STAMP DUTIES.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT, or ORDER, after the 10th October, 1853, for the payment of any sum of money to the bearer, or to order on demand, id. And the following instruments shall be deemed and taken to be drafts or orders for the payments of money within the intent and meaning of this Act, and of any Act or Acts relating to the stamp duties on bills of exchange, drafts, or orders, and shall be chargeable accordingly with the stamp duties imposed by this Act or any such Act or Acts, viz.:—All documents or writings usually termed letters of credit, or whereby any person to whom any such document or writing is or is intended to be delivered or sent, shall be entitled or be intended to be entitled to have credit with or in account with, or to draw upon any other person for or to receive from such other person any sum of money therein mentioned.

EXEMPTIONS.—Any draft or order drawn by any banker upon any other banker, not payable to bearer, or to order, and used solely for the purpose of settling or clearing any account between said bankers. Any letter written by a banker to any other banker, directing the payment of any sum of money, the same not being payable to bearer or to order, and such letter not being sent or delivered to the person to whom payment is to be made,

or to any person on his behalf.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT, or ORDER for the payment of any sum of money, though not made payable to the bearer or to order, if the same shall be delivered to the payee, or some person on his or her behalf, the same duty as on a Bill of Exchange for the like

sum payable to bearer or to order.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT or ORDER for the payment of any sum of money weekly, monthly, or at any other stated periods, if made payable to the bearer, or to order, or if delivered to the payee, or to some person on his or her behalf, where the total amount of the money thereby made payable shall be specified therein, or can be ascertained therefrom, or shall be indefinite, the same duty as on a Bill payable to bearer or order on demand.

PROMISSORY NOTE for the payment of any sum of money by instalments, or for the payment of several sums of money at different days or times, so that the whole of the money to be paid shall be definite and certain, the same duty as on a Promissory Note, payable otherwise than to the bearer on demand, for a sum

equal to the whole amount of the money to be paid.

By Act 17 and 18 Vict. cap. 80, it is enacted that a birth be registered within 21 days, a Marriage within 3 days, and a Death within 8 days respectively thereafter. It is usual, and saves considerable trouble to parties, to get a Death registered previous to interment. Penalties are exigible if the above rules are not complied with.

The Numbers denote the Registration District in which each Street is situated.

To avoid jostling in meeting, Passengers should observe the general rule—"Keep to the Right"—that is, to allow those you meet to pass on your left hand.

RATES OF POSTAGE AND CONDITIONS OF TRANSMISSION.

Inland Letters,*

2. As a general rule, the postage, if not paid in advance, is double the foregoing; and if the payment in advance be insufficient, double the deficiency is charged. An inland letter, for example, weighing more than half an ounce and not exceeding one ounce, if bearing a penny stamp only, is, on delivery, charged twopence. On re-directed letters, however, the charge for re-direction is the same whether prepaid or collected on delivery.—(See paragraph 111).

Inland Letters are those which pass between places in the United Kingdon, including the Isle of Man, the Orkney, Shetland, Scilly, and Channel Islands.

⁺ If the weight be exceeded to the smallest extent, even though the balance be merely turned, the letter becomes liable to a higher postage. The same rule applies to Letters going abroad. To provide, therefore, for errors in scales, &c., it is well to allow a little margin, or to pay the postage of the next greater weight.

Colonial and Foreign Letters.

3. The rates of postage on letters to the colonies and foreign countries are entered in the table of Colonial and Foreign Postage at page 52.

Addresses to the Queen and Petitions to Parliament.

4. Petitions and addresses to her Majesty, forwarded direct, are exempt from postage; and such petitions and addresses, as also petitions to either House of Parliament, if sent to a member of either House, are likewise exempt, provided they do not weigh more than two pounds, and are either without covers or are in covers open at the sides. No letter or other enclosure, however, must be inserted; and if one be found, such enclosure, unless it bear the proper number of postage stamps, will be charged as an unpaid letter.

NEWSPAPERS.

(I.) Inland.

By the "Post Office Act, 1870," the use of the Inland Revenue impressed stamp denoting the stamp duty, under which newspapers and other periodicals had been previously transmissible by post within the United Kingdom, was abolished, and a postage of one halfpenny was fixed for each transmission of any newspaper coming within the definition laid down in the Act.

Inland newspapers are subject to the following regulations:—

1st. To have the privilege of passing as a newspaper, the publication must first have been accepted as a newspaper by the Postmaster-General, and have been placed on a Register at the General Post Office; * from which it is liable to be removed, either through the non-renewal of the registration year by year, or in consequence of any change which may deprive it of the characteristics of a newspaper.

Registration for inland circulation includes registration

for transmission abroad.

2d. It must be printed and published in the United Kingdom, must be published in numbers at intervals of not more than seven days, and must be printed on a sheet or sheets unstitched.

3rd. The full title and date of publication must be printed at the top of the first page, and the whole or part of the title and the date of publication at the top of every subsequent page; and this regulation applies to "Tables of Contents" and "Indices."

^{*} The conditions of admission to the Register may be ascertained on application to the Secretary to the Post Office.

4th. A Supplement must be unstitched, must in every case be published with the newspaper, and must have the title and date of publication of the Newspaper printed at the top of every page; or if it consist of engravings, prints, or lithographs, at the top of every sheet or side.

5th. For each Newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet. the postage, when prepaid, is one half-penny; but a packet containing two or more registered newspapers is not chargeable with a higher rate of postage than would be chargeable on a book packet of the same weight, viz., one halfpenny for every 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz.

6th. A Newspaper posted unpaid, and a packet of newspapers posted either unpaid or insufficiently paid, will be treated as an unpaid or insufficiently paid book packet of the

same weight.

7th. The postage must be prepaid either by an adhesive stamp

or by the use of a stamped wrapper.

8th No newspaper can be sent through the post a second time for the original postage; for each transmission a fresh postage must be prepaid, except that in the case of redirection the amount chargeable may be collected on

9th Every newspaper or packet of newspapers must be posted either without a cover or in a cover open at both ends and in such a manner as to admit of easy removal for examination.* If this rule be infringed the newspaper

or packet will be treated as a letter.

10th. Every newspaper must be so folded as to admit of the

title being readily inspected.

11th. No newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet, may contain any enclosure except the supplement or supplements belonging to it. If it contain any other, such enclosure or enclosures will be taken out and charged on

delivery as an unpaid letter.

12th. There must be no printing on the cover of a newspaper sent at the newspaper rate but the name and address of the person to whom it is sent, the title of the newspaper, the name and address of the publisher or vendor who sends it, and words indicating the date on which the subscription to the newspaper will end. If this rule be infringed, the newspaper will be treated as a book packet.

13th. A newspaper which has any letter, or any communication of the nature of a letter, written in it or upon its cover, will be charged as an unpaid or insufficiently paid letter.

^{*} In order that no failure may occur in the delivery of newspapers through the covers becoming detached, it is recommended that the addresses be written on exposed parts of the newspapers themselves as well as on the cover.

14th. No packet of newspapers must exceed 14 lbs. in weight, nor may it exceed 2 feet in length or 1 foot in width or depth.

(II.) Colonial and Foreign.

6. Under the powers given to the Postmaster-General by the Post Office Act, 1870, the regulations relating to the registration of publications for transmission abroad as Newspapers have been revised. The definition laid down in the Act, in regard to newspapers which may be registered for transmission through the post in the United Kingdom, is alike applicable to those which may be registered for transmission abroad, excepting that for foreign transmission a newspaper may be published at intervals of thirty-one days, and that it (but not its supplement) may be printed on sheets stitched together.

Newspapers going abroad are also subject to the following regu-

lations:-

1st. "Prices Current" and "Market Reports," but not private price lists or trade catalogues, are admitted to the same privileges as newspapers for foreign transmission.

2nd. Publications registered for transmission abroad must be posted within eight days from the date of publication, in-

cluding the day of publication.

3rd. The collected numbers issued during the month of a weekly, fortnightly, tri-monthly, &c., publication will not be allowed to pass as a monthly publication.

4th. The postage must be prepaid in postage labels. The rates are shown in the Table of Colonial and Foreign Postage.

5th. Publications not on the Register at the General Post Office cannot be sent abroad at any rates lower than those applicable to book packets.

6th. Every newspaper or packet of newspapers must be posted either without a cover or in a cover open at both ends, and in such a manner as to admit of easy removal for examination.

7th. Every newspaper must be so folded as to admit of the title

being readily inspected.

8th. No newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet, may contain any enclosure except the supplement or supple-

ments belonging to it.

The other must be no writing or other mark on a newspaper sent abroad but the name and address of the person to whom it is sent; nor anything on the cover but such name and address, the printed title of the publication, the printed name and address of the publisher or vendor who sends it, and words indicating the date on which the subscription to the newspaper will end.

10th. No packet of newspapers must exceed two feet in length or

one foot in width or depth. (See also par. 11, sec. 2.)

11th. It is forbidden to introduce into Russia, through the Post political newspapers, even in covers open at the ends or sides : and the only means by which persons residing in Russia can obtain newspapers from the United Kingdom is by subscribing for them at one of the Russian Post Offices. This prohibition does not, however, extend to political newspapers or any other publication addressed to members of the Royal Family of Russia, the Imperial Ministers, or members of the Diplomatic Corps. The admission into-Russia even of newspapers not of a political character, is permitted only when they are addressed to the house of some established bookseller, to the higher schools, to the Imperial Public Library, or to the Academy of Sciences in Russia. Printed Prices Current, however, as well as printed circulars, in covers open at the ends or sides, are allowed to be addressed to any persons residing in Russia.

Parliamentary Proceedings.

7. Printed Votes or Proceedings of the Imperial Parliament, sent without covers or in covers open at the ends, may circulate within the United Kingdom at the rate of one halfpenny for every 2 oz. or fraction of that weight.

The words "Parliamentary Proceedings" must be written or printed on the cover of the packet; otherwise it will be treated as

an ordinary Book Packet.

Prepayment, when the circulation is within the United Kingdom. is optional; and if it be made in part, the simple difference only will be charged.

Parliamentary Proceedings may be sent, under the Book Post privilege, to all the Colonies, and to those Foreign States between which and this country there is a Book Post (see Tables of Rates).

BOOK POST.

(I.) Inland.

8. A Book-Packet may contain not only books, paper, or other substance in ordinary use for writing or printing, whether plain or written or printed upon (to the exclusion of any written letter or communication of the nature of a letter), Photographs, when not on glass or in frames containing glass or any like substance, and anything usually appertaining to such articles in the way of binding and mounting, or necessary for their safe transmission by post, but also Circulars when these are wholly or in great part printed, engraved. or lithographed.

1st. The postage is one halfpenny for every two ounces or fraction

of that weight.

2nd. The postage must be prepaid either by adhesive stamps or

by means of a stamped wrapper, or by a combination of the two; except at the Chief and District Post Offices and the Branch Offices at Lombard Street and Charing Cross in London, and at the Chief Offices in Edinburgh and Dublin, where, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. it may be prepaid in money, provided the postage amount to not less than £1 in any one case, and provided the packets are posted in bundles each representing a postage of 5s.

3rd. A packet posted wholly unpaid will be charged with double the book-postage; and if posted partially prepaid, with

double the deficiency.

4th. Every book-packet must be posted either without a coveror in a cover open at both ends, and in such a manner as to admit of the contents being easily withdrawn for examination;* otherwise it will be treated as a letter.

- 5th. No book-packet may contain anything sealed or otherwise closed against inspection; nor must there be any letter, nor any communication of the nature of a letter, whether separate or otherwise, unless the whole of such letter or communication be printed. (Entries, however, merely stating who sends the book, &c., or to whom it is given, are not regarded as a letter.) Any such probibited enclosure will be taken out and forwarded to the address on the packet, charged with postage as an unpaid letter; but the remainder of the packet, if duly prepaid, will be forwarded to its address.
 - 6th. There must be no letter, nor any communication of thenature of a letter, written on any part of a book-packet or its cover. If this rule be infringed, the entire packet will be treated as a letter.

7th. No book packet may exceed 14 lbs. in weight, two feet in length, or one foot in width or depth.

(II.) Colonial and Foreign.

9. For information respecting rates of postage and regulations applying to Book-packets for places abroad see the Tables, pages 52 to 72.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

(I.) Inland.

10. The postage is now one halfpenny for every weight of 2 oz-

It is the duty of Postmasters, when they have ground for suspecting an infringement of any of the above conditions, and occasionally, even when there is no ground for suspicion, to open and examine book packets posted at, or passing through, their office.

-sr fraction thereof; but the Pattern and Sample Post is restricted to bona fide trade patterns or samples of merchandize. Goods sent for sale, or in execution of an order (however small the quantity may be), or any articles sent by one private individual to another which are not actually patterns or samples are not admissible.

1st. The postage must be prepaid either by adhesive stamps or means of a stamped wrapper, or by a combination of both; except at the chief and District Offices, and the Branch Offices at Lombard Street and Charing Cross, in London, and at the Chief Offices in Edinburgh and Dublin, where, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., the postage may be prepaid in money, provided it amount to not less than £1 in any one case, and provided the packets are posted in bundles, each representing a postage of 5s.

2nd. A packet posted wholly unpaid will be charged with double the pattern postage; and if posted partially prepaid with

double the deficiency.

3rd. Patterns or Samples, when practicable, must be sent in covers open at the ends, and in such a manner as to be easy of examination. † But samples of seeds, drugs, and such like articles, which cannot be sent in covers of this kind,-but such articles only-may be posted enclosed in boxes or in bags of linen, or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided such closed bags are transparent, so as to enable the Officers of the Post Office readily to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents. If this rule be infringed, the packet will be treated as a letter.

4th. There must be no writing or printing upon any packet except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the address of the sender, a trade mark or number, and the price of the articles; nor may there be any writing or printing or other thing enclosed except such address. mark, number, and price, and a written or printed description of the articles: and these particulars may be on labels attached to the samples. If this rule be infringed the packet will be treated as a letter.

5th. Any prohibited enclosure will be taken out and forwarded to the address on the packet, charged with full postage as an

unpaid letter.*

at, or passing through, their offices.

6th. No packet must exceed 12 oz. in weight, or two feet in length, by one foot in width or depth.

(II.) Colonial and Foreign.

11. Bona fide patterns and samples can be sent, at the rates inserted in the Table of Colonial and Foreign Postage, to such colonies and foreign countries as are marked in that Table with the letter "P." The conditions in these cases are for the most part the same as in the case of the Inland Pattern and Sample Post, the following being the only important exceptions:—

1st. The limit of weight is not the same to all countries. For

particulars see foot-note at pages 53 to 71.

2d. A packet of patterns or samples sent to Portugal, Maderia, the Azores, Cape de Verds, France, or to Turkey, Syria, or Egypt, by French packet, must not exceed 18 inches in length, width, or depth; a packet to any other place abroad must not exceed 24 inches in length or 12 inches in breadth or depth.

3d, The permission given in Rule 4 of the Irland Pattern and Sample Post to enclose a written or printed description of the patterns is not applicable to packets sent abroad.

4th. Samples of intrinsic value must not be sent to foreign countries except the United States; and, in the case of France, samples of eider down, raw or thread silk, woollen or goats' hair thread, vanilla, saffron, carmine, or isinglass, are considered to fall under this rule, if they weigh more than three ounces. Raw and spun silk, as well as coloured and twisted silk, may be sent to the North German Confe-

deration up to the weight of three ounces.

5th. None of the articles named in Rule 16 (p. 14) may be sent as patterns or samples to any place abroad, except the United States of America, Germany, Belgium, Holland, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Turkey, Moldavia, Wallachia, Portugal, Maderia, the Azores, Cape de Verds, Switzerland, and the British Colonies; and not to these places when addressed "via France." Indigo cannot be sent to any place abroad.

6th. Bags entirely closed, even though they be transparent, must not be used for the transmission of seeds to any foreign country except the United States of America, Holland and its possessions, Belgium, Denmark, Greece, Portugal and its possessions, Switzerland, and Austria via France.

POST CARDS.

12. Post Cards, which bear a halfpenny impressed stamp, are available for transmission between places in the United Kingdom only.

1st. The front (or stamped) side is intended for the address only. There must be nothing else written, printed, or otherwise impressed on it, nor must there be any writing or printing across the stamp. On the reverse side any communication, whether of the nature of a letter or otherwise, may be written or printed; but such communication must not extend to the front side. Nothing whatever may be attached; nor may the Card be folded, cut, or otherwise altered. If any of these rules be infringed, the card will be charged 1d on delivery.

2nd. No card other than one of those issued by the Government will pass under a half-penny stamp, if it bear on it a

written communication of the nature of a letter.

General Regulations.

13. When, owing to a great and unusual influx of letters, books, &c., the transmission or delivery of the letters would be delayed if the whole mail were dealt with without distinction, book packets, pattern or sample-packets, and post cards may be kept back until

the next despatch or delivery.

14. It is forbidden to forward by post any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book, or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, publication, packet, or card having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character. Anything posted contrary to this prohibition will be stopped and sent up to the Returned Letter Office, London.

15. Postmasters are instructed not to receive any letter, &c, which there is good reason to believe contains anything likely to injure the contents of the mail bag, or the person of any officer of the Post Office. If such a packet be posted without the Postmaster's knowledge, or if at any time before its despatch he should discover any such packet, he is directed not to forward it, but to report the case, with the address of the packet, to the Secretary-The following are examples of the articles referred to:—

A glass bottle, or glass in any form; razors, scissors, needles, knives, forks, or other sharp instruments; leeches, game, fish, meat, fruit, or vegetables; bladders, or other vessels containing liquids; gunpowder, lucifer matches, or any-

thing which is explosive or libble to sudden combustion.

16. This rule is so far relaxed as to permit the transmission of scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like, as samples, provided that they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags and the officers of the Post Office, while at the same time the samples may be easily examined. If any packet contains

ing such articles as these be posted, which is found not to be sufficiently guarded, it will be stopped, and a notice of its detention sent to the person to whom it is addressed or to the sender, who may then obtain it upon personal application; but the packet will be charged as an unpaid letter.

III. - POSTAGE STAMPS

17. Every Head Postmaster is required to keep, for sale to the public, a sufficient stock of halfpenny Post Cards, of the various postage labels in use, and of envelopes with the penny stamp embossed. The labels are of the respective values of $\frac{1}{2}d$, 1d, $1\frac{1}{2}d$, 2d, 3d, 4d, 6d, 9d, 10d, 1s, 2s, and 5s. Sub-postmasters are required to keep halfpenny and penny labels, and halfpenny Post Cards only; but they can procure any stamps of other values, or embossed envelopes which may be required. The envelopes are made of four sizes, viz., $5\frac{1}{4}$ ins. by $3\frac{3}{8}$ ins., $5\frac{1}{4}$ ins. by 3 ins., $4\frac{3}{4}$ ins. by $2\frac{3}{4}$ ins., and 4 ins. by $2\frac{1}{4}$ ins. by are all sold at the following prices:—

Head Postmasters are also required to keep Newspaper Wrappers bearing on impressed halfpenny stamp, of three different sizes, and to sell them at the following prices:—

18. Every Rural Messenger is authorised to sell postage labels and embossed envelopes at the same price at which Postmasters are empowered to sell them; and when any person applies to him for postage labels the messenger must either supply them, or (if he have none in his possession) must, without extra charge, receive the postage in money, and on his arrival at the Post Office, obtain labels for it, and affix them carefully to the letters.

19. Prepayment of inland letters, newspapers, books, patterns, &c., must be by labels or embossed stamps, except in London, at

the Chief and District Post Offices, and at the Branch Offices at Lombard Street and Charing Cross, and also at the Metropolitan Offices in Edinburgh and Dublin, where, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., letters as well as books and sample packets may be prepaid in money, provided the amount be not less than £1 in any one case, and that the letters, books, &c., be tied in separate bundles, with the addresses arranged in the same direction, and representing a postage of 5s. each. Letters also to the colonies and foreign countries may be prepaid in money. British postage stamps though available for all letters going out of this country, are not, as a general rule, available for letters coming into it.

20. By using embossed envelopes all risk of the stamp being detached may be avoided; but when labels are used, they should be examined to see that they firmly adhere (see page 81, see 6), and the envelopes to which they are affixed should not be too highly glazed, since if the stamps fall off, the letters are charged with postage, and that at the unpaid rate; while as respects letters addressed to many places abroad the transmisssion is altogether

stopped.

21. Labels should be placed on the front, that is the address side of the letter, and upon the right hand upper corner. On redirected letters, however, care should be taken not to place fresh

stamps over the stamps which have been previously used.

22. Postage Stamps which have been torn, cut, or otherwise rendered imperfect, embossed or impressed stamps cut out from the envelope, card, or wrapper, on which such stamps were embossed or impressed—even although the stamps have not been before used or sent by post,—and Receipt or other Inland Revenue Stamps cannot be used for payment of postage. Applications for allowance for spoilt postage stamps, which have not passed through the post, should be made to the Inland Revenue Office.

23. Arrangements have been made by which paper taken by the public to the Office of Inland Revenue, Somerset House, can be impressed with stamps of equal value to any of the postage stamps above mentioned, or to a combination of any of them, under the

following regulations:-

1st. When the stamps required do not amount to £10 worth, one shilling is charged, in addition to the postage stamps, for each distinct size of paper.

2nd. When the stamps amount to £10 worth no fee is charged,

provided one size of paper only be sent.

3rd. When the stamps amount to £20 worth no fee is charged, provided not more than two sizes of paper le sent.

4th. When the stamps amount to £30 no fee is charged, previded not more than three sizes of paper be sent.

5th. When the stamps amount to £40 no fee is charged, provided four sizes of paper only be sent. No more than four sizes

can be received on a single warrant,*

6th. No folded envelopes can be stamped; and therefore paper, whether intended for envelopes or letters, must be sent

unfolded and without being creased.

7th. Every distinct size and form of envelope or paper must be marked so as to indicate the place on which the stamp is to be impressed; in order that when the envelope or letter is folded and made up, the stamp may appear in the proper position, according to the rules of the Post Office.

8th. No coloured paper can be received for stamping, nor any paper which is too thin to bear the impression of the dies.

9th. Envelopes provided by the office of Inland Revenue, with the proper stamps thereon, will be substituted for any which may be spoiled in the operation of stamping.

24. A license to sell postage stamps can be obtained, free of expense, by any respectable person on application to the office of Inland Reveaue, Somerset House, London, or (by residents in the provinces), on application to the Stamp Distributor of their Dis-

trict.

25. All Postmasters in the United Kingdom at whose Offices Money Order business is transacted are permitted, though not compelled, to purchase postage stamps from the public (provided the stamps be not soiled or otherwise damaged), at a charge of $2\frac{1}{2}$ percent; the charge, however, never being less than one halfpenny. Under this arrangement the payments are as follows:—

26. No separate stamps can be purchased. They must in all cases be presented in strips containing at least two stamps adhering.

to each other.

27. In all transmissions of stamps by post care should be taken to fold them in rather thick paper, so that the contents may neither be seen nor felt through the cover.

MONEY ORDERS.

The public are recommended when applying for Money Orders to use printed "Application Forms," which saves time, and afford greater security, than verbal messages, against mistakes. These

^{*} The warrants (or requisition forms) used in applying for paper to be stamped are obtainable on application at the office of Inland Revenue, Somerset House, London, W.C.

Forms are supplied gratuitously at all Money Order Offices.

The Commission on an Inland Money Order or on orders to Belgium and Switzerland not exceeding £2, is threepence; above £2 and not exceeding £5, sixpence; above £5 and not exceeding £7, minepence; above £7 and not evceeding £10, one shilling; above which amount no single order can be granted, but as many £10 Orders may be granted as are desirable. The commission on Money Order to Argentine Republic, Brazil, British Guiana, Canada, Cape of Good Hope, China, Falkland Island, Japan, Natal, St Helena, Tasmania, Uruquay, Honduras, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, New South Wales, New Zealand, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Queensland, South Australia, Victoria, West Coast of Africa, West Indies, Western Australia, is fourfold the above sums, and on Money Orders payable at Malta, Gibraltar, Belgium, Switzerland, Germany, Alexandria, Cain, Constantinople, and Suez three-feld.

No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

With the subjoined exceptiona, no Money Order can be Issued unless the applicant furnish, in full, the surname, and at least the initial of one Christian name, both of the remitter (the person whosends the order) and the payee (to person to whom the money is to be paid), together with the remitter's address:—

1st. If the remitter or payee be a peer or a bishop, his ordinary title is sufficient; and if a firm, the usual designation of such firm will suffice (the term of "Messrs," however, is not sufficient, except a company trading under a title which does not consist of the names of the persons composing it, as the "Carron Company;" to which kind of company the above privilege does not extend.

2d. Money Orders for transmission by the Public to the Privy
Council Office will be issued payable to the "Privy
Council Office," the name of the payee not being required

in these cases.

3d. When the remitter notifies in writing that the order is to be paid through a bank, it is left to his option to give or withhold the name of the payee; and he may, if he wish it, substitute for the name of the payee, any other designation, or any modification of the name, as, for example:

—"The Cashier of the Bank of England," "The Chief Clerk of the Foreign Office," "The Publisher of the Times," "Messrs Longman & Co."

When an application is made for a Money Order payable in London, or at any other town where there is more than one Money Order Office, the remitter should say at which of such offices he wishes it to be paid, otherwise the order can be cashed at the Head Office alone. It is not incumbent on a Postmaster to supply such information relative to local or provincial offices, but the nearest

Money Order Office to any street in London may be ascertained by referring to the Street List published in the Post Office Regulations.

An order once issued cannot be cancelled; and should repayment or transfer to a different office, or alteration of name be required, the remitter must apply to the issuing or paying Postmaster according to the directions printed on the back of the Order.

The remitter of an order may make that order payable ten days after date, provided he sign the requisition "C," printed on the back of that order, to defer payment until ten days after date, and affix a penny receipt stamp thereto.

When an order is presented for payment (otherwise than through a bank) the Postmaster has first to see that the signature of the payee be as full as the name given in the advice, and be not in any way inconsistent therewith. He has then to call on the applicant to give the name of the remitter, and if the reply be correct, the order will be paid, unless the Postmaster have good reason for believing that the applicant for payment is neither the rightful claimant, nor deputed by him. When an order is payable through a bank it is sufficient that it be receipted (without regard to any discrepancy between the signature and the name in the advice, or to whether the receipt is given by the payee himself or by another person); and that it be presented (crossed with name of the receiving Lank), by some person known to be in the employment of the bank.

The holder of a Meney Order is always at liberty to direct, by crossing it, that the order be paid through a bank, even though its payment was not originally so restricted, that when the order is thus crossed, the question put on the presentation of an ordinary Money Order is dispensed with.

PRINCIPAL RULES

OF THE

GOVERNMENT INSURANCE AND ANNUITY OFFICE,

AND OF THE

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

PRINCIPAL RULES OF THE GOVERNMENT INSURANCE AND ANNUITY OFFICE.

I. The Postmaster-General is empowered, under the Act 27 & 28

Victoriæ, cap. 43, to insure the lives of persons of either sex, between the ages 16 and 60, for not less than £20 or more than £100. He is also empowered, under the same Act, to grant Immediate or Deferred Annuities, of not more than £50, on the lives of persons of either sex, and of the age of ten years and upwards. The persons whose lives are insured, or to whom Annuities are granted by the Postmaster-General, have direct Government security for the payment of the money at the proper time.

2. Certain Post Offices (the names of which may be obtained at any Post Office) have been opened for the receipt of proposals for the Insurance of Lives and the purchase of Anunities; and forms of proposal, with full instructions for filling up and delivering these forms, may be obtained at these Post Offices.

3. Tables of the premiums to be charged for the Insurance of Lives; for the grant of Immediate Annuities; for the grant of Deferred Annuities or Deferred Monthly Allowances, without return of purchase money, and for the grant of Deferred Annuities or Deferred Monthly Allowances, with return of purchase money have been printed, and may be seen at the Post Offices which have been opened for the receipt of proposals. These tables may also be obtained of Messrs Eyre and Spottiswoode, London. The price of the Tables for the insurance of Lives and the grant of Annuities without return of purchase money is $\frac{31}{2}$ d. The price of the tables for the grant of Annuities with return of purchase money is 2d. If sent by post, 8d is charged in the one case, and 3d in the other.

4. The premiums to be charged for the insurance of lives vary with the ages of the persons whose lives are to be insured, and with the mode in which they are to be paid.

Smaller sums may be insured by proportionate payments, but no one of the periodical payments must be of less amount than two

shillings.

5. No one life can be insured for less than £20 in the whole; but when a life has been insured for £20, further insurances may be effected on the same life from time to time, for any amount, until the whole sum for which it is insured amounts to £100.

6. If, after having duly made his payments for a period of five years, the insured person shall be unable to continue, or shall desire to discontinue such payments, a portion of the premiums paid by him, which portion will in no case be less than one-third of the whole sum paid by him, will be returned to him.

7. The sums to be charged for the purchase of Immediate Annuities will vary with the age and sex of the person on whose life

The sums to be charged for the purchase of Deferred Annuities, or Deferred Monthly Allowances, will vary with the age and sex of the person on whose life the Annuity or Monthly Allowance is to depend; and with the length of the term for which the Annuity is deferred, (or, in other words, with the number of years which are to pass before the commencement of the Annuity), and with the conditions of the contract as to the mode of purchase, mode of payment, and return, or non-return of purchase money.

The Annuity or Monthly Allowance granted on any one lifmust not exceed £50 per annum, or £4 3s 4d per month; but pur chasers need not purchase the whole amount of such Annuity or Allowance at one time. They may begin by purchasing such part as they can afford to purchase, and go on increasing their purchases from time to time as circumstances will permit.

10 Husband and Wife may each be insured to the full amount of £100, and may each purchase an Annuity of £50, or a Monthly Allowance of £4 3s 4d. Any two persons may purchase an Annuity

on their joint lives, with or without continuance of the Annuity to the survivor.

- 11. Persons contracting for the insurance of their Lives, or for the purchase of Annuties or Monthly Allowances, will be allowed to pay their periodical premiums or instalments of purchase money at such of the Post Offices, which have been or may hereafter beopened for the purpose, as will suit them best.
- 12. Persons proposing to effect Insurances on their Lives, or to purchase Deferred Monthly Allowances, must provide at their own cost such certificates of their birth or baptism, oo other evidence of age, as shall be required of them, but will not be required to pay any fee for medical examination, or to pay the cost of any inquiry which the Postmaster-General may think fit to make with regard to their health, habits, age, and occupation, or to pay any fee for the issue of any contracts which may be made in accordance with their proposals, or to pay any postage for the transmission of their proposals, or for the transmition of any correspondence arising out of such proposals between them and the Postmaster-General, inasmuch as a provision for all such costs and charges is included in the premiums which they will be required to pay, in accordance with the Tables framed for the purpose, for the Insurance of their Lives or the purchase of Deferred Monthly Allowances.

Persons proposing to purchase Immediate or Deferred Anuuities, payable half-yearly, must provide at their own cost such certificates of birth or baptism, or other evidence of age, as shall be required of them; and, inasmuch as the premiums fixed by the Tables trained for the grant of such Annuities do not include any provision for costs and charges, must pay, at the time of purchase, a fee of 1s. for every £1 of Annuity purchased.

PRINCIPAL RULES OF THE POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

A. Post Office Savings Banks are established at all Money Order-Offices in the United Kingdom, and are open for the receipt and payment of money daily during the hours appointed for Money Order business.

At these banks deposits of one shilling, or any number of shillings will be received; but no one may deposit more than £30 in one year, or more than £150 in the whole, exclusive of interest.

Interest at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum (which is at the rate of sixpence in the Pound for each year, or at the rate of One Halfpenny on each complete Pound for each month, reckoning from the first day of the Calendar month next following the day on which a complete Pound has been Deposited, up to the last day

of the Calendar month preceding the day on which the money is withdrawn) is allowed until the Sum due to a Depositor amounts to £200, when interest ceases to be allowed. The interest due to each Depositor is added to the principal due to him on 31st December in each year.

B. Every deposit in a Post Office Savings Bank must be immediately entered by the Postmaster, or other person receiving it, in a book, which book is to be kept by the Depositor, and the Postmaster or other person receiving the deposit should affix his signature and the stamp of his office to each entry. Depositors should carefully examine their books before leaving the offices at which they make their deposits, and ascertain that they have obtained correct receipts for the sums deposited by them.

In addition to the receipts which the depositors will thus obtain in their deposit books, they will receive for each deposit an acknowledgment by post from the Savings Bank Department in London. This acknowledgment should reach the depositor within three days from the day on which he makes his deposit, if the deposit be made in England or Wales. If the deposit be made in Ireland or Scotland the acknowledgment should reach the depositor within five days. The acknowledgment should be quite free from erasure, and should state the exact amount of the deposit, and the day on which the deposit was made. If the acknowledgment does not reach the depositor in proper time, or if, when it reaches him, it shows any signs of erasure, or does not agree with the entry in the depositor's book, the depositor should immediately apply to the Postmaster-General by letter, and should renew his application again and again until he obtains a satisfactory reply.

C. Once in each year, on the anniversary of the day on which the first deposit was made by him, the depositor should forward his deposit book to the Controller of the Post Office Savings Bank Department in London, in order that it may be compared with the books of that Department, and in order that the interest due to the previous 31st December may be inserted in it.

D. When a Depositor wishes to withdraw the whole or any part of the sum due to him, he must make application for the same to the Postmaster-General on a printed form called a Notice of Withdrawal, which he can obtain at any Post-Office Savings Bank. When he has properly filled up this form, he must fold it and secure it, and forward it by post as if it were an ordinary letter. In return for it he will receive, probably by return of post, a warrant for the amount required by him, payable at the Post-Office Bank named by him in the notice of withdrawal.

E. A Depositor in any Post-Office Savings Bank may add to his deposits at that or any other Post-Office Savings Bank, and may withdraw the whole or any part of them from that or any other

Post-Office Savings Bank, without change of deposit book. For instance, if he makes his first deposit at the Post-Office Bank at Huddersfield, he may make further deposits at, or withdraw his money from, the Post-Office Bank at Huddersfield, or Leeds, Manchester, Birmingham, Edinburgh, Dublin, or any other place which may be convenient to him.

F. No charge will be made to Depositors for the books first supplied to them, or for the renewal of those books; but if any Depositor shall lose his book, and shall desire a new book, he must make application to the Postmaster-General for the same, and must enclose in his application Postage Stamps to the value of 1s to pay for the new book. If a Depositor loses his book he should immediately give notice of the loss to the Postmaster-General.

G. No charge for Postage will be made on the Depositor for any letter passing between him and the Savings Bank Department with regard to his deposits, or with regard to the withdrawal of the same, or for the transmission of his deposit book between him and the Savings Bank Deposits of his deposit book between him and the

Savings Bank Department.

H. The Postmasters and other Officers of the Postmaster-General employed in the receipt or payment of deposits, are strictly forbidden to disclose the name of any Depositor, or the amount of his deposits, except to the Postmaster-General, or to such of his Officers as are appointed to assist in carrying on the business of the Post-Office Bank.

I. A full statement of the Regulations of the Post-Office Banks may be seen in the "British Postal Guide," and at any Post Office Bank; where also information may be obtained with regard to the Rules affecting—

(A) The deposits made by Trustees on behalf of another per-

son.

(B) The deposits of Minors.

(C) The deposits of Married Women.

(D) The deposits of Friendly or Charitable or Provident Societies or Penny Banks.

(E) The repayment of the deposits of deceased Depositors to

their representatives.

(F) The repayment of the deposits of Depositors who have become insane, or who are, from other causes, unable to act for themselves.

SOCIETIES.

RELIGIOUS.

Greenock Sabbath School Union in connection with the Church of Scotland—Instituted 1864.—President, William Thomson; Vice-President, George Wylie; Treasurer, James Arbuckle; Sectetary, David Sutherland; and a committee of eighteen, composed of three members from each Sabbath School Association. The objects of the Union are the encouragement of friendly intercourse and co-operation among the members, and the promotion of the cause of Sabbath Schools in Greenock and neighbourhood, without interfering with the management. Meetings are held quarterly to receive reports from schools connected with the Union, and papers on suitable subjects contributed.

Greenock United Bible Society and Association.—Instituted 1842. Provost Morton, president; Rev. Dr M'Culloch, James Duff, and D. Johnstone, Esq., vice-presidents; Rev. J. J. Bonar and Hugh Buie, sccretaries; James Paterson, treasurer; James M'Kelvie, stationer, depository: with a committee of 26 members.

Greenock Town Missionary Society.—Rev. Sutherland Sinclair, president; D. Paterson, treasurer; Alex. Borthwiek, secretary, Mr Borland, missionary. The society is supported wholly by four United Presbyterian Churches. Mission Chapol, St Lawrence St.

Greenock Seamen's Friends' Society.—Instituted 1820.—Archd. Adam, president; Andrew Carmichael, treasurer; John M. Ilvain, Secretary; U. Walton, assistant-secretary; with forty-eight directors; D. Brotchie, chaplain. Walter Sinclair, officer. This society has a Chapel, seating 350, in which Divine Service is conducted three times each Lord's Day. Ministers in town generally take the evening service. A Reading Room and Library daily open from 10 to 6 o'clock, free of charge. It supplies Loan Libraries each containing 24 volumes, to every Greenock ship; 250 are sent out yearly in foreign going ships. It has a Depot, where the Scriptures are sold at reduced prices in various languages. The society keeps a boat in which the chaplain visits the ships at the Tail of the Bank when weather permits.

Sailors' Home, Dock Breast.—Instituted 1852.—Having accommodation for 80 seamen, with every convenience and comfort. Duncan Ritchie, superintendent. Committee of management—the Provost of Greenock, the Chairman of Habour Committee, the Collector of Customs, and the Shipping Master, with the President, Treasurer, Secretary, Chaplain, and seven Members of the Seamen's Friends' Society.

Greenock Young Men's Christian Association-Instituted 1839. -Rooms, Temperance Institute, West Stewart Street. Officebearers, Hugh M'Arthur, President; William M'Neil, Vice-President; Robert Chalmers, Treasurer; Robert Ronald, Corresponding Secretary; James Frame and Thomas Hinners, Joint Secretaries: Alexander Nicol, Reading Room Secretary; Archibald Young, Librarian. This Association has for its object the religious, moral, and intellectual improvement of young men. It is divided into six branches, which meet in the following places every Friday evening at 9 o'clock for religious services, viz .-Branch No. 1, Wellpark Free Church Session House; No. 2, Free Middle Church do.; No. 3, George Square Congregational Session House; No. 4, Union Street U.P. do.; No. 5, Highlanders Academy; No. 6, St Andrew's Free Church do. Young men of good moral character are admitted members upon assenting to the constitution and laws of the Association. There is a library of 700 volumes for the use of the members and subscribers. Tract distribution and other schemes of utility are engaged in. popular course of lectures and reading room are also carried on by the Association. The Reading Room and Library, Temperance Institute Buildings, are open to the public at the following rates of subscription : - Annual subscription, 7s 6d; half-yearly 4s; quarterly, 2s; apprentices, annually, 2s 6d.

Greenock Young Men's Protestant Association—Instituted 1862-Object—The study of the Bible and Romish Works; the enlightcument of Protestants as to the real character of Popery in its religious, social, and political aspects, and the conversion of Romanists. Hon. president, Provost Morton; hon. vice-president, Bailie Campbell; chairman, Rev. W. Gunn; vice-chairman, Wm. Arthur M'Naughton; treasurer, Thos. Mitchell; secretary, W. Prizes for essays, or answers to questions on the Romish Controversy, are offered yearly.

The committee meet on the second Monday of every month, in the hall connected with the Free Gælic Church, and a general meeting is held once a year, in January, in the School of Industry, for the election of a Committee of Management for the coming year; as also for the purpose of being informed of the past year's transactions.

Industrial Home for Friendless Girls, Upper Ann Street, was opened June, 1865, as a necessary adjunct to the operations of the "Mission to Friendless Females," one of the objects of this Association being to rescue from falling into vicious habits, friendless girls, from 12 to 16 years of age. These are trained in the "Home" for domestic service, besides being instructed in reading, writing, arithmetic, sewing, &c., and having habits of industry

and well-doing inculcated. After obtaining situations for these inmates, the committee continue to take a lively interest in them. The Home is supported by voluntary subscriptions, and by wash-

ing and dressing done at the Institution.

GREENOCK ACADEMY.

The Greenock Academy, situated in Nelson Street, was opened in September, 1855, and is intended to provide a good general education for boys and girls. It contains twelve spacious and well-aired class-rooms, with teachers' rooms, &c., and a large hall in which all the pupils may be assembled; there is also an extensive play-ground attached, with covered sheds for exercise in wet weather. The curriculum for the senior classes embraces a wide and varied course of study. extending over five years, and the arrangements are such as to allow a selection of classes to be made, suitable for those intending afterwards to pursue their studies at any of the Universities, as well as for those wishing to qualify themselves for the public service or for mercantile pursuits.

Lady Superintendent—Miss Molland. Planoforte and Singing—George T. Poulter and Miss Wilson. Class Singing—W. P. Cross. Dancing and maintien—Mrs J. S. Wallace. Fencing and Gymnastics—Charles Long. Sewing and Fancy Work—Miss Milean Janitor—John Mikelvie.

There are two Bursaries in connection with the Academy, the holders of which are entitled to attend all the ordinary classes gratis:—1. The Macfie Bursary, founded by the late Wm. Macfie Esq., of Langhouse, which is competed for annually, and is open to boys from any school—5 boys. 2. The Fairrie Bursary, founded by the late Thomas Fairrie, Esq., Greenock. One boy is appointed each year by Mr Fairrie's Trustees—5 boys.

Regulations for the Macfie Bursary.—1. The Directors shall select annually, after competitive examination, one boy to be admitted to the Classical Department, and to be educated in all the accompanying branches. There shall be no appointment in place of Bursars who may be prevented from completing the curriculum. 2. The competition shall be open to boys not under eight nor above twelve vears of age, from the Academy or any other school approved of by the Directors; and due advertisement shall be made accordingly.

3. A boy may be selected to enter in any year of the classical cur-

riculum, accor ding to the judgment of the examinators; the parents or guardians of the Bursar undertaking that he shall complete the curriculum.

4. An examination of the Bursars shall be made annually; and the Bursaries shall be continued only on proof being given of regular attendance and satisfactory progress.

The Fairrie Bursary was founded by the late Thomas Fairrie, Esq. and he stipulated by his deed of settlement, that in return for the bequest made by him to the Academy, the directors should present a gratis education to one boy of promise in each year of the Latin curriculum, along with the free enjoyment of all the accompanying classes, who should be recommended by his Trustees, and failing them by the superintendent of the schools endowed by Mr Fairrie.

In addition to the ordinary class prizes, the following are competed for annually, at the close of the session:—1. The Stewart Gold Medal.—Open to Boys and Girls of the Third, Fourth and Fifth Years, attending the Academy during the Session in which the medal is given—£5. Competitors may select any six of the following ten subjects (one at least being a language)—Mathematics, Arithmetic, Latin, Greek, French German, English Literature and Analysis, English Grammar and Composition, History and Geography, Scripture Knowledge. 2. The Brown Society's prize.—Open to Boys in the Classical Department during the Session—£10.

3. The Campbell Prize.—A Case of Mathematical Instruments to the best scholar in the Mathematical Department—£5. Two Prizes for Scripture Knowledge.—Open to all Pupils of the fourth and fifth years.

Greenock Ragged School Association-School buildings, with superintendent's and matron's houses attatched, Wellington, Captain, and Holmscrott Streets-President, Sir Michael Robert Shaw Stewart, Bart.; Vice-Presidents, Patrick Fraser, Esq., Sheriff of Renfrewshire, James J. Grieve, Esq., M.P. for Greenock, and Jas. Morton, Esq., Provost; Chairman of Acting Committee, James Stewart; Deputy-Chairman, Andrew Munro; Treasurer, John C. Hunter; Secretary, Claud Marshall. It is the object of this Association to reclaim the neglected and destitute children of Greenock by affording them the benefit of a good common and Christain education, and by training them to habits of regular industry, so as to enable them to earn an honest livlichood and fit them for the duties of life. The plan upon which the schools are conducted is as follows, viz. :- The children receive an allowance of food for their daily support; are instructed in reading, writing, and arithmetic; trained in industry by employing them daily in such sorts as are suited to their years; and taught the truths of the Gospel, making the Holy Scriptures the ground-work of instruction; and on Sundays the children receive suitable religious instruction.

It shall be in the option of the hirer to engage any hackney carriage either by time or distance, provided this be done at the time of hiring.

FARES BY DISTANCE.

When a party, not exceeding four grown-up persons, with Inggage not exceeding 56 lb. weight, enters a carriage at a stand. or when driving along disengaged, they shall be driven to any point within the places after referred to at the following rates, viz:—

SHILLING FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Cartsburn on the east, Roxburgh street on the south, and Margaret street on the west.

ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Ratho Street on the east, and Wellington Street on the south, and Martha Brae on the west.

TWO SHILLING FARES.

From any of the public stands to any place within Ladyburn on the east, Drumfrochar Road on the south, and Berryburn on the west.

GENERAL RATES OR FARES.

Where the point to or from which the carriage is driven shall bebeyond the limits of the preceding special fares, the fare shall bearegulated by the following table. The charge in the table shall aclude going from the nearest stance to the kirer's residence and waiting ten minutes, but if detained more than ten minutes, to receive sixpence for each additional ten minutes:—

When parties return (which they shall have the option of doing), and the fare going is one shilling, the carriage shall wait ten minutes without any charge for waiting; when one shilling and sixpence, fifteen minutes; when two shillings and upwards, twenty minutes. If the carriage be detained longer, a charge shall be allowed for waiting, at the rate of sixpence for every twenty minutes or part thereof, commencing at the period when the free waiting expires.

When a carriage is called but not used, a charge of sixpence shall be allowed, if the place to which it is called be under half a

mile from the stance, and one shilling if beyond that.

FARES BY TIME, &C.

For shoping, making calls, and where the driver is not continuous, the charge shall be one shilling for the first half-hour, and

sixpence for every additional quarter of an hour.

Whether the fares are by distance or by time the hirer pays tolls. If there be more than four grown-up persons driven, a charge of sixpence extra shall be made for each additional grown person, and a charge of sixpence for every two children above six years of age. No additional charge for one child above six or children under six.

4d per 56 lbs. over the first 56 lbs. may be charged for all luggage which requires to be put outside. The driver shall assist in loading and unloading in all cases when required, but shall not be

bound to leave his carriage for the purpose.

From eleven at o'clock at night till twelve o'clock midnight, fare and a half, and from twelve o'clock till six morning, double fare to be exigible.

FARES MAY BE WITHHELD.

Any party shall be entitled to withhold payment of fare—1st, When the name and number are not painted outside, or when there is no plate inside. 2d. When the reference ticket is not given on demand. 3d, When the bye-laws and table of fares are not shown on demand; and 4th, When an overcharge is made.

Drivers not to be entitled to any gratuity.

Driver to give hirer a reference ticket, and produce bye-laws and table of fares when demanded.

TABLE OF RATES OR FARES TO BE EXACTED BY LICENSED BOATMEN AT THE PORT AND HARBOURS OF GREENOCK.

passenger, 6d.

5th. Boat hire from any of the above-mentioned stations to any Ship or Vessel lying in Gourock Bay:—If one passenger, 3s 6d; two passengers, 4s 6d; and every additional passenger, 6d. For these rates or fares the boatmen shall be obliged to wait 30 minutes, and bring back the passengers. If detained beyond 30 minutes, one shilling to be paid for each half-hour, or part of half-hour after the first.

The above rates or fares shall include luggage if under one hundred weight; but all luggage above that amount shall be charged

for every additional cwt., 4d.

Vessels in harbour shifting passing lines, up to 300 tons, 7s 6d;

ships, 10s; if boatmen employed by time, 12s 6d per day.

For the above rates the boatmen shall be obliged to furnish four cars and men when from the state of the weather this is required to enable them to make the passage; but when required to do so by the hirer himself, for expedition or otherwise, one-half fare to be paid in addition to the above rates. The harbour master to be sole judge in case of dispute between the boatmen and the hirer as to the state of the weather, and as to the necessity for four oars.






