requires to be put outside. The driver shall assist in loading and unloading in all cases when required, but shall not be bound to leave his carriage for the purpose.

From eleven o'clock at night till twelve o'clock midnight, fare and a half, and from twelve o'clock till six morning, double fare to be exigible.

#### FARES MAY BE WITHHELD.

Any party shall be entitled to withhold payment of fare—1st, When the name and number are not painted outside, or when there is no plate inside. 2d, When the reference ticket is not given on demand. 3d, When the bye-laws and table of fares are not shown on demand; and 4th, When an overcharge is made.

Drivers not to be entitled to any gratuity.

Driver to give hirer a reference ticket, and produce bye-laws and table of fares when demanded.

---

#### TABLE OF RATES OR FARES TO BE EXACTED BY LICENSED BOATMEN AT THE PORT AND HARBOURS OF GREENOCK.

1st. Boat hire from any of the quays, piers, harbours, or the Esplanade, to any ship or vessel lying in the roadstead, between the Tail of the Bank buoy on the west, and Garvel Point on the east, said vessel not being at a greater distance than a mile and a half from the shore of Greenock between these two points:—If one passenger, 1s 6d; two passengers, 2s; every additional passenger, 6d.

2d. Boat hire from any of the above mentioned stations to any ship or vessel lying at the anchorage, termed the Tail of the Bank:—If one passenger, 2s; two passengers, 2s 6d; every additional passenger, 6d.

3d. Boat hire from any of the above mentioned stations to the powder anchorage ground:—If one passenger, 3s 6d; every additional passenger, 6d.

4. Boat hire from any of the above mentioned stations to the hill of Ardmore, or Helensburgh, Kilcreggan or point of Rosneath, or Row, or any other point on the opposite shore:—If one passenger, 5s; two passengers, 6s; three passengers, 7s; every additional passenger, 6d.

5th. Boat hire from any of the above mentioned stations to any Ship or Vessel lying in Gourock Bay:—If one passenger, 3s 6d; two passengers, 4s 6d; and every additional passenger, 6d. For these rates or fares the boatmen shall be obliged to wait thirty minutes, and bring back the passengers. If detained beyond thirty minutes,

one shilling to be paid for each half hour, or part of half an hour after the first.

The above rates or fares shall include luggage if under one hundred weight; but all luggage above that amount shall be charged for every additional cwt., 4d.

Vessels in harbour shifting passing lines, up to 300 tons, 7s 6d; ships, 10s; if boatmen employed by time, 12s 6d per day.

For the above rates the boatmen shall be obliged to furnish four oars and men when from the state of the weather this is required, to enable them to make the passage; but when required to do so by the hirer himself, for expedition or otherwise, one-half fare to be paid in addition to the above rates. The harbour master to be sole judge in case of dispute between the boatmen and the hirer as to the state of the weather, and as to the necessity for four oars.

---

### OMNIBUSES.

Omnibuses leave the Greenock Railway Station, Cathcart Street, on the arrival of most of the passenger trains from Glasgow, and from Cathcart Square, in connection with trains of the Ayrshire Railway, and they also leave Ashton and Gourock in time for the departure of most of the passenger trains for Glasgow.

The City 'Bus runs every lawful day from Clyde House, Rosneath Street, at half-past nine a.m., for Finnieston, leaving Finnieston for Rosneath Street, Low Gourock Road, near the Battery, at ten a.m. and every hour thereafter till nine p.m. and on Saturdays till ten p.m. Any alteration will be announced in daily papers.

Fractional tonnage to be charged and paid in proportion.

Two thirds only of the above rates exigible in respect of vessels  
towed by steam.



From Greenock, or off Greenock, to Garelochhead, including detention in swinging the vessel, one halfpenny per ton; and the same rate in returning; but no pilot will be obliged to pilot a vessel to the Garelochhead and back for a less sum than fifteen shillings each way.

For every day the Pilot is kept on board after the compasses are adjusted he shall be entitled to charge five shillings.

For piloting vessels up and down the Leven, to or from Dumbarton, the pilots shall not be entitled to charge more than four shillings in addition to the rate of piloting such vessels on the Clyde; and four shillings for each additional tide he may be detained after the first.

Any Pilot, whether Deep-sea or River, who may be detained at the request of the owners or persons in charge of the vessel, after his duties as Pilot have been completed, shall (where not otherwise provided for in these regulations), in addition to receiving his provisions, be paid by the owner or person in charge of the vessel five shillings per day, and in like proportion for any lesser period he may be detained on board.

*N.B.—No differential rates shall in future be recoverable in respect of Foreign Vessels.*
