DUNCAN M'INTYRE, Author of the following Poems, was born in Glenorchy, Argyleshire, in the year 1724. The only amusement of his youth was fowling and fishing. He was for some time in the army: Afterwards a Forester to the Right Honourable the Earl of Breadalbane, in Coire-Chéathaich and Beinn-Dourain; and thereafter to his Grace the Duke of Argyle, in Buachill-Eite. He was likewise, for a considerable time, in the City-guard of Edinburgh.—He began to compose Songs in the twenty-third year of his age.—Though he has received no education, nor been assisted by any person, yet the following Songs, &c. are wholly of his own composition.

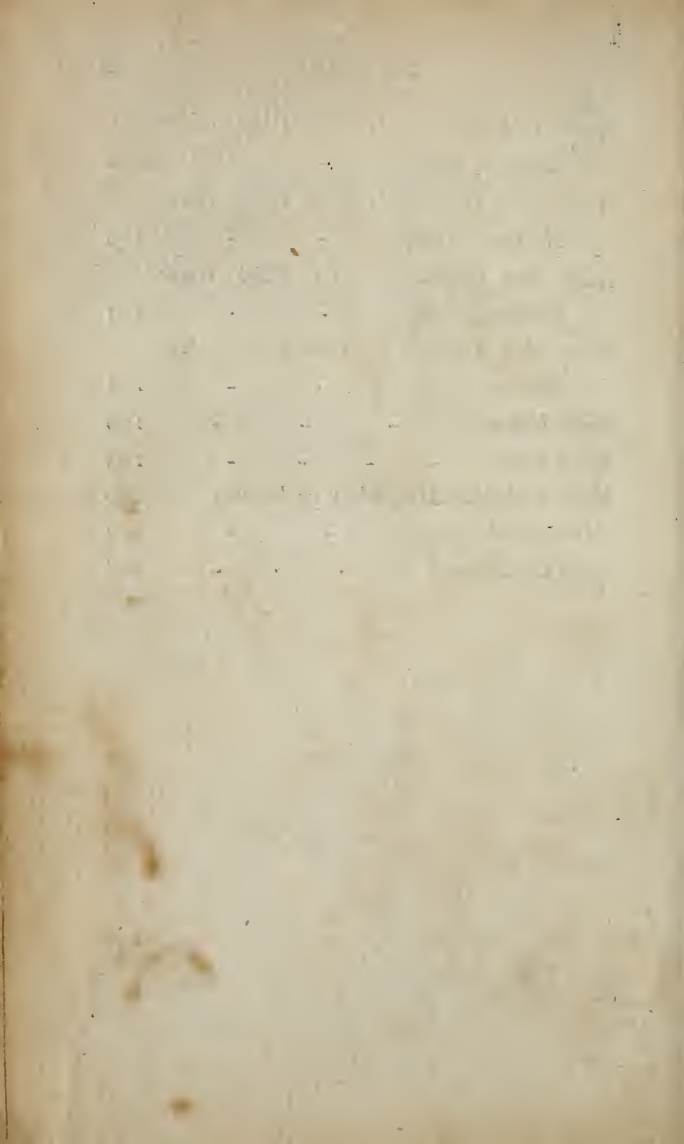
