





DUNCAN M^EINTYRE, Author of the following Poems, was born in Glenorchy, Argyleshire, in the year 1724. The only amusement of his youth was fowling and fishing. He was for some time in the army: Afterwards a Forester to the Right Honourable the Earl of Breadalbane, in Coire-Cheathaich and Beinn-Dourain; and thereafter to his Grace the Duke of Argyle, in Buachill-Eite. He was likewise, for a considerable time, in the City-guard of Edinburgh.—He began to compose Songs in the twenty-third year of his age.—Though he has received no education, nor been assisted by any person, yet the following Songs, &c. are wholly of his own composition.

and the next morning I went to see
the place where the first battle

the difficulties they were
facing. I felt a sense of
helplessness and despair.
I knew that I could not
change the outcome of
the war, but I hoped
that my presence might
provide some comfort
to those who had lost
everything. I stayed
in the town for several
days, trying to help
those who were in need.
I also tried to learn
more about the history
of the conflict and the
people involved. I
realized that the war
had been caused by
political and social
inequalities, and that
it was important to
address these issues
in order to prevent
such conflicts from
occurring again.






